ALJABR TOPS SECOND DUBAI DERBY TRIAL Aljabr (Storm Cat) won the second private Kentucky Derby trial held by Godolphin vesterday in Dubai over nine furlongs at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse. Aljabr beat Mitchigan (Ire) (Mujadil) by a neck, with 15 lengths back to the third horse. Seven horses ran in the trial which took place at 6 p.m. local time. The winning time was 1:48.37. Mitchigan, unbeaten in two runs in Europe last year, has been working very well on sand and it was said to be no surprise to Godolphin that he ran so well yesterday. He is not entered in the Triple Crown races. Aljabr, ridden by Frankie Dettori, and Mitchigan were together for the last two furlongs before the former asserted his superiority. Simon Crisford, the Godolphin racing manager, said afterwards, "We were very pleased with Aljabr and the way he went about his business. He will have benefited a lot from this second trial as he needed more experience of racing on sand. We were very happy with the way he finished and the next stepping-stone will be the Kentucky Derby." Another Dubai-based Godolphin challenger for the Kentucky Derby, Worldly Manner (Riverman), won the first trial by a length over of Aljabr Sunday, Mar. 21. Godolphin also sends Prado's Landing (El Prado {Ire}) in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, after which Godolphin will finalize its Kentucky Derby plans. Up to a dozen horses will fly from Dubai to the U.S. Apr. 19, taking off from Dubai in a chartered plane at 2 a.m. local time and touching down in Lexington before midday local time. The plane will make a brief stop at Shannon in Ireland. The horses will spend 48 hours in quarantine at Keeneland and then be stabled at Churchill Downs.

BATTLE FOR 'UNBRIDLED' SUPREMACY AT OAKLAWN Two daughters of Unbridled, Banshee Breeze and Manistique will clash at Oaklawn Park today in the GI Apple Blossom S. looking to gain an early advantage in the race for older female divisional honors. Banshee Breeze won the Eclipse Award for top threeyear-old filly last year after registering victories in the GI Alabama S., the GI Spinster S. and finishing second in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. She comes into this off an easy score in the GII Rampart H. at Gulfstream Feb. 28. Manistique began last year with three 10-length romps. including a win in the GII Hollywood Oaks. She was the 1-2 favorite when these two first met in the Alabama, but suffered a displaced palate and could only finish third. She has reeled off four consecutive graded wins, all in California, since suffering her lone defeat. Surprisingly, the trainers of both fillies seem to be most concerned about the hot local entry Sister Act (Saint Ballado), who wired the field by two lengths in the Oaklawn Breeders' Cup H. three weeks ago. "The weights are completely unfair," Banshee Breeze's trainer Carl Nafzger told Daily Racing Form. "We're being asked to give eight pounds to a top filly over her racetrack and her distance. Believe me, if there was somewhere else to go with my filly, I'd go." Days earlier Manistique's conditioner John Shirreffs told DRF, "If Sister Act is as good as everyone says she is, I don't understand how she gets 114 pounds. That looks like a little home cooking to me." Pace appears to be the most important factor in today's race. The presence of California speedster Belle's Flag (Avenue of Flags), Sister Act and Manistique should produce lively early fractions which could set things up for Banshee Breeze's late run. However, Manistique has proven in her last two starts that she can relax off hot fractions as well, and she may get first run entering the stretch.

DERBY PREPS DOMINATE WEEKEND RACING

Trainer Bob Baffert showed his hand for the 125th running of the Kentucky Derby by running one-two in last weekend's GI Santa Anita Derby. On Saturday, the other guys get to show their stuff in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, the GII Wood Memorial at Aqueduct and the GII Arkansas Derby at Oaklawn. In the Blue Grass, GI Florida Derby runnerup Wondertross (Chief's Crown), from the stable of Nick Zito, was made the 5-2 morning-line favorite, but some prominent horsemen agree that it's a wide open race. "It certainly appears to be a very, very strong field," said Zito. Scotty Schulhofer, trainer of 9-2 shot Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), said, "Without question this is going to be the best of the prep races." Many observers will be watching Godolphin's 30-1 shot Prado's Landing (El Prado {Ire}), whose performance may offer a way to gauge the chances of Godolphin's top Derby hopefuls Aljabr and Worldly Manner. "We're looking for some answers from him, to see if he is of the caliber to go on to the Triple Crown races," said Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. In Arkansas, Champion Two-Year-Old Answer Lively (Lively One), most recently second in the GIII Louisiana Derby, was installed as the 2-1 morning line favorite. Closing rapidly to run third in Louisiana, however, was 9-2 shot Ecton Park (Forty Niner), who will be ridden for the first time by Gary Stevens. "This horse is doing very well," reported assistant trainer David Fortner. "In the Louisiana Derby we were very, very pleased with his effort. He reminds me a little bit of Victory Gallop because he's a stretch runner." The Wood doesn't have any established superstars in it's 11-horse field, but 5-2 choice Badge (Air Forbes Won) is looking to prove his eight-length romp in the GIII Gotham S. was no fluke. "If you saw the Gotham, you have to believe that Badge won't have any problem getting two turns," said trainer Joe Aquilino. The three Triple Crown Preps also make up the Big Three Pick Three, a \$1 wager available nationwide.

KRONE MAKES RETIREMENT OFFICIAL Julie Krone, the winningest female jockey of all-time, officially announced her retirement from racing yesterday in the press box at Aqueduct. Her last scheduled ride will be aboard Desert Demon in the Apr. 18 Lone Star Derby. She will ride beyond that date if Desert Demon goes on to any of the Triple Crown races or she picks up another Kentucky Derby mount. Although she cited a variety of reasons for her decision, it was the thought of another major injury that made her hang up her tack for good. Krone was hospitalized several times from race-related injuries throughout her career and most recently came back from a broken knee. "I'd rather go out on top both emotionally and physically," said Krone who finished third in the recently concluded Fair Grounds meet standings with 76 wins from 392 mounts. "I enjoy riding full-time," said Krone. "Working horses in the morning and riding in the afternoon. But it has become a little too much for my ankles and knees." At age 35, Krone is looking to move towards television and follow in the footsteps of fellow female rider Donna Barton, who retired last year and now works for ESPN covering horse racing. "I'm going to try and enjoy life and do things I never had the time for," said Krone. While she waits for television work and to complete her degree in psychology, Krone made it clear she has no intentions of ever coming back. "There is no chance of me riding again after the 18th," said Krone. Her biggest victory came when she won the 1993 Belmont S. aboard Colonial Affair, becoming the only female rider to win a Triple Crown race. She also noted winning five races in a day at Saratoga on Aug. 20, 1993 as one of her best accomplishments. But outside of racing, Krone was also happy to help make a change in the lives of young, female athletes who know of her story. "There have been hundreds of times when some girl would come up to me and say I'm the best player on my soccer team because of you," said Krone. Krone retires with 3,541 victories from 20,467 starts and earnings of over \$81 million.

SYDNEY EASTER SALE COMES OF AGE Fueled by a strong international buying bench, the three-day Inglis Easter Yearling Sale concluded on an astonishing note last night in Sydney, Australia with a AUS\$1.2 million (\$747,245) filly and AUS\$1 million (\$622,704) colt contributing to the highest average, AUS\$128,282 (\$79,882), ever recorded at the sale. Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis estimated foreign buyers accounted for about 40 percent of the sale gross. The third session average hit AUS\$141,006 (\$87,805) for 163 sold. Philippine-based Eduardo Cojuangco, who owns Gooree Stud in western New South Wales, came close to eclipsing the Australian record of AUS\$1.25 million (\$778,380) for a filly when his representative Tic Trinidad outstayed Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne to purchase a daughter of Thunder Gulch out of Dancing Show (Nijinsky II) for AUS\$1.2 million (\$747,245). The filly, consigned by Cambridge Stud, is a half-sister to dual Group 1 winner Hurricane Sky (Aus) (Star Watch {Aus}). The filly will go to Melbourne trainer Lee Freedman. "Mr Cojuangco had his heart set on her and I loved her, she has a brilliant pedigree and she has a lot of scope and upside," said Freedman. Former international jockey and self-described "rookie" trainer Gary Moore will prepare a AUS\$1 million (\$622,704) colt purchased by Patrick Biancone for Dr. Thomas Liang. The Danehill colt consigned by Coolmore Stud is out of All Grace (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), the dam of outstanding stayer Saintly (Aus). The yearling was bred by trainer Bart Cummings. Despite the sale's success, Reg Inglis criticized vendors who set reserves higher than the sale average, as 99 of 525 offered lots were passed in. "The number of horses passed in was ridiculous and I don't know why people bother bringing their horses to the sale," he said. "People come to buy and they bid substantial money, but it is one of the elements of a bouyant market--in 1989 a yearling was passed in at \$500,000. But we have surpassed all expectations and it is a great credit to breeders in Australia that there was such a strong international bench with Gooree, Hong Kong and Sabina Plattner active." Among stallions, Danehill eclipsed his rivals with an average of AUS\$318,404 (\$198,271) for 47 lots sold. Thunder Gulch averaged AUS\$169,767 (\$105,715) for 28 lots sold and Dehere averaged AUS\$113,281 (\$70,541) for 16 sold.

The court action between the New York Racing Association and veterinarian Michael Galvin took a turn for the worse yesterday after Galvin's attorney Karen A. Murphy also filed suit against the association and its Board of Trustees. Murphy claims her civil rights were violated and is seeking \$10 million plus compensatory damages. She charged in her suit that she was deprived of rights by the NYRA, that NYRA conspired to retaliate against her and punish her, violating her First and 14th Amendment rights. In one instance, she claims she was arrested and escorted off the NYRA grounds, despite having a legitimate credential. Galvin is suing NYRA for \$30 million for failure of due process after he was allegedily caught illegally "tubing" a horse on raceday. Murphy refused to comment on the suit.
