EIGHTEEN STAKES TO SUPPORT BREEDERS'

CUP Breeders' Cup Ltd., in conjunction with Gulfstream Park, has announced a schedule for the Nov. 5-7 Breeders' Cup meet which will encompass 30 races, including the eight Breeders' Cup events and 18 additional stakes. Purses for the non-Breeders' Cup races will total \$2,425,000. Highlights include the \$250,000 Fraise S. for three-year-olds and up at a mile and eighth on the turf and the \$200,000 Prized S. for two-year-olds at nine furlongs on the turf Friday, Nov. 5. Sunday's features include the \$200,000 Steinlen S. for three-year-olds going a mile on the grass and the \$200,000 Safely Kept S. at six furlongs for fillies and mares, three-year-olds and up. "This unique event promises to be one of the greatest racing presentations ever with 26 stakes in three days," said Gulfstream president and chief executive officer Douglas Donn.

FASIG-TIPTON TO HOST PREVIEW The Under Tack Show for the first-ever Fasig-Tipton Preferred Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at Churchill Downs will be held today at 10:30 a.m. Sires represented in the sale include Danzig, Belong to Me, Silver Deputy and Saint Ballado along with first-crop sires Thunder Gulch, French Deputy and Pembroke. Also selling is a colt by Gilded Time out of Multiply (Easy Goer), dam of GII San Rafael winner and Kentucky Derby hopeful Desert Hero (Sea Hero). A total of 112 horses have been catalogued for the sale which begins at 1:30 p.m. Monday, Apr. 26 at the Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum. Withdrawn from the sale are hip numbers 1, 12, 19, 23, 29, 33, 34, 45, 50, 53, 54, 65, 69, 70, 73, 85, 87, 91, 96, 100 and 113.

KIPPER KELLY COLT TOPS OBS FINALE A colt by Kipper Kelly out of Gunni Gal (What a Pleasure), the final offering of the four-day sale, brought a bid of \$270,000 to top yesterday's final session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Florida. Named Gunni Kelly, the dark bay breezed a quarter mile in :10 2/5, co-fastest time during the Under Tack Show. Consigned by Southern Chase Farm, Inc., he was purchased by Kaaren and Hays Biggs. The Biggs were the sale's leading buyers, taking home seven juveniles, including the sales-topping \$300,000 Silver Deputy colt, for a total of \$995,000. A colt by Pentelicus--Contradanza (Meadowlake), named Busy Wire, attracted the second-highest price Thursday. Consigned by Ocala Stud Farms, the bay was bought by Harry Aleo for \$125,000. "We have to be pleased with how the week went," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "The market was strong right down to the last horse through the ring and the consignors who brought the best athletes to the ring were well rewarded."

NTRA CONFIRMS WINNER ACQUISITION The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has reached an agreement in principle to acquire Winner Communications' horse racing business. Winner Communications, based in Tulsa, Oklahoma, produces all of ESPN's racing coverage. The accord stipulates that current agreements with ESPN and espn2 for approximately 125 hours per year of racing programming would be extended for five years. Winner, which owns the industry's largest archives and holds access rights to extensive programming time on ESPN and affiliated networks, will perform production and related services for a newly formed in-house television production and archival resource, NTRA Productions, "for a multi-year period," according to an NTRA press release. "The formation of NTRA Productions enables the NTRA to be directly involved in shaping the way in which our sport is presented to the public," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "This is an excellent opportunity for us to strengthen our horse-racing programming through production enhancements and links to interactive media such as the Internet. Our member tracks will gain added national exposure through programs produced by NTRA Productions, and will further benefit as the industry's media archives are expanded and improved." The NTRA Board of Directors also yesterday approved the creation of NTRA Services, a new subsidiary designed to facilitate interactive wagering in connection with the Television Games Network (TVG). "While some important details of the TVG relationship are still to be finalized, the Board concluded that full NTRA support and assistance should be given to help assure TVG's initial deployment and ultimate success," said Smith.

GREAT LAKES DOWNS OPENS FOR

INAUGURAL MEET Michigan's only Thoroughbred racetrack, Great Lakes Downs, opens its gates for its first-ever live program tonight at 6 p.m. Located in the town of Muskegon, the track will race Friday through Tuesday evenings. The open stakes schedule has yet to be released, but the calendar includes 27 stakes for Michigan-breds, highlighted by Michigan Sires S. day, Oct. 10. The four divisions of the Sire S. are worth \$125,000 each, with two-year-olds and two-year-old fillies going six furlongs and three-year-olds and threeyear-old fillies going seven furlongs. The facility has a five-eighths of a mile oval, with chutes for races at a half-mile and seven furlongs. Closing day for the inaugural meet is Sunday, Nov. 7.

ATTENDANCE INCREASES AT SANTA ANITA For the third year running, Santa Anita Park has reported an increase in overall attendance for the winterspring meet which ended this past Monday. Over two million racegoers passed through the gates during the 84-day race meet, an average of 25,928, up three percent against the 1997-98 figures. Attendance overall improved by .55 percent. "We are especially proud of this accomplishment, in light of the challenges facing Thoroughbred racing today," said vice president of marketing Craig Dado. "Although the increases are modest, the trend continues in the right direction," he added. The daily average handle from all sources, also saw an increase as compared to last season, up over 1.5 percent at \$11,830,250. An alltime California record (excluding Breeders' Cup events) was achieved on Santa Anita H. day Mar. 6 when \$24,749,107 was handled. That threshhold was crossed again four weeks later when General Challenge took the Santa Anita Derby. California-bred Free House was the champion of the Big 'Cap en route to Horse of the Meet honors, as voted by the media. General Challenge was named Three-Year-Old of the meet. Racing returns to Santa Anita for the Oak Tree meeting in October.

General Challenge (General Meeting) was out just after the break, going a similar distance in 1:12 and out seven furlongs in 1:25. It was the second local work for both, who also worked five furlongs last Saturday. "I had him (General Challenge) up in 1:38 and change and he didn't want to pull up," said Baffert. "That's the way he (General Challenge) is. He is the better work horse. They showed me that they love the track, they haven't regressed and they are training unbelievable," he added.
