RECORDS FALL AT KEENELAND APRIL

The seventh annual Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale was a history-making, record-smashing affair yesterday in Lexington, Ky. The sales topper, a strapping colt by 1999 freshman sire Not for Love (Mr. Prospector) out of the Assert (Ire) mare Three Grand, tied the record for the highest-priced juvenile colt ever sold at public auction when Demi O'Byrne raised his hand for the final time at \$2 million. The whopping bid ties the record amount paid by The Thoroughbred Corp. for a son of Brocco at last month's Barretts sale. "Both Demi and me liked this horse," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas, who, along with O'Byrne, picked out the twoyear-old for Michael Tabor. "When we both like one, then usually we go after it pretty good. This horse was hard to fault. You could walk all the way around him and not find anything to fault him on. He looked like he could move and he went out and proved it. He was everything you could ask for. He's a stone-cold runner." The two-year-old, consigned by H. T. Stables, agent for Cam Allard, recorded a one-furlong work in :10 1/5 at last week's under-tack preview. Lukas trained Kentucky Derby winner Thunder Gulch for Tabor. When asked if the purchase was solely for Tabor, Lukas responded, "I don't know. I'm not the financial adviser. I'm just the trainer." The McKathan brothers, who have bought several horses for Bob Baffert, were the underbidders on the colt. Lochlin Slew (Seattle Slew--Lochlin {Screen King}), consigned by M. W. Miller, III, agent, provided a precursor of things to come when her \$1.25 million price tag made her the world's highest-priced juvenile filly. B. Wayne Hughes made the record bid. "She was our top choice in the sale," admitted Hughes. "We had to go father than we meant to go. I thought she would bring around \$800,000. She will go to California and go to trainer Ron Ellis."

Before Tuesday, Keeneland had never sold a sevenfigure April two-year-old, but yesterday's session saw three youngsters break through the million-dollar barrier. The third came when Narvick International, acting on behalf of 505 Farms, paid \$1.1 million for a son of Deputy Minister--The Way We Were (Avatar) from the consignment of The Kindergarten Farm, agent. "We really liked the way he looked and moved and his pedigree is attractive to us, as well," Narvick's Emmanuel de Seroux explained. The colt will be trained by John Shirreffs. The previous Keeneland April record was set last year when a full brother to champion Hansel brought \$725,000. "We're very happy," said Geoffrey Russell, Keeneland's assistant director of sales. "It was great to see the big money in here. We never had sold a horse for over \$1 million in this sale and we had three of them. We had a record filly and a record colt. It was very encouraging."

Late Epsom Entries:

Six new contenders for the Vodafone Epsom Derby have been entered at the race's second entry announced yesterday. The sextet--Adair (Theatrical {Ire}), Bienamado (Bien Bien), Chatting (Exbourne), Killer Instinct (GB) (Zafonic), Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Val Royal (Fr) (Royal Academy)--were entered at a cost of £8,000 (\$12,907) each, bringing the total number of entries for the race to 149, the same as in 1998. There is one final chance for supplementary entries to be made at a cost of £75,000 (\$121,007) on May 29, two days before the five-day confirmation stage. Having won her maiden at Brighton last year and winning for only the second time all told, Valentine Waltz put herself firmly in the picture for the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 2 with an authoritative display to prove best of a competitive field. Tracking the leader Hawriyah in fourth place along the rail, Valentine Waltz got a lucky break approaching the quarter-mile pole as Hawriyah drifted off the rail. Not needing to be asked twice by Frankie Dettori, Valentine Waltz quickened in excellent style and put the result beyond doubt extending to a clear lead approaching the final eighth, running on well for a three-length success and earning quotes of between 10-1 and 16-1 (from 50-1) for the first fillies' Classic. An obviously delighted John Gosden said: "I do think she is a live contender for the 1000 Guineas as long as the ground is good or quicker--she has a very quick action and she won't do so well on soft ground." An enthusiastic Dettori added: "Any filly that wins a Guineas trial has to be a live candidate. When the gap came on the rail two furlongs out she quickened up really well."
