Honest Lady (Seattle Slew) won her first two starts very impressively before setting a fast pace then tiring to finish fifth, beaten only one length, in the GII San Rafael S. Feb. 28. "(Jockey) Kent (Desormeaux) got her running on the first turn to get position and she took off with him. It looked like she was going to make the lead easily, but she got hooked up with a 99-1 shot. She put away that horse, but got hooked by Buck Trout. Turning for home, it looked like everybody had her, but when you looked up at the wire she was still right there. She ran pretty game," said trainer Bobby Frankel. She looks to become the first filly to take this race since Winning Colors won in 1988. Desert Hero (Sea Hero) won his debut at Santa Anita Feb. 7, then encountered just about every problem a horse can see when he eked out a neck victory in the San Rafael. The Thoroughbred Corp.-owned colt is now trained by Richard Mandella. The addition of blinkers last time out solved the problems of Prime Timber (Sultry Song), as he turned in a career-best performance beating Exploit in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 13. A representative of Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum offered Aaron Jones \$6 million for Prime Timber on Thursday. "But I'm not about to sell him, not even for \$20 million," Jones said. "I finally told them to stop calling." Jones purchased the colt for \$375,000 at the 1998 OBS February twoyear-olds in training sale. General Challenge (General Meeting) was highly regarded after winning his first three starts, including the GII Santa Catalina S. Jan. 31. He found trouble at the start and never got into the Mar. 14 GIII Louisiana Derby, where he raced greenly and finished fifth as the 9-10 favorite. He gets blinkers for this start and, if his workouts with the new equipment have been any indication, is now more focused. He went five furlongs in :57 3/5 Mar. 23 and six furlongs in 1:10 Mar. 29.

Excellent Meeting's only loss in her last six starts, all graded events, was a second-place effort behind stablemate and champion two-year-old filly Silverbulletday in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. She was coming off a less-than-impressive neck victory in the Mar. 14 GI Santa Anita Oaks. Settled off the early pace, the filly took the lead at will and drew off without urging. "There was a big difference in this filly right from the start today," jockey Kent Desormeaux said after the win. "In her last race, I had to really get into her to get her to run. Today, she was into the bridle from the first jump. She really did everything on her own until inside the eighth pole when I asked her to put them away. Then she dug in and finished very strong."

The four-year-old didn't disgrace himself in his most recent start either, when he finished fourth, beaten four lengths in the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 6. With a win here, Behrens (Pleasant Colony) could add 10 NTRA Champions on FOX points to the 12 he earned with a second-place finish in the GI Donn H. two starts back. That would put him on top in the series' points race. He most recently scored in the GI Gulfstream Park H. Feb. 27. Precocity (Aferd) looks to become the first horse in 34 years to score a repeat victory in this event. He took the Whirlaway H. at Fair Grounds two starts back and beat Champion Three-Year-Old Real Quiet last time in the GIII New Orleans H. Mar. 7. GIC Queen's Plate S. winner Archers Bay (Silver Deputy) finished second behind Behrens in the Gulfstream Park H. In his third start off a layoff, he still has every right to improve here.

This is a prep for either the Kentucky Derby or the Kentucky Oaks for Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who comes into this event with a five-race win streak. After closing out 1998 with a 10-length romp in the GIII Golden Rod S. at Churchill, the bay filly scored in the Davona Dale S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 20 and was most recently a threelength winner of the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 13. She will be heavily favored here. By entering stablemate Tout Charmant (Slewvescent), trainer Bob Baffert may be trying to use a common denominator to compare Silverbulletday to his other top filly Excellent Meeting. The Cal-bred has twice finished second to Excellent Meeting, beaten four lengths in the GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 13 and beaten only a neck in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 14. Should her stablemate falter, she could register her first stakes score here. Marley Vale (Forty Niner) won the Jeano S. at Gulfstream two back and was most recently third in the GII Bonnnie Miss S. at Gulfstream Mar. 16.

The Cal-bred has won seven of his last eight starts and should be a heavy favorite here. Son Of A Pistol (Big Pistol) hasn't been out since August, when he didn't fire as the heavy chalk in the Pat O'Brien H. at Del Mar. The lightly raced seven-year-old has hit the board in 12-of-15 lifetime starts, and won three of five 1998, including last year's running of this event, where he set the track record. The gelding should sit behind the pace and set sail after the leaders at the top of the stretch.

The colt was having his second breeze of the week after going a half Tuesday. "The Blue Grass is going to be a tough race," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "You'd better be ready if you're going to go in and try to win the race." Vicar is scheduled to work once more before the Apr. 10 Toyota Blue Grass at Keeneland.

Blue Grass candidate Menifee (Harlan), runner-up in the Tampa Bay Derby last out, worked six furlongs in 1:12 at Keeneland yesterday. The Elliott Walden trainee got his last quarter in :23 3/5 and galloped out seveneighths in 1:26.

McCarron to Ride Prado's Landing in Blue Grass:


