SILVERBULLETDAY FIRES IN FAIR GROUND

OAKS Getting her first test over an off track, last year's Eclipse Award-winning two-year-old filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) handled both the surface and the field for yesterday's GIII Fair Grounds Oaks with no problems. Conserved while running on the outside down the backstretch, the champ finished full of run to win going away by three lengths. She paid \$2.60 as the odds-on choice. "The good ones figure out a way to win," owner Mike Pegram said. "They have to learn to run in the mud sometime," trainer Bob Baffert added. "You can't pick your track."

RECORD PURSES FOR MEADOWLANDS 1999

MEET Overnight purses for the 1999 Thoroughbred meet at the Meadowlands in New Jersey will start at \$220,000 a day, the highest in the track's history. The season runs Sept. 6-Nov. 20 this year. The highlights of the stakes schedule, which offers nine races worth \$1.7 million, are the \$500,000 GII Meadowlands Cup for three-year-olds and up going a mile and an eighth Oct. 15 and the \$400,000 GII Pegasus H. for three-year-olds at the same distance Oct. 29. The Pegasus, the last major race exclusively for sophomores, has been pushed back on the schedule. "We felt the shift in dates would provide those late-developing three-year-olds the final opportunity to meet in their own division," Meadowlands Racing Secretary Mike Dempsey said.

BARRETTS TRAINING PREVIEW MOVED TO SUNDAY Due to the prediction of rain for Monday, the final training preview for the Barretts March Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training has been moved to Sunday at 10 a.m. at Fairplex in Pomona, California. The one-day sale is set for Tuesday, Mar. 16 beginning at 2 p.m.

Vicar won the GI Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream in his last start Feb. 20 by a neck over Cat Thief, but the Florida Derby bettors expected the tables to be turned here, making Cat Thief the prohibitive favorite. Instead they were greeted with similar results, as Vicar, who had won the Fountain of Youth in wire-to-wire fashion, this time stalked the pace four wide until the stretch drive, where he motored to the front and narrowly held off the late charge by Wondertross for a hard-fought victory. Cat Thief, who held the lead down the backside and on the final turn, just missed. "Today he showed me what I wanted, a colt that can sit off the pace and whatever you want to do, he'll do," said winning trainer Carl Nafzger. "He proved himself today. Now, he has to prove that he's the best of all of them." This was the second straight Florida Derby win for Vicar's jockey Shane Sellers, who took last year's edition aboard Cape Town. Jerry Bailey, aboard runner-up Wondertross, said of his trip, "It was a slow pace (:23 4/5, :48 1/5, 1:12 3/5) and I was stuck behind the leaders...I thought it was a very good effort for a horse that is lightly raced." Both Vicar and Wondertross are scheduled to race next in the \$750,000 GI Toyota Blue Grass at Keeneland April 10. The handle for both the Florida Derby (\$4,802,627) and the 13-race Florida Derby card (\$22,346,943) were records for Gulfstream, surpassing marks set on Florida Derby Day, 1996.

The winner of his first two starts, Prime Timber just missed in his next two outings, running second by a half-length in the GI Hollywood Futurity and by a neck in the Feb. 28 GIII San Rafael S. last time out. The second choice behind Exploit this time around, he handed his stablemate his first-ever defeat, driving from just off the pace to grab the lead in the final sixteenth and draw clear. "It was a pretty comfortable race," winning jockey David Flores said. "I was patient until the last turn, then I asked him to pick it up a little bit and it took a while for him to do it. But once he changed leads, he really took off. The farther he went, the better he got." Exploit sat second as High Wire Act set the pace on a long lead, engaged that rival at the top of the lane, but couldn't withstand the winner's challenge while gamely holding the second spot. The top two are expected back for the Apr. 3 GI Santa Anita Derby.

Furlough was ignored at the betting windows after being winless in her last six starts since taking the GIII Honorable Miss H. at Saratoga Aug. 5. The bay mare returned from a three-month layoff to finish fourth in her 1999 debut, a seven-furlong Gulfstream allowance Feb. 21. Shipping north for her second start of the year, the 14-1 longshot rallied from last to first in the nine-horse field to defeat 4-5 favorite Catinca by a head. Buzz Tenney, winning assistant trainer, said of Furlough, "Her last race in Florida set her up real nice for this. She's run really well on this track and we knew that we'd get a pace to run at. As of now I don't know what she's going to be pointed to next." Trainer John Kimmel was disappointed with the runner-up performance of Catinca, who won three straight graded stakes before finishing second by a nose in the GII Barbara Fritchie H. Feb. 13. "I thought that she was good enough to beat these," Kimmel said. "The weight was also a factor. She'll get her next start in the (GIII) Bed o' Roses (Breeders' Cup H. at Aqueduct, Apr. 17)."
