SULTRY SONG COLT TOPS OBS WEDNESDAY Baryshnikov's Song, a bay colt by Sultry Song out of stakes winner Subtle Dancer (Crafty Prospector), brought \$125,000 to top Wednesday's third session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training, held in Ocala, Florida. The colt, consigned by Live Oak Stud and purchased by Johnnan Farm as Hip 601, drilled a quarter mile in :22 3/5 at last Wednesday's Under Tack Show. The day's second highest price of \$90,000 was paid for Hip 766, Devilish Love, a bay colt by Diablo--Angel Love (Foreign Power). Devilish Love was consigned by H & H Equine, agent, and purchased by Martin Cherry. "I thought the market held up well today," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "If anything, it was a bit stronger toward the end of the session. So far in three days we've sold 44 horses for \$50,000 or more compared with 36 for the entire four days last year. Buybacks were down



WRITERS UP

RACING LOSES A LEGEND

By Bill Christine

Charlie Whittingham was already a legend when he became the oldest trainer to win the Kentucky Derby. The "Bald Eagle," who died Tuesday at the age of 86, never cared much for pushing young horses. He had only run twice in the Kentucky Derby before bringing Ferdinand to Churchill Downs in 1986, but he and his equally long-of-tooth jockey Bill Shoemaker marched to the winner's circle after the colt's 2 1/4-length victory.

"If I had known it was this much fun, I would have tried this more often," he said after the race. Three years later he was back with Sunday Silence to break his own record, becoming the oldest horseman to saddle a Derby winner at age 76.

"His standard advice before a race was, 'Don't screw it up, jock,'" said Pat Valenzuela, who was aboard for that win. "He said the same thing before Sunday Silence won the Derby. There was never a horse I rode for Charlie that wasn't ready to run."

Whittingham won 204 stakes at Santa Anita, 222 at Hollywood Park and more than 600 overall. He trained 11 national champions, three of them--Ack Ack, Ferdinand and Sunday Silence--that won Horse of the Year titles.

Lean, fit and bald-headed, he took pride in being an ex-Marine. But that hard-bitten demeanor was only a facade. There was an open-door policy at his barn and during his trips to Churchill Downs for the Derby he would answer even the silliest media questions.

Telling Whittingham how to run his stable was another thing. He had no patience for owners who interfered. The composer Burt Bacharach stopped by his barn one day with the suggestion that one of his slumping horses be wormed.

Whittingham glared. "You haven't had any hits yourself lately," he told Bacharach. "Maybe we ought to worm your piano."

Bacharach quietly retreated.

Whittingham, battling leukemia and deteriorating eyesight that left him with no vision in one eye and only about 40 percent vision in the other, still trained a small band of horses at Santa Anita this year.

According to the *Daily Racing Form*, he won 2,534 races--almost 25 percent of them stakes--and his horses earned \$110,602,295.

"If there was a better trainer that I rode for, I don't know who it would be," Bill Shoemaker said.

As part of the launch, Churchill Downs will host a special charity auction from April 26 to May 2 to benefit the Jockey's Guild Disabled Jockeys Fund.

Manistique Displaces Soft Palate:

Multiple graded stakes winner Manistique (Unbridled), fourth in the April 9 Gl Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn, displaced her soft palate during the race. She has been shipped to Keeneland and will undergo laser surgery there to correct the problem. Trainer John Shirreffs said the ailment isn't career threatening.

Indian Hill Farm Sold:

Lee Eaton yesterday announced he has sold Indian Hill Farm in Lexington, Kentucky, operating as Eaton Farms, Inc., which he has owned with Sam Lyon and Marvin Waldman since its purchase in 1964. The 268-acre farm has been sold to Reiley McDonald and partners, who also lease Eaton Farm's 111 acre yearling preparation farm on Newtown Pike in Lexington. McDonald said, "We plan to continue to operate both the broodmare and yearling farms with the same personnel and without major change...This is truly one of the great horse raising farms in the world, having produced such horses as Bold Forbes, Green Desert, Saratoga Six, Twilight Agenda, Be My Guest, Life at the Top, Market Booster, etc."



TRA Elects New Director, Adopts Wagering Policies:

The Thoroughbred Racing Associations adopted several policy initiatives to ensure responsible wagering at its member tracks, named three new alternate directors and officially named a new director for the recently acquired Turfway Park at its regular meeting held Tuesday at Delaware Park. The organization affirmed its commitment to enforcing minimum legal wagering ages and gave its support to the dedication of money from state taxes to support responsible wagering awareness, prevention and treatment programs. The TRA will also implement an advertising code of conduct to avoid targeting under-age individuals. The board adopted a policy on account wagering to ensure the same safeguards are in place for account wagering as those at pari-mutuel facilities. Howard Bruno, Frank Deal and William Murphy were elected alternate directors for Garden State, Remington and Thistledown, respectively. Board member William Greely of Keeneland also will serve as the board representative for Turfway.

1999 Jockey Club Fact Book Released:

North American handle rose 3.9 percent to more than \$13.8 billion in 1998, according to the recently released 1999 Jockey Club Fact Book, but once again increases were restricted to the off-track market which accounted for 80.5 percent of total handle. Off-track wagering represented 78 percent of North American handle in 1997 and 74.4 percent in 1996--the first year in which the figure was broken down into on and offtrack totals. The online Fact Book, available at www.jockeyclub.com/factbook, features monthly updates in the Breeding section as well as expanded analyses of some of the leading economic indicators not practical within the printed version.
