**EXPLOIT RETIRED** Exploit (Storm Cat--My Turbulent Miss {My Dad George}), early favorite for the Kentucky Derby, has been retired from racing after suffering a knee injury during Saturday's GII San Felipe S. X-rays Tuesday revealed a small chip in the three-year-old colt's left knee. "We could have had surgery performed to remove the chip," trainer Bob Baffert told *The Blood-Horse*, "but we decided the horse was worth too much as a stallion prospect." The injury will be allowed to heal without surgery and a decision on where to stand the colt will be made later. Exploit's runner-up finish in the San Felipe was the only loss of his six-race career. At two, he captured the GIII Iroquois and the GII Brown and Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S. He began his three-year-old campaign with a victory in the Feb. 6 GII San Vicente S. He retires with earnings of \$396,254.

**GULFSTREAM MEET ENDS WITH RECORD HANDLE** Gulfstream Park concluded its 1999 racing season Monday with track-record total handle. During the 63-day meet, wagering from all sources reached \$700,451,424. The average of \$11,118,277 marked an increase of six percent from last year's figure of \$10,491,943. On-track handle totaled \$132,502,174. The average of \$2,103,209 decreased by .8 percent from the 1998 figure of \$2,119,318. Attendance for the 1999 meet was 679,902 compared with 664,919, the highest in six years. The average attendance was 10,792, up 2.3 percent from last year's 10,554. Summing up the 1999 meeting, Douglas Donn, Gulfstream president and chief executive officers, said, "I appreciate the enthusiastic public support of Gulfstream's initiatives that resulted in producing a highly successful season. Gulfstream will continue to seek additional initiatives to further enhance its presentation of world-class racing, varied entertainment and quality customer service." The Florida track will be the site of the Breeders' Cup Meet from Nov. 5-7 and will open for its 61st season of racing on Jan. 3, 2000.

**TURFWAY SALE APPROVED** In a unanimous vote on Tuesday, the Kentucky Racing commission approved the sale of Turfway Park to a three-way partnership led by the Keeneland Association. Terms of the sale, which was announced in January, state that Keeneland will be the managing partner and one-third owner of the Florence, Kentucky track. The other partners are Dusty Corporation, a subsidiary of gaming giant Harrah's, and Dreamport Inc., a division of the lottery technology company GTECH.

**BAFFERT SAYS NO TO THE THOROUGHBRED CORP.** Bob Baffert has decided against training any horses for The Thoroughbred Corp., *Daily Racing Form* reported yesterday. "I don't want to be involved in that operation. I don't feel right about what they did," said Baffert to *DRF*. He was referring to the dismissal of Wally Dollase as The Thoroughbred Corp.'s private trainer. Trainers who did receive horses formerly trained by Dollase include Richard Mandella, Neil Drysdale and Alex Hassinger.

**BROCCO SOLD TO ARROWFIELD; WILL STAND FULL TIME IN AUSTRALIA** Brocco (Kris S.), sire of a \$1.2 million two-year-old at Fasig-Tipton Calder and a \$2 million Barretts two-year-old, has been sold to Arrowfield Stud in New South Wales, Australia. Brocco had shuttled to Australia during his first few seasons at stud and is represented by Australian Group 3 winner Charm Scene Lad (Aust). Arrowfield Chairman John Messara told the *Thoroughbred Times*: "The horse was just spinning his wheels in the states last season, so we took the view that since he started off really well here in Australia--he had a group winner, a group stakes-placed horse and a couple of other winners--that we should bring him back." Brocco will not cover any mares at Lane's End Farm this season and will arrive at Arrowfield in May.

**IN EXCESS FILLY TOPS BARRETT'S CAL-BRED SALE** A filly by In Excess (Ire)--Purely Political (Waverling Monarch) brought \$400,000 to top Tuesday night's Barretts Sale of Selected California-Bred Two-Year-Olds. Bought by Padua Stables, the bay filly, who is out of a half sister to the dam of GISW Indian Charlie (In Excess {Ire}), posted the fastest work of the sale, going one furlong in :10.05. She was consigned by Juvenile Prep Bloodstock LLC. The inaugural sale of Cal-breds saw 16 horses sold at an average of \$81,688. The median price was \$47,500. More news page 2

**DA HOSS BACK IN TRAINING** Although it's over nine months until this year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Gulfstream Park, Michael Dickinson has already begun training two-time Mile winner **Da Hoss** (Gone West) for the event. "He's begun jogging and now will start to canter," said the trainer from his Tapeta Farm in North East, Maryland. Dickinson was lauded for the masterful job he did with the seven-year-old last year, when the Prestonwood Farm-owned gelding won the Mile off only one prep race, a Colonial Downs allowance, in two years. "He's doing terrific. Circumstances later this year will dictate whether or not he will run before the Breeders' Cup. Everything will be geared to send him into the Mile the best way possible." Dickinson's other Breeders' Cup hopeful is **Cetewayo** (His Majesty), who finished sixth in the Turf last year. "He's already had a breeze and I hope to have him ready to run in the spring, although I haven't picked out any particular target as yet," said Dickinson.

**Bomb Threat and Tote Problems Plague Hialeah Opening:**

Patrons wanting to bet Hialeah's opening day card had trouble today after the the Autotote system which tracks all wagers locked up. A similar situation occurred last year on the first Saturday of the meet when the system went down for more than two hours resulting in the loss of five races on the card. The system was finally corrected at before the fourth race, which went off at 3:41. For bettors, the rest of the eleven-race card went without a hitch. Hialeah officials, however, were dealing with a bomb threat that was called in sometime during the racing day. Officials decided that the call was a prank and did not choose to evacuate. Racegoers received two free passes for their inconvenience.

Feeling the magic of Lasix for the first time, the 2-1 second choice was eager from the start, opening up a clear lead down the backstretch. From there, she never looked back and ran off to a 6 3/4-length score.

**French Classic Winner Vettori To Stand at Vinery Australia:**

**Vettori (Ire)** (Machiavellian--Air Distingue {Sir Ivor}) will move to Vinery Australia for the upcoming 1999 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. The seven-year-old captured the 1995 G1 Dubai Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas) in only his third lifetime start and was third in the G1 St. James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot later that year. He had stood at Australia's Baramul Stud since entering stud in 1996. Vinery's Managing Partner Ben P. Walden, Jr. said, "While visiting Australia last fall, I was extremely impressed with Vettori's foals. Sir Tristan and Damien Artico have laid the groundwork for Vettori's success and we hope to merely further it." First-crop yearlings have brought as much as NZ\$200,000 (\$372,995). Vettori's fee remains at Aus \$14,000 (\$8,750) for 1999. He will continue to shuttle to England's New England Stud.
