SILVER CHARM FACES SEVEN IN DUBAI DEFENSE Silver Charm (Silver Buck) will defend his G1 Dubai World Cup title from post three in Sunday's \$5 million race in the desert. In his quest to become the first horse to repeat in the World Cup, the fiveyear-old grey will face seven rivals, including fellow Americans Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance), who drew post four, and Malek (Chi) (Mocito Guapo {Arg}), who drew post seven. "(Silver Charm) is training better on this track this year than he did last year," trainer Bob Baffert told the Thoroughbred Times. "I expect a big race." Richard Mandella, the trainer of Malek, who was fourth last year, is making his fourth attempt to win the race. Mandella reported that Malek is "doing great" and told the Thoroughbred Times, "I can't walk in here and say I've got these other horses over a barrel--you have to have a pretty big barrel when you're up against Silver Charm. But there's no sense in coming here if you didn't think you had a chance to win." Victory Gallop's trainer Elliott Walden, who is sending out his first World Cup starter, commented, "He worked very well and seemed to like the surface. He shied a little bit at the finish line where the lights are the brightest, but that's why we did this on Wednesday--so he won't do it on Sunday." High-Rise (Ire) (High Estate (Ire)) appears to be the best European threat to America's hopes. Last year's Epsom Derby winner most recently ran seventh in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, but trainer Saeed bin Suroor reported that his charge has taken to the dirt very well. This year's race will be the first time since 1923 that the winners of the Kentucky Derby and Epsom Derby face off. World Cup Field on page 2

EMIRATES WORLD SERIES ANNOUNCED The Emirates World Series Racing Championship was launched in Dubai yesterday and will begin this year with the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, England July 24 and conclude with the 2000 running of the G1 Dubai World Cup. Emirates Airlines has agreed to put up \$15 million over three years for bonus, promotion and some transportation of horses. North American races included in the series are the GI Canadian International, run at Woodbine Oct. 17 and the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and GI Breeders' Cup Classic, run at Gulfstream Nov. 6. A truly global bonus series, the Championship includes nine of the world's richest stakes races and over \$20 million in total purses. The 12-6-4-3-2-1 point system for first through sixth place, derived from Formula One Grand Prix Auto Racing, will determine the winner of a \$1 million bonus at the conclusion of the series. The races making up the championship have been selected from the best weight-for-age contests by country and continent. Three additional races, the GI Arlington Million, the G1 Mercedes Benz Grosser Preis von Baden in Germany and the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp France, could be phased into the championship for 2000-2001, with others joining later. Nick Clarke, the executive director of EWSRC, said, "This represents the most important ever breakthrough in the development of international racing and \$15 million over three years is the largest sponsorship ever secured within the world of Thoroughbred racing." Had the championship been in existence for the last three years, it would have been won by Singspiel (Ire), Pilsudski (Ire) and Swain (Ire). Trainer Bob Baffert welcomed the initiative, saying, "This is all new to me but I saw a lot of turf in there. I saw a lot of green and I wanted to see a lot of brown. It's a start and it will sure make us think about what we are going to do with our plans. We need more challenges like this. It is a good step forward and it might force your hand to go somewhere and try something different. I have never run Silver Charm on turf before but I have never had a reason to try him on turf. Now I do."

British Purse Increase Announced:

British prize money for the second half of 1999 will be boosted by £1 million (\$1,613,423), the Horserace Betting Levy Board announced yesterday. This will bring the Levy Board's total contribution of 1999 prize money to £32.5 million--the highest figure it has ever put into prizes in a year. The decision to increase the Levy Board's prize money contribution was made at the annual strategy review meeting which re-examined betting turnover trends. This is the second time since July that the Levy Board's prize money contribution has been raised.

Stravinsky To Run Sunday:

Stravinsky (Nureyev), the ante-post favorite for the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1, is scheduled to run in the Loughbrown Race at The Curragh Sunday according to trainer Aidan O'Brien, who also revealed he may have a Kentucky Derby contender. "At the present time Stravinsky is a runner and Michael Kinane will ride," said O'Brien yesterday. "Options are fluid regarding Stravinsky's future. He is not yet a certain runner in the 2000 Guineas. We have other three-year-olds whom we would like to have a look at. One of them is Black Rock Desert (Danzig), who was entered in the Loughbrown Race and is a possible for the Kentucky Derby." Black Rock Desert won his only race last year when he took a six-furlong maiden at The Curragh by an easy five lengths in October.
