SANTA ANITA DERBY FOLLOW-UP Aside from the usual bumps and scratches, all equine participants in Saturday's Santa Anita Derby came out of the race in good order. Of the human connections, Bob Baffert, trainer of the winner General Challenge (General Meeting) and the runner-up Prime Timber (Sultry Song), has once again come out of the West Coast's premier Derby Prep looking rosier than anyone. "They're two really good horses," said Baffert, who will be attempting to win his third Kentucky Derby in a row. "They're the kind of horses you want to go to the Derby with." Prime Timber's secondplace finish looks even better today when it was revealed that the colt lost his right hind shoe on the first turn. Third-place finisher Desert Hero (Sea Hero) came out of the race in good shape, according to trainer Richard Mandella, who added, "We have no plan right now. Anything's possible. We'll watch him for a week and see. The (Apr. 24, GIII) Derby Trial is a possibility." Fourth-place finisher Charismatic (Summer Squall) has already arrived in Kentucky and will go in either the GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland Apr. 18 or head straight to the Kentucky Derby. Juddmonte Farm's Honest Lady (Seattle Slew) emerged from her seventh-place finish in good order and may try the Senorita S. at a mile on turf at Hollywood Apr. 24. High Wire Act (End Sweep), who set the pace to the far turn before fading to last, had his saddle slip during the race. No plans for the colt were announced.

'EXCELLENT' TO OAKS, SILVERBULLETDAY'S DERBY HOPES STILL ALIVE Bob Baffert said Golden Eagle Farm's GII Fantasy S. winner Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) will run against her female counterparts in the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Apr. 30. However, he still hasn't ruled out running GI Ashland S. winner Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) versus the boys in the Kentucky Derby. "If we went with a filly in the Derby, it would be Silverbulletday," said Baffert. Should the filly run in the Derby, her owner Mike Pegram would have a chance at becoming the first back-to-back Derby-winning owner since Meadow Stable won with Riva Ridge in 1972 and Secretariat in 1973.

Laid off since finishing fourth behind Ladies Din in the GIII La Jolla H. at Del Mar Aug. 16, Commitisize put in a respectable effort against top older horses such as Lord Smith and Hawksley Hill in the Mar. 6 GII Arcadia H. where he finished fourth after setting the early pace. On paper, it was clear that Commitisize would make an easy lead in this event. The question that had to be answered was how long will the lead last? Breaking from the far outside, the chestnut sped to an early 1 1/2-length advantage, jogged around the first turn and down the backstretch, then dug in courageously to fend off his challengers at the top of the stretch and held over a fast-closing Majorien to score the win. "There wasn't a lot of speed in the race," said trainer Bob Baffert. "They let us walk the walk, and we got to talk the talk." Jockey David Flores added, "This horse is a pro and he knows what he's doing, especially when he's on the lead like he was today. When I picked up the reins in the last part of the race, he really picked it up and finished so well." Of the runner-up's performance, jockey Kent Desormeaux said, "I'm just frustrated in running out of ground, that's all. It was a paceless race and it cost me a victory today. When you're full of run under the wire, that's frustrating."

Winner of three of his six starts in 1998, including the G3 Perpetual St Simon S. at Newmarket at the end of October, Dark Moondancer was sold privately during the winter and joined the stable of Alain de Rover-Dupre at Chantilly. 
