JERSEY GIRL RETIRED, BOOKED TO A.P. INDY Jersey Girl (Belong to Me--Miss Bold Appeal, by Valid Appeal) was injured while training for an expected comeback race and has been retired from racing. The four-year-old filly, winner of the GI Acorn and GI Mother Goose in her undefeated sophomore season. will be bred to A.P. Indy. Jersey Girl had not started since winning the Aug. 1 Gl Test S. at Saratoga, during which she suffered a broken right front knee. She had been training at Hialeah, where she showed new problems after a recent work. "She had a setback in her training and we reached the point where we had to decide to delay her comeback or move on and go ahead and breed her," co-owner Bob Ackerley said. Ackerley added that the recent injury was "nothing serious," but he did not want to wait and miss out on this year's breeding season. "Hopefully, we'll get some good babies from her," Ackerley said. "We'll breed her to nothing but the best stallions." Runner-up to Banshee Breeze in the voting for the three-year-old filly championship, Jersey Girl finished her career with nine wins from 11 starts and earnings of \$571,127.

PUERTO MADERO X-RAYS NEGATIVE Trainer Richard Mandella reported that nuclear scans of GI Santa Anita H. fifth-place finisher Puerto Madero (Chi) (Gallantsky) came out negative. "Everything came out clean," said Mandella. "We didn't expect to find anything, but he didn't look quite right the day after the race and we needed to know." Mandella said a decision on the five-year-old's next start has not yet been made.

PENNSYLVANIA SENATE KILLS SLOTS BILL A bill that would have allowed voters to decide on a statewide referendum on whether to allow slot machines at racetracks was killed by the Pennsylvania Senate late Monday. The slots referendum was linked to the approval of riverboat gambling and video poker machines in bars, and many senators felt that the bill was far to expansive. Daily Racing Form reported that Sen. Robert Tomlinson will submit a new bill that will limit expanded gambling to a fixed number of machines at racetracks.

NO GUTS, NO GLORY

This wasn't just another Tuesday in February. This was Fat Tuesday in New Orleans--Mardi Gras, as it's known--and Julie Krone was out at the Fair Grounds celebrating, doing back flips on the racetrack.

She had just won the 3,500th race of her career, and as she told reporters after the race, "when you win 3,500, you can do that." Meaning the back flips.

Krone went on to win the feature that day, the Mardi Gras H., on a 10-1 shot, and wound up with five winners for the afternoon. Nine days later, she turned an otherwise ordinary Thursday into another fat day with five more winners.

"My life is very different now," Krone was saying the other night, after she had won three more races at the Fair Grounds, where she's spending the winter this vear.

Arriving on the scene late, spotting her rivals a couple of weeks, Julie has risen to third place in the jockey standings at a track where she was a stranger just two months ago. Only Robby Albarado and Eddie Martin Jr. have more victories, and they had the benefit of 100 more mounts, not to mention long-standing ties to the big local outfits.

"It took us a while to break through," says Joey DiAngelo, Krone's agent. "And there are still some old prejudices down here about girl riders. But we won two races last week for guys who swore they'd never ride a female rider."

That's an old battle for Julie, of course, a battle she fought from Tampa Downs to Maryland to Atlantic City to Monmouth Park, where she first became a name in 1987. It was a battle she won, too. In 1992 she was in New York...Belmont, Saratoga, Gulfstream, that was her circuit. In 1993, she won the Belmont Stakes with Colonial Affair and by then it was obvious that her star status was not just the product of shrewd marketing.

At the height of her career, Julie Krone was one of the best jockeys in the world, male or female. Not because she looked like a cute little girl, a pixie who popped up on David Letterman every now and then. Because she was fearless.



Then she got hurt. As strong as she is, Krone is still tiny by most standards. And when a 1,000 animal goes down and throws a 4' 10 1/2", 100-pound person often enough, serious injury is eventually inescapable.

She broke her ankle in a horrible spill on the final day of the Saratoga meeting, 1993. It took her nine months to come back from that. Then, just as she was hitting her stride again, she broke both hands in a spill at Gulfstream in January, 1995.

She couldn't have known it then, but the next four years would test her like she had never been tested before. Over the next four years she would have to show more guts than it ever took to stand up to the male riders who resented her success, more guts than it ever took to send a horse through a narrow opening on the rail in deep stretch.

In 1997 she left New York and returned to New Jersey's Monmouth Park, a step down no matter how artfully anyone would try to spin it. And even then, even stepping down a notch, Krone wasn't reminding anyone of her old self. Often reluctant to go to the lead, even on a speed-favoring track, she would get caught wide when the rail was the place to be and finish off the board with horses who figured to contend. She got enough good mounts to finish second in the standings last summer, but still she was struggling.

More than anyone knew.

They call it post-traumatic stress disorder, and Julie Krone knows more about this particular form of distress today than she ever thought she'd know. Those horrible spills were not going away, not in her head, and this was doing nothing for her career.

She can see that now. She couldn't then.

"People would say, 'Oh, just don't think about it,'" she recalls now. "But it's not like that. It's bigger than that. You can't control it, you can't control traumatic flashbacks...and it interfered with my ability to stay in the moment."

In her line of work, the ability to stay in the moment, as she puts it, could mean the difference between life and death.

Julie chose life. She got help. She realized she needed it this time. This wasn't like those other battles she had to win, the little girl in the macho world, from Tampa Downs to Maryland to Atlantic City to Monmouth Park. It was bigger than that.

Now, at age 35, when Julie Krone says her life is very different, she's not just tossing out a platitude, a sound byte. She's telling it to you straight.

"I'm working eight or nine horses in the morning; riding six or seven in the afternoon," she says. "I won 18 races one week, 20 another, and I've won five races in a day twice. That stuff doesn't happen when you're not focused. That kind of flow doesn't come unless you're paying attention."

It would appear she has regained that flow down in New Orleans. It's just that it took a long time--four hard years--and a lot of guts, real guts. Then again, she always did have the guts.
