TURFWAY PRESIDENT RESIGNS Turfway Park President Mark Simendinger will step down from his position effective May 1. Simendinger, 40, joined Turfway Park as treasurer in 1988 and was promoted to president in 1992. During his tenure, Simendinger oversaw the transformation of Turfway Park from leaky-roofed Latonia and helped institute the track's Kentucky Cup Day of Champions in 1994. Turfway Park officials will begin the search for Simendinger's successor immediately.

TRIPLE THREATS

Derby Works:

Godolphin Racing Inc.'s Worldly Manner (Riverman) and Aljabr (Storm Cat) put in their final major pre-Derby works Thursday morning over a good Churchill track. Worldly Manner, with Daragh O'Donohue up, worked five furlongs in 1:02. Aljabr, with Brian Procter up, was clocked in 1:02 3/5. Commenting on the unusual twodays-before-the-Derby work, trainer Saeed bin Suroor said, "They were just nice works, not very fast. This is what we wanted to do. This is what we do at home." Bin Suroor added that, although O'Donohue is still the named rider on Aljabr, another jockey could ride the colt Saturday.

On the scene yesterday at Churchill Downs to supervise the training of his Kentucky Derby candidates, Sheikh Mohammed al Maktoum said he remains content with Godolphin's unsual preparations for the Derby and will not make any changes in the future. He admitted that his Derby quest is a difficult challenge, but will continue to train his candidates for the American classics in Dubai with Saeed bin Suroor and will not point for any traditional American preps. "We do it this way because we train most of our horses there to get them ready for European racing," he said. "We don't want to split up the team. Next year, we will do it the same way. If after four or five times it doesn't work, then we may do it differently." The only potential change, he said, may be that Godolphin will concentrate on its homegrown talent for future Derbies. "I don't know if we'll be buying many American two-year-olds," Sheikh Mohammed said. "We bought some last year because we want to run them on the dirt in Dubai when they are older. I hope in the future that we have enough of our own horses to come back with next year."-

Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and the GIII Golden Rod S. over this track last year, has won six in a row and looms the prohibitive favorite here. She most recently annihilated five others by seven lengths in the GI Ashland at Keeneland and it was only earlier this week the trainer Bob Baffert decided against running her in the Derby. Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) appears more likely to face the boys in the Derby. A decision will be made on the GII Fantasy S. winner by 8:00 this morning. "Its amazing how she didn't handle this track at all last October (when she ran second in the Juvenile Fillies). Now she seems like she loves the track. I think she's coming up to the best race of her life," said Baffert. Marley Vale (Forty Niner) ran the race of her life in the Ashland, setting a fast pace and hanging on for second. The Happy Hopper (El Prado {Ire}) won the Martha Washington S. at Oaklawn three back before posting runner-up finishes in the GIII Honeybee S. Mar. 6 and the Apr. 2 Fantasy.
