2000 BREEDERS' CUP SITE TO CHANGE The 2000 Breeders' Cup will not be held at Santa Anita Park, in Arcadia, Calif., as expected, after an announcement by Frank Stronach's Magna International vesterday that its facility will be undergoing renovation at that time. Breeders' Cup officials would not comment on an alternative site at the present time, although Churchill Downs, which hosted the event last year, is a possibility. The Louisville, Ky., track was ready to step in as a last-second substitute in 1996 when a possible strike by municipal workers in Toronto threatened the Breeders' Cup at Woodbine. Officials at New York's Belmont Park, considered the likely host in 2001, have gone on record as saying that they wouldn't be ready for next year's event. "2000 may not be the best year for us," New York Racing Association president Terry Meyocks told Daily Racing Form. "There are a couple of issues we need to work out, as far as the glass enclosure [of the grandstand], and the contracts with our concessionaires and tote company."

SADLER'S WELLS COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS BREEZE-UP SALE A total of 203 two-year-olds are in the catalogue for the 1999 Tattersalls Breeze-Up Sale, including the first juvenile offered at a European breeze-up sale by champion sire Sadler's Wells (Northern Dancer). The two-day auction is set for Apr. 14-15. The colt in question, offered by Tony O'Callaghan's Tally-Ho Stud, was led out unsold for Ir47,000gns (\$68,200) at last year's Goffs Orby Sale. Out of Natuschka (Ire) (Authi {GB}), he is a half-brother to Blues Traveller (Ire) (Bluebird), winner of the GII Bay Meadows H. and third in the 1993 Epsom Derby. Edmond Mahony, Tattersalls' chairman, said, "We firmly believe that quality is the way forward for the breeze-up concept in Europe, and we believe equally firmly that this year's catalogue is another major step forward." The catalogue features siblings to no less than 60 stakes horses. Kip Elser's South Carolina-based Kirkwood Stables, which offered five at this auction last year including the 95,000gns (\$160,940) sale-topper, has 13 catalogued by such sires as Cozzene and Woodman. Elser commented, "I think we learned a lot from last year's experience and we are returning with more, and I believe, better prospects. I don't think we're alone as it looks a serious catalogue."

Vicar (Wild Again) came back from a fifth-place finish in the GIII Holy Bull S. Jan. 16 to take the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 20. In that event, he made the lead through easy fractions and just had enough left to hold off Cat Thief (Storm Cat) at the wire. That one, third in last years GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, ran third in the GII Hutcheson S, two back before his runner-up effort in the Fountain of Youth. Those two will be the crowd's top two choices, but this year's renewal is wide open. Nick Zito's entry, Adonis (Kris S.) and Wondertross (Chief's Crown), are coming off impressive Gulfstream allowance victories, and Wondertross ran third, beaten less than a length in the GII Remsen at this distance in November. Grits'n Hard Toast (Bates Motel) won the Holy Bull S. two back and did well to finish fourth in the Fountain of Youth after a very wide trip. However, in a field devoid of true speed, the upset special could be Valid Trefaire (Valid Appeal), who could be gunned from his inside post and try to steal the race. He ran second in the GIII Spectacular Bid S. three back, fifth in a Gulfstream allowance two back and most recently won a Feb. 12 allowance heat by 7 3/4 lengths.

THREE RING TO SKIP FLORIDA DERBY Trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. has decided to bypass today's GI Florida Derby with his three-year-old filly Three Ring (Notebook) and instead take on fellow distaffers in Tuesday's GII Bonnie Miss S. "It was strictly the post position (number 10) and not the competition," Plesa said of the decision. "I don't mind running against the boys if I think the table is even. It's just that I don't want to give them any advantage. We're going back to our original plan which was to run her in the Bonnie Miss."

WOODBINE RELEASES STAKES SCHEDULE The Ontario Jockey Club vesterday released its 1999 stakes schedule for Woodbine. The line-up features 101 stakes, including (using the new Canadian grading system) six Grade I, nine Grade II and 17 Grade III races. Highlights of the stakes program are the GI Woodbine Mile, worth CAN\$1 million (\$653,723), up from CAN\$750,000 (\$490,292) last year, to be run on the turf Sept. 19; CAN\$1 million GI Canadian International for turf horses Oct. 17; GI E.P. Taylor S. for fillies and mares on the grass Oct. 17; GI Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. for two-year-old fillies Sept. 26; GI Grey Breeders' Cup S. for juveniles Oct. 11; and the GI Selene S. for three-year-old fillies May 24. Canada's Triple Crown will start with the Queen's Plate June 27, followed by the Prince of Wales S. at Fort Erie July 25 and the Breeders' S. back at Woodbine Aug. 15. Woodbine's season opens Friday, Apr. 2 and continues through Sunday. Dec. 5.

PREAKNESS TOPS PIMLICO STAKES

PROGRAM The second jewel in the Triple Crown, the \$1,000,000 GI Preakness S., headlines the 1999 spring stakes schedule at Maryland's Pimlico Race Course. The 1 3/16-mile event is set for May 15. A total of 39 stakes worth more than \$4.9 million have been slates for the meeting, which runs Mar. 29 through June 20. Also highlighting the season will be the \$500,000 GI Pimlico Special at 1 3/16 miles, set for May 8; \$200,000 GII Black-Eyed Susan for three-year-olds fillies at 1 1/8 miles May 14; and the \$200,000 GII Dixie H. at 1 1/8 miles on the turf May 15.

Exploit (Storm Cat), a winner of all five of his starts, passed the first test of his sophomore season with a neck victory in the GII San Vicente going seven furlongs Feb. 6. The bay colt is the winter-book favorite for the Kentucky Derby and trainer Bob Baffert said, "Exploit is small but mighty. He has a big heart...the heart of a champion." Exploit's main competition will come from 505 Farms' High Wire Act (End Sweep), who has been brilliant in his two starts, most recently taking a Santa Anita allowance Feb. 14. Prime Timber (Sultry Song) won his first two starts before finishing second in both the GI Hollywood Futurity and the GII San Rafael. He will get blinkers on today, which could cure his problem of hanging with horses in the stretch.
