CHURCHILL DOWNS LOOKING TO ACQUIRE HOLLYWOOD PARK Churchill Downs Inc. and Hollywood Park announced yesterday that negotiations have begun regarding Churchill's acquisition of the Inglewood, California racetrack and a portion of the surrounding land. Officials for both companies said that there are no assurances that the negotiations will lead to a definitive purchase agreement. Churchill Downs, Inc. bought Calder Racecourse in Miami, Florida for \$86 million in January.

KEENELAND OPENS TODAY Keeneland, which has undergone a multi-million dollar renovation over the past four months, opens for its 1999 Spring Meet this afternoon in Lexington. "We have had a very, very busy winter," said Keeneland's Projects Administrator John Howard. "With all the activities that take place here now, it is difficult to squeeze everything in between race meets and the sales and simulcasting. But we've done a lot of work since the meet in October." The second and third floors of the clubhouse have been completely redone, with improvements including new carpet and hardwood floors, the installation of more than 200 new television monitors, new bars and additional pari-mutuel areas. The clubhouse parking lot, the west end of the grandstand and the racing secretary's office have also undergone extensive renovations. The two Grade I events on the schedule are the Apr. 10 \$750,000 Toyota Blue Grass for three-yearolds and the Apr. 3 \$500,000-added Ashland S. for three-year-olds fillies. Today's co-features are the \$100,000 Transylvania S. for three-year-olds at a mile on turf and the Appalachian S. for three-year-old fillies going a mile on turf. Racegoers will also see the return of last year's GI Blue Grass S. runner-up Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff) in the seventh race. The 15-day Keeneland meet, which concludes Apr. 23, offers racing Wednesdays through Sundays, with post time at 1:10 p.m. daily.

TWO SURPRISE ENTRANTS BRING SANTA ANITA DERBY FIELD TO EIGHT Six of California's top three-year-olds were expected, but now eight will go after Bob and Beverly Lewis's Charismatic (Summer Squall) and Manzani, Sarno and Stathos' Walk That Walk (Skywalker) were entered in the GI Santa Anita Derby, which was drawn yesterday. Bob Baffert, who trained the top two finishers in last year's running, will send two in the \$750,000 event. Baffert's GII San Felipe S. winner Prime Timber (Sultry Song) drew the the second post, while his GII Santa Catalina S. winner General Challenge (General Meeting) will break from the seven hole. "It's possible that they could finish first and second," said Baffert, "but this is one of the toughest years I've ever seen for three-year-olds. It's hard to predict what is going to happen." It certainly would have been hard to predict what was going to happen to 5-2 morning-line favorite Desert Hero (Sea Hero) after he won the GII San Rafael S. in only his second start while under the care of The Thoroughbred Corp.'s private trainer Wally Dollase. After The Thoroughbred Corp. split with Dollase due to philisophical differences, the colt was quickly moved to Richard Mandella's barn to prepare for the spring Classics. "I've had a chance to get a couple of good works into him and he looks like a very good horse," said Mandella. "I wish he had more experience, but he's had the right kind of experience. He's won." Another controversial situation surrounding the race was solved when Chris McCarron agreed to ride High Wire Act (End Sweep) instead of General Challenge. Earlier this week, McCarron claimed before the stewards that Baffert had reneged on a verbal agreement when he named Gary Stevens on General Challenge. The stewards were not forced to make a decision when the two parties resolved the situation on their own, and Baffert offered McCarron future mounts including the call on GII Gallery Furniture.Com S. fourthplace finisher Straight Man (Saint Ballado). The Santa Anita Derby will be telecast live on FOX from 5:00 to 6:00 p.m. EST

## **WOODBINE'S 44TH SEASON STARTS TODAY**

The 44th Thoroughbred meeting at Ontario's Woodbine Race Course begins its 170-day run this afternoon. The track will offer live racing Fridays through Sundays with first post at 12:55 p.m. Wednesday racing, with post time set for 6:45 p.m., starts Apr. 14, and Thursday cards will be added beginning June 3 with a 12:55 p.m. post. The 101-race stakes schedule features (under the new Canadian grading system) 32 graded events, six of them Grade Is. The highlights are the June 12 Canadian Oaks, the first leg of the newly created Canadian Filly Triple Tiara; June 27 Queen's Plate, the first leg of Canada's Triple Crown; the final jewel in the crown, the Aug. 15 Breeders' S.; Sept. 19 Woodbine Mile; the final leg of the Tiara, the Oct. 2 Wonder Where S.; and the Oct. 17 Canadian International. Any three-yearold filly who sweeps the Triple Tiara will earn her owner a bonus of CAN\$350,000 (US\$229,253). The meet ends Dec. 5.

## Strike Cancels Card at Longchamp:

Yesterday's first meeting of the year at France's Longchamp racecourse was canceled after maintenance workers employed by France Galop staged a lightning one-day strike. Racegoers around the parade ring were awaiting the appearance of runners for the first race. but instead it was the workers who filled the ring 10 minutes before post time, calling for a strike. The grounds for the strike centered on the introduction of a new law, to be implemented next year, limiting the work week to 35 hours. Negotiations have been ongoing since January, but without agreement, and after another unsuccessful round of talks vesterday morning. the workers decided to take industrial action. Talks should begin again next Friday and racing is expected to resume this afternoon as scheduled. Whether or not yesterday's meeting will be staged at a later date has not been decided. There is the fear of further industrial action, this time by stable lads, who are presently in negotiations with the trainer's union, again with regard to the introduction of the 35-hour week. The stable lads have already threatened action for the opening day of Chantilly racetrack's season Apr. 26, unless both parties can come to a suitable agreement.

#### Purse for Tattersalls Stakes Gets Boost:

Europe's most valuable two-year-old race, the Tattersalls Houghton Sales S., will carry prize money of £400,000 (\$645,370) next year, an increase of £100,000 (\$161,342) from its current guaranteed value. The seven-furlong contest is only open to horses who were bought as yearlings at the Tattersalls Houghton Sales. Edmond Mahony, Tattersalls' chairman, said, "The Tattersalls Houghton Sales S. is well established as one of Europe's top two-year-old contests and the 33-percent rise in prize money is an indication of our commitment to the race, and the consistent quality of two-year-olds from the Houghton Sale."
