**BARRETS TWO-YEAR-OLDS SELL TODAY** A total of 206 two-year-olds in training have been catalogued for one of the most important sales of two-year-olds in training, the 10th annual Barretts March Sale, which takes place beginning at 2 p.m. this afternoon at Fairplex Park in Pomona, California. The sale has, in just the last few years, produced such outstanding horses as MGISW Sharp Cat, who sold for \$900,000 at the 1996 sale; 1998 GI Canadian International hero Royal Anthem, who brought \$500,000 two years ago; and one of last year's juvenile stars Yes It's True, who sold for \$800,000 and went on to win a pair of graded stakes at two as well as Saturday's Gil Swale S. A colt by Clever Trick, named Sanibel Sunset and yet to race, brought \$1,000,000 to top the '98 edition, a result which Barretts President and General Manager Gerry McMahon is hopeful of matching or surpassing. "From what I have seen so far, I am pretty optimistic about the interest level among potential buyers. Our first test was the (Mar. 8) preview, and that went very well. The initial feedback has been very positive," said McMahon. One of the offerings that could achieve sales-topper status is hip number 187, a California-bred filly by In Excess (Ire) who zipped her eighth of a mile Mar. 8 in :10.05. The bay has some pedigree power, as first dam Purely Political (Wavering Monarch) is a half sister to Soviet Sojourn (Leo Castelli), the dam of the 1998 GI Santa Anita Derby winner Indian Charlie (In Excess {Ire}). Another interesting prospect is hip number 51, a Gilded Time half-sister to top sprinter Soviet Problem (Moscow Ballet) who got her Mar. 8 preview furlong in :10.88. Superstar sires Danzig (hip number 24) and Storm Cat (hip number 38) each have one juvenile catalogued, a colt out of multiple European champion Kooyonga (Ire) (Persian Bold {Ire}) and a half-sister to 1995 Gil Remsen S. winner Tropicool (Carr de Naskra), respectively. Also represented are such top stallions as Alleged, Deputy Minister, End Sweep, Gone West, Gulch, Seattle Slew and Woodman. The sales ring will be graced with two-year-olds by over a dozen first-crop sires, including champion and 1995 Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch (Gulch), who has four in the sale; 1994 GI Preakness and Belmont S. winner Tabasco Cat (Storm Cat) with seven catalogued; 1994 Derby hero Go for Gin (Cormorant) with two; and the 1995 Gil Jerome H. winner French Deputy (Deputy Minister) with three.

**Three Ring** (Notebook) skipped the GI Florida Derby after drawing an outside post to wait for this spot. On the board in all seven career starts, the Florida-bred was third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies to end her two-year-old season, then missed by a head when second in the GIII Forward Gal S. to begin 1999. In her latest, she had things all her own way on the front end and galloped to a 14 3/4-length victory in the Feb. 21 GII Davona Dale S. The speedy **Olympic Charmer** (Olympio) will have something to say about the pace this time. The bay filly ships in from California, where she led every step in her maiden score Dec. 28 and again against allowance company in her last outing going seven furlongs Feb. 4. She won those two by a combined 12 lengths, but tries two turns for the first time in her stakes debut. "She's been training like she wants more distance," trainer Ron McAnally said. "She has the breeding to go farther." **Marley Vale** (Forty Niner), three-for-five lifetime, also makes her two-turn bow, but finished a solid third in the one-mile GI Matron S. last year. She comes off a win in the Jeano S. going six furlongs over this track Feb. 24.

**END SWEEP TO JAPAN** Last year's record-setting freshman sire **End Sweep** (Forty Niner), currently standing at Mockingbird Farm in Florida, will shuttle from Australia to Shadai Stallion Station in Japan for the 2000 Northern Hemisphere breeding season. The eight-year-old is owned by Australia's Arrowfield Stud. "End Sweep is the first stallion to be owned by an Australian farm to shuttle to Japan," Arrowfield Chairman John Messara said. "This is further evidence of the continuing globalization of the Australian breeding industry."

**COMEONMOM OUT OF FIRST GODOLPHIN**

**TRIAL** The Godolphin candidates for the Kentucky Derby will have their first trial race of the spring on either Mar. 21 or 22, but GII Remsen winner **Comeonmom** (Jolie's Halo) will not participate. "The only horse we will not put in there is **Comeonmom**, who we will hold out until the second trial," explained Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "He's not as forwardly conditioned as the others are. "The seven remaining Godolphin Triple Crown nominees will be joined in the race by three-to-five additional Godolphin three-year-olds. The distance will be nine furlongs and the race will be held at Nad al Sheba Race Course, site of the Dubai World Cup. American jockeys Gary Stevens, John Velazquez and Jerry Bailey, all of whom were scheduled to come to Dubai for the World Cup, will participate. Crisford said Frankie Dettori will also have a trial mount, with most of the others ridden by local reinsmen. The riding assignments and the exact date of the race will be determined shortly. None of the other horses participating will be pointed for the Kentucky Derby unless, Crisford said, "one jumps up and does something exceptional." The seven Triple Crown nominees set for the trial are **Worldy Manner** (Riverman), **Festive Bid** (Festive), **Prado's Landing** (El Prado {Ire}), **Charmes** (Personal Hope), **Breathtaking View** (Country Pine), **Always Believe** (Carr de Naskra) and **Aljabr** (Storm Cat). Aljabr, undefeated in three starts last year in Europe, may be Godolphin's best shot for the Kentucky Derby. "He's working very nicely, there's no question about that," Crisford said. "Providing he can show us that he can handle the dirt as well as he handles the turf, the Kentucky Derby is our preference."

**DESERT HERO TO MANDELLA** The Thoroughbred Corp.'s **Desert Hero** (Sea Hero), winner of the Feb. 28 GII San Rafael S. for trainer Wally Dollase, will now be conditioned by Richard Mandella. The switch was made after The Thoroughbred Corp. parted company with Dollase over the weekend. The stable's General Manager Richard Mulhall told the *Thoroughbred Times* that the decision to take the horses away from Dollase was made because of a "difference in philosophy of racing." Most of the horses will go to Alex Hassinger, but Mandella and Neil Drysdale will also get a share.

When the Webers of Live Oak Plantation decided to keep Sultry Song in training as a five-year-old in 1993, their admirable decision looked likely to reap some rich rewards. Sultry Song's record had been one of fairly constant improvement up to that point. Unraced at two, he progressed through a busy three-year-old campaign to win three stakes races, finish a very good second in the NYRA Mile and earn a weight of 113 on the *Blood-Horse* Free Handicap.

Even better followed at four, when Sultry Song stacked up Grade I victories over Marquetry in the Hollywood Gold Cup, over Out of Place in the Whitney H. and over Pleasant Tap in the Woodward. These efforts made him an outside contender for the Eclipse Award for older male and were good enough to earn him the title of Florida's Horse of the Year.

There were good grounds for thinking that the 16.2-hand Sultry Song might improve still further at five. With his sire Cox's Ridge standing at 16.3 hands and his grandsire Best Turn even taller at 17.2 hands, Sultry Song had every right to be something of a late developer. Unfortunately, he never raced at five and was retired by mid-summer, the explanation being that he had failed to recapture his form during a disappointing spring.

Live Oak agreed to stand him at Claiborne, home also to his sire Cox's Ridge and to his grandsires Best Turn and Buckfinder before them, but the situation the Webers found themselves in represented something of a double whammy.

Not only did Sultry Song miss out on the racetrack in 1993, but he also missed the stud season. Memories tend to be very short in the bloodstock industry and the emergence of a new generation of stars in 1993 had no doubt taken some of the gloss off Sultry Song's best efforts by the time he commenced stallion duties in 1994. He started with a book of 50 mares at a fee of \$7,500 and quickly established his potential with a first crop that included that very good filly Kirby's Song, winner of the GII Monmouth Oaks and the Canadian Oaks.

Now Sultry Song is busily building on that pleasing start with a second crop headed by the very promising Prime Timber.

Prime Timber has matured more quickly than his sire--quickly enough to gain two juvenile victories and finish a close second to Tactical Cat in the GI Hollywood Futurity. Now he has become a contender for the Santa Anita Derby thanks to his victory over Ex-ploit in the GII San Felipe S.

According to jockey David Flores, the colt improved the further he went at Santa Anita and he should be suited to 1 1/4 miles. His broodmare sire, Nodouble, did very well over that distance, taking the Santa Anita H., Brooklyn H. and Hawthorne Gold Cup on his way to becoming the champion handicap horse of 1969.

Nodouble also became a champion stallion, building a reputation as a sire of tough, talented performers of the calibre of Overskate, Mairzy Doates, Magnificent Lindy, Shocker T, No Review, Double Discount, Skillful Joy and Coolawin.

Prime Timber's dam, Wine Taster, wasn't in the same league as these top winners, but she was typically tough, racing from the ages of two to seven, and she twice won the Tulare S. over 1 1/16 miles at Fresno on her way to building up earnings in excess of \$200,000. Prime Timber was sold for only \$14,000 as a weanling, but his potential had become apparent by the time he was offered at Ocala as a two-year-old, when he realized \$375,000, and he looks a bargain even at the higher price.
