FULL FIELD READY FOR DERBY 125 With trainer Bob Baffert opting to send his filly Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) against the colts, a total of 19 three-year-olds will be in the starting gate for today's 125th running of the \$1 million Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs. Of the decision to skip the Kentucky Oaks and run for the roses, Baffert said, "I wanted to see how she trained (Friday) morning. She's been training great and I think she deserves the shot. When she got a favorable post (no. 6) I figured it was fate and that she should run in the Derby. She's one who can take the heat, doesn't mind dirt in her face and is peaking." Baffert also saddles Prime Timber (Sultry Song) and General Challenge (General Meeting) in the Derby. "It's hard to separate these three horses," he said. "General Challenge is probably the most talented of the three and I think Prime Timber is ready to run his best, which he'll need to win. I just hope that when they're turning for home in the Derby I don't have to say to myself, 'I wish I had run Silverbulletday in there.'" Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, hoping for his fourth Derby victory, and his third this decade, goes with Cat Thief (Storm Cat) and Charismatic (Summer Squall). "I wouldn't change a thing," he said. "I know every trainer here will tell you that, but I feel very comfortable." If Charismatic, who ran for a \$62,500 tag in February but captured the GII Coolmore Lexington S. in his last start, gets the Derby win, Lukas said, "It will say two things. One is that my judge of talent is very faulty and number two is it might be the best training job I ever did. He really surprised me. I totally misread this horse." Carl Nafzger, who sent out 1990 Derby hero Unbridled, is showing a lot of confidence in his 1999 runner, Vicar (Wild Again). "I'll tell (jockey Shane Sellers) three things," he said. "Good luck, have fun and see you in the winner's circle." But taking a closer look at the race, Nafzger said, "If the lane is open, we'll be right there. If things go wrong, we're going to get beat. There are a bunch of good horses in there and they're not going to give you any slack."

She just made it look so easy. Champion two-year-old filly Silverbulletday, who bypassed a run in the Kentucky Derby to showcase her immense talent in this easier spot, had won six in a row dating back to last August when she finished out of the money in the GII Del Mar Debutante. The bay filly finished her two-year-old season with decisive wins over this track in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and the GIII Golden Rod S. After three months off, she came back to score easy victories in the Davona Dale S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 20, the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 13 and the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 3. The prohibitive favorite relaxed nicely and settled in behind an easy pace to run sixth in the early going. Without any urging from Gary Stevens, the filly came out on the backstretch and accelerated into striking position, took over with a sweeping move on the turn and had a 2 1/2-length advantage coming into the stretch. Stevens guided her home under a strong hand ride while Dreams Gallore, though never a threat, came on late for the place. "I was really nervous today, more so than I'll be tomorrow," trainer Bob Baffert said. "I was supposed to win this race. If you're 1-9, you'd better win. Now we've got a shot at a Derby double." A record crowd of 101,034, which bet a near-record \$10,339,112, was on hand for the race.

Britain's first Classic of the year, to be run at Newmarket's July course due to ongoing construction work on the Rowley Mile, will be reminiscent of years past with a large field that, as tradition dictates, splits into two groups. In a year where the trials have largely disappointed, it looks to be a very open race and it would be unwise to disregard any participant. Orpen, representing last year's winning owner-trainer combination of Sue Magnier and Aidan O'Brien, will dispute favoritism, having been the subject of highly encouraging reports on his homework. On form alone he has an outstanding chance, having won his debut at Goodwood Aug. 1 and following up in superb style to take the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville Aug. 23. Enrique, winner of the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury, Apr. 17, went into last year's G1 Dewhurst S. after a most impressive five-length win in the Listed Somerville Tattersall S. at the same venue. But probably over the top for the season, he ran creditably, but disappointed many when finishing fourth to Mujahid and Auction House.

Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff), who would have been one of the favorites for last year's Kentucky Derby if he hadn't been injured following a second-place finish in the GII Toyota Blue Grass, looked like he was back on top of his game in his latest. The four-year-old came back after a six-month layoff to take a seven-furlong Keeneland allowance test by a dominant 6 1/2 lengths Apr. 2. **Orville N Wilbur's** (Out of Place) was also on last year's Triple Crown trail after winning the GII San Rafael S., but went off the Derby track when he was fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby. His three-year-old campaign ended prematurely after he ran second in the May 9 GII Illinois Derby, but was disqualified and placed third. He returned from an 11-month absence to post a three-length allowance win at Santa Anita Apr. 8.

Harpia (Danzig), who started her career in France, is undefeated in five U.S. outings. The five-year-old mare broke her maiden by 11 lengths at Gulfstream in March of 1998, pocketed a pair of Aqueduct allowance events, then went to the sidelines for more than eight months. She romped to a six-length victory in a Jan. 9 Gulfstream allowance on her return and added the Feb. 3 GII Shirley Jones H. in her latest start. The consistent **Colonial Minstrel** (Pleasant Colony) has been first or second in eight of nine tries at this distance. The five-year-old gray captured this event last year and came right back to win the GII Shuvee H. at Belmont. Off from October to February, she missed by a head in a Gulfstream allowance Feb. 21 and came home a head in front in the Poinciana Breeders' Cup H. at Hialeah last out Apr. 3.

Ante-post favorite **Moiava (Fr)** will face 21 rivals, the biggest 1000 Guineas field since 1980 when 23 ran. South Africa's most successful jockey **Piere Strydom** will be in to ride **Atlantic Destiny (Ire)**. Strydom only arrived in Britain Tuesday for a month-long spell with the filly's trainer, **Mark Johnston**. Last season, the 33-year-old not only clinched his fourth jockey's championship in South Africa, but also smashed the previous seasonal best of 313 winners, winning 332 races for a winning percentage 23 percent. Johnston said yesterday, "There are a lot of ifs and buts about Atlantic Destiny, but I'm told that if anyone can get the best out of her then **Piere** can. He's sat on her in work today and also watched some videos of her races."

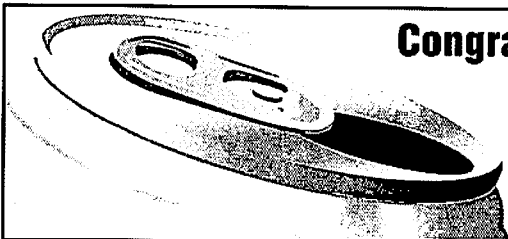
