CHARISMATIC CLAIMS KENTUCKY

DERBY 125 You could have picked him up for \$62,500 out of a claiming race at Santa Anita Feb. 11, but Charismatic (Summer Squall) is worth considerably more after driving to a neck victory in yesterday's 125th running of the GI Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs. Overlooked by most in the crowd of 151,051 (second largest in history), the 31-1 longshot drove from just off the pace under resurgent rider Chris Antley to collar stablemate Cat Thief (Storm Cat) (3rd) at midstretch, then held off the fast-closing Menifee (Harlan). The chestnut, purchased for \$200,000 as a weanling, broke his maiden for a tag in his fourth start, but failed to find the winner's circle in his next three and found himself up for sale once again. "We had been paying the feed bills on him for a while," said winning owner Bob Lewis, who with his wife Beverly celebrated his first Derby victory with Silver Charm in 1997. "Once in a while in this industry you have to cut the bleeding. You have to say, 'hey, maybe this is one we ought to give up on." Luckily for the Lewises, there were no takers. The colt went on to be second by a head in the Mar. 6 GIII El Camino Real Derby and a well-beaten fourth in the Apr. 3 GI Santa Anita Derby, then showed signs of things to come with his win in the Apr. 18 GII Coolmore Lexington S. "This horse has just had a great 60 days," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas, winning his fourth Kentucky Derby. "I probably misread this horse more than any one I've trained and I've trained a lot of them. He's a big grand-looking horse and he carries his weight. So I started experimenting a little bit. I started sending him fast and long. It was a complete change of strategy for me." As it turns out, Lukas said, "He's a big fat horse that wants to run every two weeks." Charismatic will get what he wants, running back in the GI Preakness at Pimlico May 15. GI Toyota Blue Grass winner Menifee, who just missed at 7-1, will be waiting for him. "He was the widest horse in the first turn and (jockey Pat Day) had to wait for room a little bit before he finally got him moving," said trainer Elliott Walden, who watched his Victory Gallop lose in a photo with Real Quiet last year. "He just got beat, but he ran big." Prime Timber (Sultry Song), a rallying fourth, is pointing for the Preakness and trainer Bob Baffert said he is considering Kentucky Oaks champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) for the second leg of the Triple Crown as well.

The third-longest shot in the 19-horse field, Charismatic was given little chance for the upset despite a solid effort in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. Apr. 18. Jockey Chris Antley, who has struggled through substance abuse problems and battled with his weight, was a longshot, too, after spending most of 1998 out of action. But the two were the perfect team yesterday, sitting just off the pace while wide down the backstretch, rallying from the four path to lead the cavalry charge at the sixteenth pole and hanging on to win it by a diminishing neck. "This was a dream...a new beginning for me," said Antley, who captured the '91 Derby with Strike The Gold. "I was in South Carolina over the last eight months trying to get my weight down and I didn't think I could do it. My Dad told me, 'start a new business, do something else with your life. You've accomplished a lot.' But I told him, 'I have a goal and I'll die trying to get there. I will get back.' The first (Derby) was right time, right place. This has a lot more sentimental value, more than anything I've done in my career by far. I had to find the depths of myself to be able to get back." (The Also-Rans, p2)

DERBY DISAPPOINTMENT The performance of 31-1 Charismatic wasn't the only surprise in yesterday's Kentucky Derby. Trainer Bob Baffert probably suffered the day's biggest disappointment. Bidding for his third straight blanket of roses, Baffert saw Prime Timber (Sultry Song) charge hard to the sixteenth pole, only to flatten out in the shadow of the wire to finish fourth. His filly Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) was also gaining in the stretch and finished just a nose behind her barnmate. But Santa Anita Derby hero General Challenge (General Meeting) was bumped hard at the break and was caught in traffic all the way around, running 11th. "We didn't have any luck," Baffert said. "There were just too many horses and so much traffic. I knew we were dead at the first turn. Excellent Meeting ran the best of all my horses. She was dead last and she was coming at the end. General Challenge was being jerked all over the place. We've just got to regroup." Gll Gallery Furniture.com S. winner Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy), the 5-1 second choice behind the 9-2 Baffert entry, has also banged around early and never got untracked, running 14th. "He was traveling like a horse who wasn't handling the track," jockey Chris McCarron said. "He kept bobbling every few strides. He came back cut up around the coronet bands of both hind legs." The Godolphin experiment looked like it might pan out at the quarter pole, as 11-1 Worldly Manner (Riverman) came through to take a short lead, but the colt, with only a Dubai prep under his girth this year, tired in the stretch and ended up seventh. "In the last two furlongs, he just stopped," said trainer Saeed bin Suroor, adding, "We're happy to be here and we'll be back next year." Vicar (Wild Again), well backed at 8-1, was wide all the way and had nothing left when they got to the lane, leading only the 25-1 filly Three Ring (Notebook) home. "I was hung out the whole race," said Vicar's rider, Shane Sellers. "I knew I was in trouble the first time under the wire. I tried to hold him in and save all the ground I could. It just didn't work out."

Twice a winner at Salisbury last season and successful in a Nad al Sheba trial in Dubai, Island Sands led practically all the way to remain unbeaten and give the Godolphin/Saeed bin Suroor/Frankie Dettori combination their second 2000 Guineas winner, following in the hoofprints of 1996 winner Mark of Esteem (Ire). After a fairly even break, Dettori allowed Island Sands to pull into the lead from stablemate Easaar (Machiavellian) and Gold Academy (Royal Academy), but the colt was being stalked on all sides entering the final quarter mile. Mujahid briefly took over 1 1/2 furlongs out, but Island Sands responded to regain the lead. Enrique, at the rear until two furlongs out, began to weave his way through the field and was ridden to challenge inside the final furlong, but was found wanting as the winner stayed on in determined fashion. In the absence of all connections, who were at Churchill Downs, a jubilant jockey Frankie Dettori held sway, saying: "You couldn't fancy him on the bare form of what he had done. I was going to follow Easaar or Auction House (Exbourne), but I let him go on and do his own thing ... eventually Richard (Hills, on Mujahid) came up and popped his head in front of me for a stride. Then, out of the corner of my eye, I could see the Niarchos Family colors and thought 'oh Jesus, Enrique's got a turn of foot, he might get me.' The two horses ran to the line, but my horse showed tremendous courage and he won.

Wild Event ended 1998 with wins in the Nov. 8 GIII River City H. over this course and the Dec. 19 Gll W. L. McKnight H. at Calder, but had been second in his two starts this season. The six-year-old missed by threequarters of a length in the GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. Feb. 6, then came home behind Garbu in the GIII Ft. Lauderdale H. Mar. 13. Turning the tables on that rival this time, the bay sat fourth behind horses down the backstretch, came three wide around the turn and never gave it up down the lane, getting up in the final jump to take a three-way photo. "I thought Garbu would be the one to beat and I didn't want to let him out of my sights," said winning jockey Shane Sellers. "We had a real good trip. I waited to make my move... when we got (to the lead), Hawksley Hill came at us and we put him away. This horse ran a great race."

In the biggest field since Quick As Lightning beat 22 rivals in 1980, Moiava (Bering {GB}) will bid to become Criquette Head's fourth winner of the race. She was successful last year in two of her three starts, most notably when impressing in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte Oct. 30. The filly missed her intended reappearance in the Listed Prix Imprudence at Maisons-Laffitte Apr. 9, but has been working well. Sunspangled (Caerleon) merits respect based on her win in the G1 Meon Vally Stud Fillies Mile at Ascot Sept. 27 and hails from the powerful Aidan O'Brien stable. She has also been impressing on the home gallops. Wannabe Grand (Danehill) progressed from winning the Listed Empress S. at this course June 27 to win the G2 Cherry Hinton S., beating Pescara (Common Grounds {GB}), at the same course July 7. She then finished second to the unfortunate Bint Allayl in the G2 Lowther S. at York Aug. 20 and rounded off her season with victory in the G1 Shadwell Stud Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket Sept. 29, with Imperial Beauty (Imperial Ballet {Ire}) second. Wannabe Grand has the class to figure, but there's a question mark about her stamina.

On a Classic weekend both sides of the Atlantic, this race is still a mouthwatering event, with four of last year's leading European three-year-olds returning to the racetrack. Sagamix (Linamix {Fr}), hero of last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, lays his unbeaten record on the line. In his Arc trial, the G2 Prix Niel, Sagamix defeated both Croco Rouge (Rainbow Quest) and Dream Well (Sadler's Wells). Croco Rouge, winner of the G1 Prix Lupin and G2 Prix Greffulhe and second in the G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby), was considered unlucky not to finish closer than fourth in the Arc after being given an injudicious ride by Sylvain Guillot. Thierry Jarnet gets the mount in his new role as retained jockey to owner Wafic Said. The colt may just display too much speed for his rivals over a trip 1 1/2 furlongs shorter than the Arc. Dream Well, winner of the G1 Prix du Jockey Club and G1 Irish Derby, was eighth in the Arc as his form tailed off slightly towards the end of last season, but is reportedly back to near his very best. Leggera (Sadler's Wells), caught in the dying strides of the Arc after taking the G1 Prix Vermeille, will only run if conditions are soft enough.
