#### BANSHEE BREEZE "BLOSSOMS" AT

OAKLAWN Eclipse Award winner Banshee Breeze (Unbridled), looking as strong as she did during last year's championship campaign, sat well off the early pace, but swept past her rivals on the final bend and fought off a determined Sister Act (Saint Ballado) to win yesterday's GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn Park by 1 1/4 lengths. The 7-10 favorite in the six-horse field, the bay is now two-for-two on the season. "I didn't think we would be that far back early," admitted trainer Carl Nafzger. "I was worried, because this is a speed-favoring track. When my filly switched leads and took off, I felt better." Second choice Manistique (Unbridled), seven-for-eight coming into this race, but third to the champ in the GI Alabama last August in her lone loss, pressed the pace, but had nothing left in the drive and ended up fourth. "She displaced her palate again-just like she did the last time we ran against Banshee." jockey Gary Stevens said. "I told Jerry we were going to have to quit running against her. I think it happens when I have to grab a hold of her and try to keep her from going too fast like the fractions were today." (Apple Blossom chart, p2)

#### JOCKEY JACK LAUZON BACK IN THE SADDLE

Thirty-two months after he was paralyzed from the waist down in a spill in Macau, jockey Jack Lauzon returned to riding at Woodbine yesterday afternoon. Twice a winner of the Queen's Plate, Lauzon had notched nearly 1,300 winners before the accident. He moved his tack from Canada to Macau, near Hong Kong, in 1995, and was told he might never walk again after being injured at that track Aug. 7, 1996. But the 37-year-old was back in the starting gate yesterday, finishing eighth aboard 34-1 Be Prosperous in the fifth race of the afternoon. "In all honesty, I got a greater thrill out of this than I did winning the Queen's Plate,' Lauzon said. "It was a big accomplishment for me and my family. I have a lot of friends and family who have supported me. I did it with their support and the strength of the man upstairs. It's good to be back." News cont. p2

Never worse than third in his six career starts, Wondertross (Chief's Crown) missed by a nose in the GI Florida Derby after running through interference in deep stretch. "He's done everything right since he's been (at Keeneland)," trainer Nick Zito said. "He looks very, very good. I think he's getting better and moving forward." Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), a Grade I winner at two, disappointed when fifth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile to end the year, but was back in the winner's circle in his first start of the season, taking a Feb. 27 Gulfstream allowance test, and has worked sharply over the Keeneland surface. "He's lightly raced this year and that's exactly what I wanted," trainer Scotty Schulhofer said of the colt, who makes his second start of the year today. "We brought him here with the idea of getting him ready for the Derby and I think he's right on schedule." The bay blew out for the race Thursday, going three-eighths in :36. Vicar (Wild Again) goes for his third straight Grade I victory after taking the Feb. 20 Fountain of Youth and Mar. 13 Florida Derby. He broke his maiden over the Keeneland surface last October. "He is doing great," trainer Carl Nafzger said. "We just have to keep things going in the right direction." Menifee (Harlan) made his stakes debut in the Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 21 and suffered the first defeat of his career, finishing second. "I thought he ran a good race at Tampa," trainer Elliott Walden said. "It was our first time around two turns and we had some tough luck in the first turn. But it was a learning experience. I think he's ready for the Blue Grass." Prado's Landing (El Prado (Ire) will serve as a yardstick for the Godolphin three-year-olds. The colt was third in a trial race at Nad al Sheba Mar. 21. "He had some trouble early in that race and he lost some ground," said Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "But he was traveling very well the last part of the race. He made up a considerable amount of ground."

Just beaten a nose in the Breeders' Cup Distaff last fall in her only defeat now in her last six outings, Banshee Breeze made her '99 bow a winning one with an easy score in the Feb. 28 GII Rampart H. at Gulfstream. Sent away the crowd's choice to make it two in a row, the favorite was reserved well off the early leaders, drove past pacesetter Sister Act as they turned into the stretch and outgamed that one to the wire. "I did have to get into her a little, but once she got within a few lengths of the back of the pack, she started running on her own," said winning rider Jerry Bailey. "I had to work on her to get her past the leader and stay past her." There was no word from the winning connections on what would be next.

VALENZUELA CASE THROWN OUT OF COURT A charge of armed robbery against jockey Pat Valenzuela has been dismissed in Los Angeles County Superior Court, Valenzuela's attorney, Donald Calabria, said Friday. "There was no evidence," Calabria said. "Pat could not be identified in court as the one involved, besides a lot of other things that pointed to his innocence." Valenzuela, 36, was arrested in late February and charged in the \$150 armed robbery of a cabble near Santa Anita. He spent 22 days in custody before his family was able to post bail. "Pat's had trouble in the past," said Calabria, referring to Valenzuela's substance abuse problems and brushes with the law, "but this wasn't part of that pattern. It was an out-and-out case of mistaken identity." Valenzuela, who won the '89 Kentucky Derby on Sunday Silence, hasn't ridden since late in 1997. Calabria said that his client is undergoing rehabilitation for a knee injury before he makes another attempt to resume his career.

1996 FOAL CROP CLOSED The Jockey Club yesterday announced it has closed the 1996 North American foal crop at 35,332, up 1 percent from 1995. This marks the first increase since the foal crop peaked at 51,296 in 1986. The '96 crop, which could increase slightly because a few cases are still pending, is comprised of 32,212 foals in the U.S., 2,395 in Canada and 725 in Puerto Rico. Kentucky leads all states with 8,441 registered, followed by Florida (3,690), California (3,190) and Texas (2,271). The 1997 foal crop is currently estimated at 35,400, with 36,000 registered foals projected for 1998 and 36,500 for 1999.

PACIFIC CLASSIC HIGHLIGHTS DEL MAR SCHEDULE The \$1 million Pacific Classic, set for Aug. 29, headlines a stakes schedule which will feature 27 races, 19 of them graded, worth nearly \$6 million at Del Mar this season. The Pacific Classic, the finale of the "NTRA Champions on FOX" series, will be televised live. The track's two top turf races, the Aug. 1 GI Eddie Read H. and Sept. 4 Gl Ramona H., will both receive \$100,000 hikes, carrying \$400,000 in purses apiece. The Ramona has been moved from early in the season to closing weekend. The quintet of Grade I events is rounded out by the Aug. 22 Del Mar Oaks and Aug. 29 Vinery Del Mar Debutante. Also enjoying purse increases are the Aug. 7 GII San Diego H., up \$100,000 to \$250,000; and the July 31 GII San Clemente H., Aug. 7 GII Sorrento H., Aug. 18 GIII Best Pal S. and Aug. 21 GIII Rancho Bernardo H., each up \$50,000 to \$150,000. The Del Mar meet runs July 22-Sept. 8.

Badge (Air Forbes Won) comes off a runaway win in the Mar. 21 GIII Gotham S. Three-for-four on the season, the chestnut's lone loss was also his only two-turn try of the year, running third in a Jan. 28 allowance at Aqueduct going a mile and 70 yards. "When we ran him last time around two turns...he seemed to flatten out," trainer Joe Aquilino said. "We scoped him afterward and he had some mucous and a bit of blood, as you would see in a lung infection. We treated him with antibiotics and it made a little bit of difference." The colt came back to win the Feb. 27 Best Turn S. at six furlongs, but Aquilino revealed, "He still wasn't himself that day. We had sent cultures out to be examined and when they came back we decided to change antibiotics. That really turned him around. In the Gotham, he was 100 percent and you saw what he was able to do." Adonis (Kris S.) put together back-to-back maiden and allowance wins before scooting up the ladder for the GI Florida Derby, where he was sixth after coming seven-wide into the stretch. "All you have to do is look at the trip he had in the Florida Derby and you know he's a better horse than he showed," trainer Nick Zito said. Cliquot (Bertrando) makes only his fourth start, but came through with a head victory in his first stakes and route try, the Mar. 6 GIII El Camino Real Derby.
