FLORIDA DERBY WRAP-UP The top three finishers in the GI Florida Derby may hook up again in the Apr. 10 GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland after exiting Saturday's race in fine shape. The Florida Derby winner Vicar (Wild Again) was in great shape Sunday morning, jogging around the Gulfstream track. "He proved himself yesterday," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "Now he has to prove that he's the best of all of them." Wondertross (Chief's Crown), a fast-closing second on Saturday, is "moving forward," according to trainer Nick Zito. Cat Thief (Storm Cat), third in the Florida Derby, is all ready for the rematch, according to trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He was raising hell in the test barn and he was raising hell this morning," Lukas said. "I was surprised at how well he pulled up because I thought, at the time, it was a tough race with them all going head to head. It makes me wonder if we got all there was from him, which we probably didn't." Fourth-place finisher Certain (Out of Place) will likely start in the Apr. 10 Gll Arkansas Derby, although the Blue Grass remains a possibility. Grits'n Hard Toast (Bates Motel) came out of his ninthplace finish Saturday with a lung infection. "The first thing we are going to do is to treat him and get him back in tip-top shape," said trainer and part-owner T.V. Smith.

#### THOROUGHBRED CORP HORSES TO

HASSINGER Trainer Wally Dollase, who had worked as a private trainer for Prince Ahmed bin Salman's The Thoroughbred Corp., was relieved of those duties Saturday night, according to trainer Alex Hassinger, who said he will take over the majority of the horses. Dollase signed a three-year contract with The Thoroughbred Corp. in December, 1997. He trained the stable's Desert Hero (Sea Hero) to win the Feb. 28 GII San Rafael S. "Obviously, this is a great opportunity," said Hassinger, who handled juvenile champion Eliza while training for Allen Paulson. "I'd rather not comment on Wally. It's just one of those things."

The Bob Baffert juggernaut rolled on. A day after stablemate Silverbulletday won the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks, Excellent Meeting was seeking her third straight Grade I win after taking the Dec. 13 Hollywood Starlet and the Feb. 13 Las Virgenes. The bay filly, off a tad slowly, angled out three wide down the backstretch to take the lead. She inched away from the field down the stretch and determinedly held off fellow Baffert trainee Tout Charmant in the final strides. "I think Kent rode this filly the way he rode Real Quiet last week (in the New Orleans H.)--with a little too much confidence," said Baffert assistant Eoin Harty. "He didn't give any credit to Tout Charmant, and I knew Tout Charmant had improved a lot since her last race (a second in the Las Virgenes). I don't think you can move at the fiveeighths pole and think you're going to gallop away. Regardless of who's in it, a Grade I's a Grade I." Winning jockey Kent Desormeaux commented, "I put her in the position I put her in today because she was much the best and she got her picture taken." Jockey David Flores almost scored his second graded stakes win of the weekend on the less touted Baffert in the race. Saturday, he guided Prime Timber to victory against the previously unbeaten Exploit. On Tout Charmant yesterday, Flores said, "When I asked her today, she really responded and showed me another gear and I was like, 'Wow!' For a second there, I thought she was going to win it." There was a minus show pool of \$119,635.76 on the race, the largest of the 58-day old meet.

Kimberlite Pipe finished third, beaten just a half length by Ecton Park and Answer Lively, at 72-1 in the Feb. 21 Risen Star S., but was not given a big chance to repeat the effort as a longshot once again here. Proving the race was no fluke, however, the bay recovered after bobbling at the break, raced just off the early leaders, then found running room up the rail in deep stretch and proved toughest, taking the three-way photo for the victory. "He had a little trouble (in the Risen Star) and since then he has trained really forwardly," trainer Dallas Stewart said. "He moved up from that race. We thought he'd fire big here. He had a little trouble around the turn, but once he got clear he dug in and hung tough." The colt's next start has not been decided. Last year's champion two-year-old Answer Lively, the second choice, was never far from the lead while racing wide on both turns and finished well, but had to settle for second. Ecton Park saved ground from just off the pace, angled to the outside for the stretch drive, loomed boldly at the eighth pole, but couldn't get past the top two. The 9-10 choice General Challenge (General Meeting), unbeaten in his first three starts, lunged at the break and was last for a half, made a bid at the top of the stretch, but weakened in the drive and was fifth. "When you get left like that in a race like this, it leaves a lot to do," jockey Gary Stevens said. "He just got tired. He needs some experience." There was a foul claimed against the first two finishers lodged by the rider of fourth-place finisher Valhol (Diazo), a maiden making his second start at 107-1 who took the lead at the top of the lane and then was steadied while dropping back between horses in the final sixteenth, but the claim was not allowed.

**DERBY FUTURES POOL TWO CLOSES** In the final hours of Pool Two of Churchill Downs' Kentucky Derby Future Wager, the betting public made GI Florida Derby runner-up Wondertross (Chief's Crown) and GI Santa Anita Oaks winner Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) first and second choices for the May 1 Derby. The pool closed at 4:30 p.m. EST Sunday. Wondertross closed as the 8-1 favorite, with Excellent Meeting at 9-1. Exploit (Storm Cat), who suffered his first defeat in Saturday's GII San Felipe S. and was favored in Pool One, closed at 14-1 in Pool Two. Fans at racetracks and satellite wagering centers in Kentucky and 15 other states wagered \$178,811 during the four-day pool that opened on Thursday, March 11. Derby fans wagered \$88,283 during the final four-and-a-half hours of the pool on Sunday. Pool Two's mutuel handle was smaller than the \$267,748 wagered during the wager's first pool, which ran Feb. 18-21. Pool Three of the Kentucky Derby Future Wager is scheduled for April 8-11.

WINTER WEATHER CANCELS RACING Laurel and Turfway Parks were forced to cancel racing yesterday when a winter storm moved across the area. It was the first canceled race card at Turfway since Jan. 21. The winner of the G2 Falmouth S. at Newmarket last July, Lovers Knot ended her European campaign with third-place finishes in both the Aug. 29 G2 Celebration Mile and Oct. 17 G2 Challenge S., missing by only a head in that performance. She made her U.S. bow in the GIII Cardinal H. at Churchill in November and finished fifth, then switched from trainer Michael Stoute's stable to that of Chris Clement and was second by a neck in the GIII Joe Namath H. over this course Jan. 20 and most recently fifth in the GIII Suwanee River H. on Feb. 14. The crowd's choice to pick up her first American victory this time, the bay was taken up at the start and rated off slow early fractions for a half, then gunned up to take the lead on the final bend and outgamed pacesetter Pleasant Music to the finish to take the photo. "There was no pace," jockey Jerry Bailey said. "I got her out down the backside...I didn't know if she could win moving that early, but I knew that she couldn't win sitting behind that slow pace. I took a chance and it worked." This was the final start for Lovers Knot, who will now return to her owner's Cheveley Park Farm in England to be bred.



#### Golden Slipper Update:

Bidding for a history-making fifth Golden Slipper win, jockey Shane Dye yesterday confirmed he'll partner outstanding colt Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill), currently 5-2 favourite for the AUS\$2.5 million (\$1,556,760) race Mar. 27. Dye flew to Melbourne Friday to partner the Blue Diamond S. winner in a track work. Dye and former jockey turned trainer Ron Quinton have four Slipper wins apiece.

Quinton was devastated after his Slipper hope Easy Rocking (Aus) (Barathea {Ire}) beat only one home in the G2 Todman Slipper Trial Saturday and the colt will undergo further veterinary tests this week. Align (Aus) (Night Shift) won the Trial easily and is now first in the order of entry for the Slipper.

Clarry Conners unleashed Let's Rock Again (Aus) (Chief's Crown) to win the Reisling Slipper Trial, but connections must decide whether to pay a AUS\$100,000 (\$62,270) late entry fee for this filly after allowing her nomination to lapse at second acceptance stage. She won gamely, but the slow time of 1:11.17 goes against her.

Heading the current betting for the Slipper are: Redoute's Choice, 5-2; Shogun Lodge (Aus) (Grand Lodge), 5-1; Align, 7-1; Catbird (Aus) (Danehill), 9-1; and Fappiano's Son (Aus) (Dolphin Street (Fr)), 10-1.

#### One To Watch at Inglis Australian Easter Sale:

A bay colt by Nureyev from Miss Bold Appeal (Valid Appeal) will go under the hammer as Lot 104 on the first day of the Inglis Australian Easter Sale in Sydney April 6 and it is widely predicted the colt will fetch more than AUS\$1 million (\$622,704). The colt is offered by Victorian stud Roselands, whose general manager Lynden Burns purchased Miss Bold Appeal, the dam of triple Grade I winner Jersey Girl (Belong To Me), for AUS\$300,000 (\$186,810) in April, 1997 at the Inglis Broodmare auction as one of three mares offered by John T.L. Jones. The mare was sold back to Richard Santulli for AUS\$2.6 million (\$1,619,030), Burns said. "I really believe the Nureyev colt is important to the future of breeding in Australia, from an international level," Burns said. "If this colt can attract the overseas buyers to our sale then it is a great step ahead. When you take into account a Nureyev yearling sold in 1998 for \$5.4 million (U.S.), which was a European record, then AUS\$1 million is hardly out of the question for a colt which has a ready-made stallion pedigree anywhere in the world."
