CIGAR ARRIVES AT KENTUCKY HORSE PARK

Two-time Horse of the Year Cigar was welcomed by a crowd of 200 people as he arrived Sunday afternoon at Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington, Ky. According to the Daily Dispatch, Cigar seemed to enjoy his new surroundings, pawing the ground and taking a roll in the grass. "He's been comfortable since the very first minute," the park's executive director John Nicholson told the Daily Dispatch. David Dunnet, an official with the Italian-based insurer Assicurazioni Generali, said, "(We) are confident that this arrangement with the Kentucky Horse Park satisfies the best interests of everyone concerned with Cigar's welfare." The nine-year-old horse will be presented in the Park's daily Hall of Champions show three times each day.

DERBY TELECAST OVERNIGHT RATINGS IN

ABC's Telecast of the 125th Kentucky Derby earned a 6.6 overnight rating and an 18 share, compared to a 6.7 rating and a 17 share in 1998, according to information released by ABC Sports yesterday. Final ratings will be released later this week.

TAMPA BAY MEET ENDS ON HIGH NOTE Tampa Bay Downs ended its record 1999 meeting Sunday, May 2. Total handle for the 91-day season was a record \$143,306,996--up 32.44 percent from the 1998 figure. Total on-track handle was \$24,884,966--an increase of 5.68 percent from the 1998 figure of \$23,547,631. A total of 310,289 racing fans passed through the turnstiles, up 2.53 from last year. "The quality of our racing continues to improve this year, and along with the success of our turf track, has made Tampa Bay Downs a more important factor in the Thoroughbred racing world," said John Grady, Tampa vice president and general manager. T. D. Houghton was the meet's top rider and Kathleen O'Connell was the leading trainer. D & H Stable was leading owner. Live racing returns to Tampa Bay Downs Dec. 18.

"I'm just too big," said Cooper, who has grown to 5' 10" tall since he began riding on his 16th birthday at Yakima Meadows. "There just wasn't any more weight that I could lose. I had wrung the sponge dry." Cooper was an ever-present force in the Emerald Downs jockey standings, finishing in the top five for the last three years and second last year. He ends his career with 449 victories from 3,879 starts and earnings of \$3,327,823.



A matter of a few feet made an immense difference to the connections of the three colts which flashed across the Kentucky Derby finish separated by only the length of their necks. But for Storm Bird the exact finishing order didn't matter, simply because every one of the first three finishers is a male line descendant of Ashford Stud's 21-year-old son of Northern Dancer. Charismatic is a grandson, sired by Summer Squall; Menifee is a great-grandson, sired by Storm Cat's son Harlan; and Cat Thief is another grandson, sired by Storm Cat. Obviously this was the best possible result for Storm Bird, whose own runners in the Derby have included Summer Squall, runner-up to Unbridled in 1990 before taking the Preakness, and Personal Hope, fourth in 1993. It was Storm Bird's daughter Line of Thunder who produced Thunder Gulch, the winner of the 1995 Derby.

An analysis of Storm Bird's stud career highlights the affinity he has established with mares by stallions from the Bold Ruler line. This became clear very early on, thanks to the first-crop graded stakes success achieved by Storm Cat and the English-trained Storm Star--both of them out of daughters of Secretariat. This first crop also included Acushla (Ire), a leading Irish sprinter produced by a daughter of Bold Ruler. This trio was more than enough to convince breeders that a 'nick' exists between Storm Bird and the Bold Ruler line, especially

the Secretariat branch. As a result, virtually one in every 12 of the first 600 foals sired by Storm Bird is out of a Secretariat mare. The 70 Storm Birds out of Secretariat mares are headed by Storm Cat and Summer Squall, the two main links between Storm Bird and his Kentucky Derby threesome. Another bred to this pattern is Mujadil, a fast two-year-old who lost his form because of back problems. Based in Ireland, he is now doing very well for an inexpensive stallion.

Of course it is appropriate that Secretariat's name should appear in the pedigrees of the three main contenders last Saturday. It is now 26 years since he set off down the road to Triple Crown glory with his last-to-first effort in the Kentucky Derby which knocked three-fifths of a second off the existing record. That record of 1:59 2/5 still stands and so too, but for Secretariat, would the previous record of 2:00 which belonged to none other than Northern Dancer, the sire of Storm Bird. Although Charismatic's time at Churchill Downs wasn't fast, he only just missed the Keeneland track record for 8½ furlongs when he finally displayed his true ability in the GII Coolmore Lexington S.

Charismatic's pedigree also contained some pointers to his chance on the big day. He is inbred 4 x 4 to Somethingroyal, the dam of Secretariat, and 4 x 4 to Bold Ruler, the sire of Secretariat. Bold Ruler could finish only fourth in Iron Liege's Derby before taking his revenge in the Preakness, but he went on to exert a major influence on the Run For The Roses. Although Secretariat was his only direct winner, Bold Ruler went into the record books as the paternal grandsire of Dust Commander (Bold Commander), Foolish Pleasure (What A Pleasure), Bold Forbes (Irish Castle), Spectacular Bid (Bold Bidder) and Cannonade (Bold Bidder). Another of Bold Ruler's grandsons, Bold Reasoning, supplied Seattle Slew, who in turn sired Swale. It is What A Pleasure--sire of Charismatic's second dam Polynesian Charm--who provides the second line to Bold Ruler in the colt's pedigree.

Louis Quatorze (Sovereign Dancer), the 1996 Preakness winner, is inbred 3 \times 4 to Bold Ruler and A.P. Indy (Seattle Slew), the 1992 Belmont Stakes hero, is inbred 4 \times 3, so Bold Ruler has now completed another Triple Crown of sorts.
