AHS OUTBREAK QUARANTINES SOUTH

AFRICAN INDUSTRY Only days after the finish of another successful South African National Yearling Sale, disaster struck the nation's bloodstock industry with the revelation of an outbreak of African Horse Sickness in the Western Cape. It has been confirmed that at least 12 horses have died of AHS this past week. In the wake of the outbreak, a ban on all horse exports has been imposed. Professor Alan Guthrie, head of the equine research unit at Onderstepoort, said, "So many people have worked so hard for so many years to allow the export of South African horses and the European Union Protocol states that all exports of horses would have to be stopped immediately if there was an outbreak of AHS. The Protocol could only be put in place again two years after the outbreak had been cleared." An immediate victim of the export ban is the mare Faralmond (Arg) (Farnesio {Arg}), who has been in quarantine for over a month in preparation for shipping to Hong Kong for next month's Queen Elizabeth II Cup. Her trip has now been canceled. Also nixed are any plans for South African superstar Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood) to take on international competition.

It is now 22 years since Seattle Slew joined the ranks of the all-time greats by winning the Triple Crown, but his presence is still being felt in the run-up to this year's top three-year-old events. Directly responsible for Honest Lady, Seattle Slew has also made an impact through several of his stallion sons. Three of his sons recently supplied the first three in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and now A.P. Indy has come up with an exciting prospect in Stephen Got Even, Nick Zito's highly regarded winner of the GII Gallery Furniture.com S.

Stephen Got Even's victory must have been well received by Will Farish and his long-time associate William S. Kilroy, a partnership which not only bred last Saturday's Grade II winner, but also A.P. Indy, one of the residents at Farish's Lane's End Farm. A.P. Indy, of course, was a sales-topping yearling, fetching \$2.9 million, but Stephen Got Even was more modestly priced at the Keeneland July Selected Sale, attracting a \$325,000 bid from Stephen C. Hilbert.

The colt, now the winner of three of his four starts, has every right to be very talented. His dam, Immerse, was also well above average, earning a weight of 111 on the Blood-Horse Free Handicap for three-year-old fillies in 1991. Racing in the colors of Shirley H. Taylor, she won four times and finished a creditable third behind the top-weighted Versailles Treaty in the GI Gazelle H. over nine furlongs.

Stephen Got Even promises to develop into one of the best winners produced so far by a daughter of Cox's Ridge, broodmare sire also of such as Wagon Limit and West By West. Although Cox's Ridge was fast enough as a mature horse to win the Metropolitan Mile and the seven-furlong Tom Fool S., he established as a three-year-old that he stayed further, gaining one of his wins in the Queens County H. over nine furlongs and finishing third in the Jockey Club Gold Cup in the days when it was run at 1 1/2 miles.

Stephen Got Even's second dam, Baroness Direct, was one of Blushing Groom's faster performers. A winner of the six-furlong Las Flores H. at five, the mare had finished a head second in the GIII Tempted S. over a mile at two, when she received 111 on the Experimental Free Handicap. So Stephen Got Even has two quality racemares as his first two dams.

His third dam, Avum, was another good stakes performer and an even better broodmare. Riverman's durable son Minneapple was one of Avum's three stakes winners, as was Lyphard's Princess, a speedy filly who produced Private Man (GII Ohio Derby).

Avum's other claim to fame is that she was a half-sister, by the very good juvenile Umbrella Fella, to the 10-furlong Grade II winner Jolly Johu and the admirable Lord Avie, a champion two-year-old who trained on to win the Florida Derby. Lord Avie, like Immerse, was sired by a grandson of Turn-to.

Clearly, Stephen Got Even has a solid female line with a lot of speed and appears to have inherited some of the stamina that brought A.P. Indy and Seattle Slew their Belmont S. victories. A.P. Stephen Got Even's dam brings in a further line to Turn-to through Cox's Ridge and another to Nasrullah through Blushing Groom for a concentration of Nearco and Mumtaz Begum in his background.


