JULIE KRONE CALLS IT A CAREER She went out kicking and screaming. You could hear jockey Julie Krone hollering all the way down the Lone Star Park stretch as she drove Desert Demon to the wire in what would be the final race of her storied career, giving it her all as she has done since the beginning. And it all ended just as it began. Krone finished second with her very first mount back in January of 1981 and she was second with her very last, missing by 1 1/4 lengths in yesterday's Lone Star Derby. "It started and ended on the same note," she said, "and there were a whole lot of wins in between. I've had it in mind to retire for a while, but if I had stepped down during all the adversity, it would have been quitting. It's nice to leave while I still enjoy what I'm doing. Like Wayne Gretzky, I got to go out on my own terms and there is a lot of life out there for me." Krone rode three winners on the card at Lone Star yesterday and went out with a total of 3,546 career victories, including the 1993 Belmont S.

OBS SPRING SALE STARTS TODAY The Ocala Breeders' Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, which last year produced GI Spinaway S. winner Things Change (Stalwart), GSW Premier Property (Out of Place) and GSW Certain (Out of Place), gets underway at the OBS Sales Complex in Ocala, Florida this morning. Certain, third in the GI Fountain of Youth S., was second in the GII Arkansas Derby and is a candidate for the Kentucky Derby; he sold for \$45,000 at two. This year's catalogue includes juveniles by such top stallions as Alleged, A.P. Indy, End Sweep, Mt. Livermore, Pine Bluff, Silver Deputy, Storm Bird, and Woodman. French Deputy, Mr. Greeley, Pembroke and Tabasco Cat are among the promising freshman sires represented. A colt by freshman Rizzi, named Rich Celebration, clocked the fastest time for three furlongs during the final session of the Under Tack Show Sunday, going in :34 2/5. Consigned by Mark Casse, agent, the dark bay sells as Hip #956 Thursday. A pair of Pentelicus colts from the Ocala Stud Farm consignment tied for quickest quarter, with Hip #931 and Hip #984 each going in :21 4/5. Turning in the fastest furlong was a colt by Kipper Kelly, who went in :10 2/5. Consigned by Southern Chase Farm, Inc., he sells as Hip #1150, the final offering at the auction. A total of 1150 two-year-olds have been catalogued for the four-day affair, which runs through Thursday. Bidding starts at 10:30 a.m. daily.

Charismatic was making his 14th start, but seems to be improving with the experience. After being promoted to victory four starts back, the colt ran second in a Feb. 19 allowance and was a fast-closing second in the GIII El Camino Real Derby Mar. 6. Thrown to the wolves in the GI Santa Anita Derby 15 days ago, the chestnut did not disgrace himself, finishing fourth. Texas Glitter (Glitterman), experimenting at two turns, led through sprint-like fractions, with Yankee Victor up with the pace and Charismatic within striking distance. As the field rounded the far turn, jockey Jerry Bailey sent his mount three wide after Yankee Victor, who led two furlongs out, collared that rival at the eighth pole and pulled away. Said Bailey, "We were going really easy down the backside. I was just sitting there and waiting for my spot." Winning trainer D. Wayne Lukas said, "He keeps getting better and better. I've trained him harder than I have any other horse coming up to the Derby." Lukas had said prior to the race that the May 1 Kentucky Derby was next, "win, lose or draw."

Single Empire, winner of the G1 Italian Derby at three, was unsuccessful in three European starts last year, then finished second in the GII Carleton F. Burke H. in his U.S. bow last October. He came back after a five-month vacation to take the 1 1/2-mile GII San Luis Rey S. by a nose Mar. 21 in his second Stateside attempt and put them back-to-back here. The crowd's choice stalked steady splits, swept to the front on the final bend and had enough left to hold off the late charge of Le Paillard for the victory. "What a marathoner," jockey Kent Desormeaux said. "Mr. Drysdale is very good at getting those that are a little overanxious to settle down and we needed that today. This horse was the consummate gentleman all the way around there. When I called on him, he really took off." As for what's next, trainer Neil Drysdale said, "These marathon horses do need time between their races, so I don't know when we'll see him again. Maybe the (GIII Golden Gate H., June 19)."

A winner on her last start in the Listed Premio Seregno at Milan Apr. 4, Shenck won her first group race in Europe's first Classic of the season with Sylvain Guillot aboard. The filly capped a marvelous race for winning trainer Bruno Grizzetti, who also saddled thirdplaced Lady Storm, ridden by Olivier Peslier, vindicating his policy of using French jockeys. Always up with the pace as Rosy Girl (GB) (Common Grounds {GB}) set out to make all, Shenck was positioned down the center of the home straight in a search of the best going on the unforgiving ground. Rosy Girl tried to quicken away from her opponents upon entering the straight, but was overtaken by Lady Storm and Southern House at the three-eighths marker and those two continued the battle until the winner's long and telling run paid dividends. She quickened at the eighth pole and ran on for a well-earned success.

"Bullet" Fires Bullet at Churchill

Eclipse Award champ Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), impressive winner of the Gl Ashland S. Apr. 3, registered a bullet five furlongs yesterday morning in :59 over the Churchill Downs main track, a clocking more than two seconds faster than any other drill. Despite the filly's affinity for the Downs, trainer Bob Baffert is still not inclined to take on the boys. "She's quick and she loves this track, but I'm still thinking Oaks," said Baffert. "I know what it takes for the Derby and maybe something could change, but the field would have to change a lot. It's a large field and she's a little filly, she's light." Baffert also reported that Gll Fantasy S. winner Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) will work this morning.

Derby Work Tab:

A pair of Derby hopefuls were out for work yesterday morning. Forty One Carats (Tactical Advantage), most recently second in the GIII Flamingo S. Apr. 3, broke off at the 5 1/2-furlong pole and worked past the wire, getting his six furlongs in 1:15 with jockey Jorge Chavez aboard. Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), a disappointing fifth behind Menifee in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 10, had a "maintenance work" according to trainer Scotty Schulhofer, going an easy half mile in :49 2/5. On tap for today is a one-mile work for GII Gallery Furniture.com runner-up K One King (Apalachee), with his Derby rider Alex Solis in the saddle.

Future Plans for Lexington Scratches:

Both Lethal Instrument (Gulch) and Doneraile Court (Seattle Slew) were scratched from yesterday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. after drawing outside post positions. Lethal Instrument will head back to California after working five furlongs in a bullet :59 3/5 at Keeneland yesterday. "I really looked hard at (the Lexington)," trainer John Shirreffs said. "I was wondering if there was any way that we could take back and drop over to the rail and save some ground. But I didn't think there was any way but to be fanned very wide going into the first turn. There was just no way we could really compete from out there. I did what was best for the horse." The colt's next start has not yet been decided. Doneraile Court will be pointed for the Apr. 24 GIII Derby Trial at Churchill Downs.
