MENIFEE MAKES DERBY CASE IN BLUE

GRASS The 75th running of the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. was hailed by handicappers and horsemen alike as the toughest of the Kentucky Derby preps, but nobody told that to the lightly raced Menifee (Harlan), who defeated four graded-stakes winners in a 1 1/4-length victory at Keeneland yesterday. The fifth choice in a field of eight, Menifee raced in behind the pace under the patient handling of Pat Day before unleashing a strong late kick with a furlong to go and driving past the leaders to win with room to spare. Day, who gave up the mount on Cat Thief (Storm Cat) and a chance to ride Juvenile Champion Answer Lively (Lively One) in the GII Arkansas Derby in order to ride the winner, said of his decision, "My agent and I talked about it. We thought this horse had a lot of room for improvement." After breaking his maiden at Monmouth Park July 16, Menifee established himself as a top twoyear-old contender when he beat a field of Saratoga allowance foes by three lengths in his second career start. Not only did he win impressively that day, but two of the horses he left in his wake, Cat Thief and Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), came back to win graded stakes. However, the bay colt came out of that race with a chip in his knee and didn't resurface until Feb. 27, when he cruised to a three-length score in a Gulfstream Park allowance. He most recently finished second, a length behind Pineaff (Pine Bluff), after a wide trip in the Mar. 21 Tampa Bay Derby. "Emotionally this is one of the most wonderful days of my life," said co-owner Arthur Hancock III. "My grandfather used to bring me here to watch the races. This is so special." Morning-line favorite Wondertross (Chief's Crown) could only muster a sixth-place finish. His trainer Nick Zito said, "We're disappointed, but if he scopes okay, we'll go to the Derby." It is feasible that the top seven finishers from the Blue Grass could go on to the Kentucky Derby in three weeks, as they were only separated by 6 1/4 lengths. Godolphin's Blue Grass hope Prado's Landing (El Prado {Ire}) was prominently placed for the first half mile, but faded to finish over 20 lengths back, casting a bit of doubt on the Dubai-to-Derby experiment. Jockey Chris McCarron said, "We broke well and he settled in real nice down along the rail on the backside, but when it was time to do the real running, he was basically finished. No ex cuses." MAIDEN WINS ARKANSAS DERBY Before they went into the gate for the GII Arkansas Derby yesterday, six of the seven competitors had at least one lifetime victory in their past performances. After Valhol (Diazo) dominated his opponents and scored by 41/2lengths, all seven of them could boast wins. The second-longest shot on the board, Valhol came into this event with only two lifetime starts to his credit. Second in his career debut, a Feb. 12 maiden race at the Fair Grounds, he was thrust into the GII Louisiana Derby, where, at odds of 107-1, he stole the lead at the top of the stretch only to be collared nearing the wire and finish fourth. Up against two of the horses who finished ahead of him that day (Answer Lively, 2nd; and Ecton Park (Forty Niner), 3rd), Valhol turned the tables on those two, attending the fast early pace and drawing away in the stretch to win by daylight. Trainer Dallas Keen said, "We bought him privately as an unstarted two-year-old. At first, we thought he was just a plodder. Then one morning at the Fair Grounds, he really took off in a work from the gate." Proving that unofficial trial races don't just work in Dubai, Keen added, "Then he won a training race (which don't appear in official PP's) by 15 lengths. I told the boss, this colt can run. Too bad we hadn't nominated him to the Triple Crown." The boss's response: "We did." Valhol's next stop will be the May 1 Kentucky Derby. "You'd better believe we'll be ready for them," said owner James Jackson. "That's the next step. We want to go and try them."

Sent off as the fifth choice off his second-place finish in the Mar. 21 Tampa Bay Derby, Menifee broke from the far outside in the field of eight and raced just off the leaders while four wide on the first turn. He continued to race in behind the honest splits to the far turn, but when the leaders accelerated into the stretch run, the chestnut colt failed to keep pace. After racing inside on the last part of the turn, he was brought to the outside by Pat Day in midstretch, set down for the drive and closed with good energy to fly past the leaders and win with room to spare. "They kicked away from me coming into the stretch and I was able to save a little ground," said jockey Pat Day. "But when I pulled him out and called on him, he responded nicely." Runner-up Cat Thief made a three-wide move on the far turn, but proved to be no match for the winner. Thirdplace finisher Vicar vied for the lead on the inside, gained a short lead in midstretch and couldn't hold off the top two.

Adonis, back-to-back winner of a maiden and allowance race at Gulfstream this winter, did not have the best of trips in his stakes debut, the Mar. 13 GI Florida Derby, and finished sixth at 12-1 after racing sevenwide around the far turn. Adding blinkers and facing a softer field this time, the bay was just off the leaders through realistic early splits, rallied wide around the turn to take command as they headed into the stretch and pulled away under jockey Jorge Chavez. Trainer Nick Zito, in Kentucky to saddle Wondertross to a sixthplace finish in the Toyota Blue Grass, said of the colt, "Jorge Chavez suggested that we put the blinkers on him because he wasn't paying attention or concentrating. He was absolutely right." Added Chavez, "I felt that this horse kept shying away from other horses. He had that bad trip in the Florida Derby and it was because he kept getting himself in trouble. I knew he was a good horse, but he had to learn to relax and concentrate. I've got a good one for Kentucky." Owner Ernie Paragallo, who saw his Unbridled's Song finish fifth as the favorite in the '96 Kentucky Derby, said, "This is my third chance at the Derby and this is the first time that I'm 100 percent confident that my horse can get the distance. Adonis is bred to run a mile and a quarter." Runner-up Best of Luck rallied strongly to be second, but trainer Allen Jerkens said his charge would skip the Derby, pointing instead for the May 23 GII Peter Pan S. and the June 5 GI Belmont S. The 2-1 chalk Badge (Air Forbes Won) made a move on the turn and finished evenly to be fourth. "Usually he's a little farther out of it," trainer Joe Aquilino said. "We'll see how he comes out of it. Kentucky is still a possibility."

She was back after a fourmonth break to finish second in the Mar. 27 Hialeah Breeders' Cup H. and was second choice in her second outing of the year. Rated off the pace while saving ground early, the bay moved to the outside to launch her bid in the stretch, gained the lead in the final furlong and drew clear. "(Trainer Tom Skiffington) told me to get her onto a dangling rein and tuck her in wherever she's comfortable and don't do anything," said winning jockey Julie Krone. "Going down the backside my reins were just splashing around on her neck, she was going along so easily. She kept asking me, 'Now? Now?' And I had to keep telling her no." Skiffington added, "I'll give her a little break now, take her to New York and point for the Sheepshead Bay (GII, Belmont Park, May 31). I think she'll go a longer distance and ultimately make it to the Breeders' Cup." The race was marred by an incident just inside the three-eighths pole as 3-5 Coretta (Ire) (Caerleon) stumbled badly as she lost her footing behind and slid, then was run into by I.C. Cindy (Gallapiat); both fillies were eased. "She appears to be fine," said Coretta's trainer, Christophe Clement.

"I don't think there's a staying horse in Australia with the final 600-metre sprint that he's got, with the exception of Tie The Knot (Aus)." An AUS\$15,000 (US\$9,341) purchase, the winner took his earnings to a few dollars shy of AUS\$2 million (\$1.245 million) with this win.

Father and Son Team Win Grand National:

Ireland celebrated its first winner of the Martell Grand National in 24 years as Bobbyjo (Ire) triumphed for the father and son team of trainer Tommy and jockey Paul Carberry at Aintree yesterday. Ironically, in 1975 when L'Escargot became the last Irish horse to win the race, foiling the greatest National horse ever, Red Rum, Tommy Carberry was the rider, with Paul just 14 months old. Backed down to 10-1, Bobbyjo beat 25-1 chance Blue Charm (Ire) by 10 lengths in a thrilling race, the richest steeplechase ever run in Britain with £420,000 (\$677,637) in prize money. The good ground led to 18 horses finishing out of the 32 starters who set on over four-and-a-half miles and 30 fences. Call It A Day (Ire), ridden by the most successful current jockey in the Grand National, Richard Dunwoody, was a neck back in third. The 25-year-old winning jockey said, "This is a dream come true for me. It went super the whole way. I got a great start and let him have a look at his fences. He jumped absolutely super." Comparing the experience with winning on L'Escargot, Tommy Carberry said, "This is great, fantastic, a lot better than when I won it. Paul gave him a fantastic ride. It is a great feeling to have won the National as a jockey and then see my son do that as well. I was always confident that he would do it one day as long as the right horse came along for him on the right day." Bobbyjo runs in the colours of long-time owner Bobby Burke, who owns 22 pubs in North London. Double Thriller (GB), who drifted to 7-1 second favourite, unseated Joe Tizzard at the very first fence and the favourite was the mare Fiddling The Facts (Ire) at 6-1 who came down at Becher's second time around four others including the Martin Pipe-trained Eudipe (Fr), who was humanely destroyed after suffering serious neck injuries. A crowd of over 49,000 saw the race at Aintree and on-course Tote betting turnover broke the £1-million pound mark for the first time on fine day weatherwise.
