CANADIAN TRIPLE CROWN BONUS UNVEILED

The Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society, in conjunction with the Ontario Jockey Club and Nordic Gaming, have announced a CAN\$500,000 (US\$327,504) bonus for any horse that sweeps the Canadian Triple Crown. The series includes the June 27 Queens Plate S., the July 25 Prince of Wales S. and the Aug. 15 Breeders' S. The bonus increases the value of the Triple Crown to \$1.5 million. In addition, the Canadian Thoroughbred Horse Society (Ontario Division) has, through its Thoroughbred Improvement Program, implemented a bonus of \$50,000 (\$32,750) for the breeder of a horse that sweeps the series.

Desert Hero Derby Bound:

The Thoroughbred Corp.'s Desert Hero (Sea Hero), third in the GI Santa Anita Derby in his last start, will be trained up to a run in the May 1 Kentucky Derby. The colt had been tentatively scheduled to run in this weekend's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland, but trainer Dick Mandella had a change of plans. "I was thinking I'd want to get another prep into him," Mandella explained. "But we decided it would be best to train up to the Derby like I was thinking after (the Santa Anita Derby). We thought we could get him a little more experience with another prep race. We want him to go to the Kentucky Derby sound and healthy." Desert Hero defeated Santa Anita runner-up Prime Timber to win the Feb. 28 GII San Rafael S. in only his second lifetime start, then made his third racetrack appearance in the Santa Anita Derby.

These three had the race between them, and it was La Sylphide who ran on best inside the final furlong to win going away. Winning trainer Nicolas Clement spoke of future plans for his filly, "She had come on a lot on her debut and earlier this year we thought she was nice enough to be entered in the G1 Prix de Diane in June. That will be her main target, and, as she is not (nominated to) the G1 Prix Saint-Alary May 23, she might go straight there. But we also have the possibility to supplement her in that race and we will decide in time. She is still quite green, and will learn more from racing. With experience she could turn out to be a real nice filly." Third-place filly Sunday Picnic will now be aimed at the G1 Vodafone Oaks at Epsom, June 4, according to owner Teruya Toshida's racing manager, Patrick Barbe, with one more run in France before the English Classic.

Green Card, belying his odds of 20-1, kept on well for the show. Winning trainer Henry Cecil said, "We were going to leave her alone as she hadn't run since last May and had been in her box. I thought it would be good if we could get her to a racecourse but hats off to Maria (Niarchos) for leaving her in training for another season. It was a good performance considering all she has been through and she did everything right. I didn't expect her to win but she will get a 1 1/4 mile and will go for everything from a mile to 10 furlongs."

The combination of Roberto and Dixieland Band is one which has long held promise on paper, but on Saturday that promise was fulfilled in the flesh when the highly touted Adonis won the GII Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct.

The key to the pedigree potential of the Roberto/Dixieland Band cross (or its reverse) lies in the relationship between Bramalea, dam of Roberto, and Beautillion, the dam of Dixieland Band's broodmare sire Delta Judge. Bramalea is by Nasrullah's son Nashua out of the mare Rarelea. Beautillion is by Nasrullah's son Noor out of Delta Queen, a sister to Rarelea. This makes Bramalea and Delta Queen three-parts sisters, and in the pedigree of Adonis the pair appear 3x5.

Adonis also has a feature that appears in several good Kris S. offspring--inbreeding to Kris S.'s maternal grandsire Princequillo. We tend to think that inbreeding to the broodmare sire of a stallion is a pattern that works well in general, and it has certainly proved successful for Kris S. The pattern has appeared in his Group 1/Grade I winners Cheval Volant and Dr Fong, as well as 1998 group and graded winners Diamond on the Run and Midnight Line.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

The influence of the combination Rock Sand and Fairy Gold--two of the grandparents of Man o' War--is still making its influence felt today. Man o' War was by Fair Play (out of Fairy Gold) and his dam was by Rock Sand. Meanwhile, the talented runner Friar Rock was by Rock Sand out of Fairy Gold. One of Man o' War's most influential sons, War Relic, was out of a Friar Rock mare and therefore had Fairy Gold and Rock Sand 3x3. Oddly enough, Friar Rock's outstanding grandson Eight Thirty had a second dam by Man o' War, thus returning the favor and giving a very similar genetic background.

The latest major winner with an accumulation of Fairy Gold and Rock Sand is Perfect Score (c, 3, Personal Hope--Ten for Ten, by Proper Reality), who took the GIII Bay Shore S. at Aqueduct Saturday. Personal Hope's granddam, All the Years, has a major build-up of the strain as she has Man o' War and his three-quarters relative MIIe Dazie 6x5x6x5x6 and Friar Rock 6x5. Perfect Score's broodmare sire Proper Reality is a son of In Reality, a horse who has War Relic 3x3. For good measure, Perfect Score also has linebreeding to War Relic's son Battlefield (inbred to Fair Play) and to Battlefield's dam.

The GIII John B. Campbell H. winner Crosspatch (h, 5, Waquoit--Hatched, by Hatchet Man) has close inbreeding to genetic relatives. The Axe II--who is by Mahmoud with a second dam by Blue Larkspur--appears 4x3, while Waquoit's broodmare sire Grey Dawn II is out of Polamia, who is also by Mahmoud with a second dam by Blue Larkspur.

One stallion who has really benefitted from the power of the Tom Fool/Nijinsky II combination is Afleet, who is out of a mare by Tom Fool's son Venetian Jester. From his North American crops, the cross with Nijinsky II-line mares credited Afleet with Italian Champion Two-Year-Old and GII Withers S. winner Blu Tsunami, Grade I winner Flat Fleet Feet and near-millionaire Top Secret. Now in Japan, Afleet was represented last weekend by the G1-Jpn Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas) victoress Primo Ordine (Jpn) (f, 3, Afleet--Mon Paris {Jpn}, by Maruzensky {Jpn}), who is not only a product of the Afleet/Nijinsky II cross, but also linebred to Tom Fool. It looks as if owners of Afleet mares in the U.S. could do worse than to try them with stallions carrying Nijinsky II.

Inbreeding to Mr. Prospector through Fappiano and other son strains is beginning to look very viable, particularly when Fappiano's son Cryptoclearance is involved. The surprising winner of the GII Arkansas Derby, Valhol (g, 3, Diazo--Slycel, by Cryptoclearance) follows Strategic Maneuver and Laydown as the third graded stakes winner featuring Mr. Prospector inbreeding through Fappiano/Cryptoclearance and another son strain.

Valhol also has some other genetic relationships working for him, with the closely related My Babu and Ambiorix appearing 5x5. He also has a double of Prince John, along with Eight Thirty and War Admiral, horses who have a close relationship with Prince John's family and who are often seen in partnership with him.
