DANEHILL COLT TOPS AUSSIE SALE The top-priced honors during yesterday's first session of the three-day Inglis Australian Easter Sale in Melbourne went to the Danehill--Princess Tracy (Ire) (Ahonoora (GB)) colt, with former top French trainer Patrick Biancone, now based in Hong Kong, securing the full-brother to stakes-winner Cullen (Aus) for A\$800,000 (\$503,720). Biancone outstaved several underbidders, including Hong Kong trainer David Haves and South African buyer Laurence Jaffee. "You do not have to be very smart to see he was the best colt in the sale, but it was not so easy to buy him," said Biancone. Newmarket-based bloodstock agents Andrew Mead and Marion Goodbody's first foray to Australia's major yearling sale proved extremely worthwhile, with the pair taking home a colt by Nureyev--Miss Bold Appeal (Valid Appeal) for A\$700,000 (\$440,755). Two undisclosed bidders offered A\$500,000 and A\$600,000 for the half brother to MGISW Jersey Girl (Belong to Me) before the colt was knocked down to Mead, acting on behalf of a group of London businessmen operating as Alydar International. "I just think he was a very reasonably priced horse," said Mead. "If he'd gone through the ring in the Northern Hemisphere, bidding would likely have started at \$1 million. What we've seen go around here today is a stallion, all he has to do is win a Group race. You can't overestimate the value of Nureyevs, and we are coming to the end of them now. There were two bids, and I thought I better get in here, I am not that familiar with the Australian style. It is very different, much friendlier." Roselands Stud principal Lynden Burns, who did not put a reserve on the colt, agreed it was possible the locals were frightened away by the colt's pedigree and the pre-sale hype. "I am not entirely convinced that Australian buyers understand the international bloodstock market," said Burns. Not even an hour-long power outage could halt the momentum of a record-breaking first session of the three-day sale, with Canberra trainer John Morrisey giving A\$650,000 (\$409,273) for a colt by Danehill--Peruzzi (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), who is a three-quarter sister to Australian Horse of the Year Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}). This year's first session average of A\$130,447 (\$82,136) was up 26 percent over last year's average of A\$103,132 (\$64,937), the highest since 1989, when the market subsequently crashed. The second session kicks off Wednesday night following racing at Randwick. The sale concludes Thursday afternoon.

HANDLE UP AT TURFWAY Turfway Park's recently concluded Winter/Spring Meet posted solid gains in handle. Total handle during the 56-day meet which ended Apr. 1, reached \$232,782,253. That's up six percent from the \$219,580,160 wagered during last year's 60-day meeting. The average daily handle totaled \$4,156,826, up 13.6 percent from a year ago. On-track handle averaged \$497,526--an increase of 4.6 percent from last year's \$475,453. On-track attendance decreased 1.4 percent to 2,121. "This was a solid meet, especially when you factor in the nine weather-related cancellation days," said Turfway President Mark Simendinger. "We will continue our efforts to improve our on-track business, but it is gratifying that the combination of large fields and one of the lowest takeout rates in the country is being well received by our national simulcast customers.

BAFFERT BRIGADE TOPS DERBY POOL THREE

Bob Baffert trains the top three choices in the third and final pool of Churchill Downs' inaugural Kentucky Derby Future Wager, which is set to open its fourday run on Thursday, Apr. 8. Churchill oddsmaker Mike Battaglia installed GI Santa Anita Derby General Challenge (General Meeting) as the 5-1 morning-line favorite in the field of 24 wagering interests. Prime Timber (Sultry Song) is the 8-1 second choice and the champion filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) is third choice at 10-1. Baffert also trains the co-fourth choice Excellent Meeting (General Meeting). With her at 12-1 are GI Florida Derby winner Vicar (Wild Again), Florida Derby runner-up Wondertross (Chief's Crown), GII Gallery Furniture.com S. winner Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy), and the mutuel field. Fans will have access to real-time odds via the Internet throughout the four-day wagering period at www.kentuckyderby.com. Wagering on Pool Three continues through Apr. 11 at 4:30 p.m. EDT.

MISSING DERBY TROPHY ON-LINE A 1961 Kentucky Derby trophy stolen from the house of jockey John Sellers in 1978 was recently offered for sale on the Internet Web site eBay, according to a report on *The Blood-Horse* on-line. The current owner of the trophy placed it on eBay, an auction site, with a reserve of \$4,500. When the auction ended seven days later, the highest of 41 bids had a final price of \$4,200. The owner has agreed to return the trophy to Sellers, who won it for his winning trip aboard Carry Back.

A stakes winner against state-bred competition last year, David defeated New York-breds by 8 1/2 lengths in a Mar. 19 allowance in his only 1999 start.

Golden Gate Derby winner Epic Honor (Honor Grades) breezed a half mile in :49 1/5. The colt could start next in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. or in the Apr. 18 GII Coolmore Lexington S.
