KEENELAND APRIL SALE SET FOR

TODAY Tom Van Meter, a top bloodstock agent and partner in the Eaton Sales Agency, set a record when he purchased a Mr. Prospector filly out of the mare Shufflin n Seatle (Seattle Slew) for \$500,000 last year. It was the highest price ever paid for a filly at the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, which celebrates its seventh edition today in Lexington. This year, Van Meter plays a different role, selling a Wild Again juvenile, half-sister to last year's record purchase. The filly, Hip 118, is consigned to the sale by M. W. Miller III, agent. "I think it's going to be a great sale," said Van Meter, "There are a lot of good horses in the sale and there are always runners coming out of it. I hope we have one in there again." The sale, which begins at 1:30 p.m., offers 225 two-year-olds. Said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's assistant director of sales, "We've worked awfully hard to make sure we took the right horses and that we had quality. Last year, we didn't have the big numbers, but we had good horses and I think it showed. I think time has proven the sale to be successful. This year, we've got 60 more horses than we had a year ago, but we haven't compromised one thing. They're by some of the top sire lines. They have good, solid pedigrees. And, they look the part. We're very happy with the horses that we have entered for this year's sale." The list of sires that will be represented may be one of the most impressive groups ever. There are juveniles by Sadler's Wells, Nureyev, Seattle Slew, Deputy Minister, Storm Cat, Seeking the Gold, Woodman, A. P. Indy and Gone West. "The sire power in this sale is very impressive," said Van Meter, whose record purchase a year ago turned out to be Here I Go. The filly broke her maiden at Saratoga by an impressive nine lengths and ran second to the grand Silverbulletday in the GIII Golden Rod S. last year. The 1997 sale produced the Grade I-winning fillies Beautiful Pleasure, Keeper Hill and Vivid Angel, as well as Halory Hunter, who captured the 1998 GII Blue Grass S. and ran fourth in the Kentucky Derby before being injured. "When you look at how the sale has produced, I think you have to be impressed," said Russell. "The sale ranks as one of the best in the world at producing Grade I stakes winners. I think that says a lot about the quality of the horses being offered here in April. It's a good sale and I think more and more people are beginning to recognize that."

Wondertross Update:

Wondertross (Chief's Crown) is expected to return to Nick Zito's Keeneland barn tomorrow after a stay in the Haygard-Davis-McGee equine hospital due to a bout with colic, the trainer reported. Zito has not ruled out a start in the Kentucky Derby for the colt, but knows everything would have to go perfectly between now and Derby Day to make the race. "The last thing I want to do is something silly with him," Zito said. "Once he comes back, we'll do light training and monitor that. If we can get real lucky, there's a possibility we could make it. We'll take it one day at a time. We have a shot of making it." Wondertross ran perhaps the poorest race of his career when sixth as the 9-5 favorite in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass at Keeneland. He came down with colic Sunday morning. Zito said the recovery has gone smoothly and he is pleased with the reports he has gotten from Haygard-Davis-McGee.

Derby Possibles on Churchill Work Tab:

Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who will make her next start in either the May 1 Kentucky Derby or the Apr. 30 Kentucky Oaks, worked a half in :48 2/5 under jockey Robby Albarado yesterday morning. "I thought it was an awesome work," Albarado said. "They wanted to go easy with her. She gets over this track awesome, she loves it here."...GII Gallery Furniture.com runner-up K One King (Apalachee) also breezed yesterday, going six furlongs in 1:15.

John Velazquez Makes Derby Choice

Barry K. Schwartz, owner of Three Ring (Notebook), confirmed yesterday that he has a commitment from jockey John Velazquez to ride the GII Bonnie Miss heroine in the May 1 Kentucky Derby. "(Velazquez' agent) Angel Cordero called (trainer) Eddie Plesa yesterday and told us that we have the call. John rode her in her last two starts, both impressive victories, so naturally we are excited about the decision," said Schwartz. The decision had been in doubt, as Velazquez was also the regular rider of Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), whom he partnered to a fifth-place finish in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Schwartz also confirmed that the decision to run in the Derby is unconditional and that his filly has not been entered for the GI Kentucky Oaks.

Arthur Hancock III is no stranger to the peaks and troughs which are part and parcel of the Thoroughbred game. In February, Hancock suffered a setback when Harlan, a horse he bred and raced in conjunction with W. T. Young, died from a ruptured aorta in the Stone Farm breeding shed. But less than two months later Hancock was back on a high, so much so that he told the media, "Emotionally this is one of the most wonderful days of my life." The reason for this elation was the exciting victory in the GI Blue Grass S. of Menifee, a Harlan colt bred by Hancock and owned by the partnership of Hancock and James H. Stone.

Hancock's links with Harlan began roughly 20 years ago, when he acquired an interest in Harlan's dam, the Canadian Grade II winner Country Romance, but it was at the 1986 Keeneland November Sales that he became the mare's outright owner--for only \$45,000. A daughter of Stone Farm's champion sire Halo, Country Romance was carrying a filly by Gato del Sol, another Stone Farm resident. That filly, Romanticat, became the dam of Things Change, winner of last year's Gl Spinaway S. at Saratoga, and Harlan was her next foal. Although Harlan didn't become a stakes winner until he was five, he chose a very good moment to do so, defeating American Chance and Cherokee Run in a tight finish to the Gl Vosburgh S.

Menifee is a member of Harlan's first crop and breeders must now be wishing they had made fuller use of this Stone Farm sire, who attracted only 26 mares in his second season and 35 in his third. Harlan's Grade I success with Menifee came a day before Mountain Cat's son Classic Cat took the GII San Bernardino H., so it was a good weekend for Storm Cat's stallion sons. Storm Cat himself supplied the Blue Grass second Cat Thief and also has Aljabr to represent him at Churchill Downs.

When Menifee appeared at the Keeneland September Sales, the bidding rose no higher than \$35,000. Perhaps would-be purchasers were deterred by the fact that he was out of an old mare--albeit a very good old mare. His dam, Anne Campbell, was 23 years old when she foaled him and had first found fame in the early 1980s, when her son Desert Wine ranked among the best of his age at two, three and four. Anne Campbell's subsequent winners include Excavate, a Grade II-placed Mr Prospector colt bought for \$1.1 million as a yearling, and Arsaan, a \$700,000 Nureyev filly who won a stakes race over a mile in England.

The way Menifee finished at Keeneland didn't suggest any shortage of stamina and he is a half-brother to Desert Wine, who followed up his second in the 1983 Blue Grass by finishing runner-up to Sunny's Halo in the Kentucky Derby and to Deputed Testamony in the Preakness. However, Desert Wine was sired by Damascus, a winner of the Belmont S. and the two-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup, whereas Menifee is by a fast son of Storm Cat. Perhaps the significant name in Harlan's pedigree, in this instance, will prove to be his broodmare sire Halo, sire of the Derby heroes Sunny's Halo and Sunday Silence.
