EVENT OF THE YEAR RETIRED Event of the Year (Seattle Slew--Classic Event {Mr. Prospector}) has been retired from racing after suffering a knee injury in Saturday's GII Mervyn LeRoy H . The four-year-old won the 1998 Gll Jim Beam and the 1999 Gll Strub S. and raced second in this year's GI Santa Anita H. After stumbling at the start of Saturday's race, the colt aggravated his right front ankle. X-rays also revealed slight damage to the left knee. Event of the Year was one of the favorites for last year's Kentucky Derby before a fractured right knee forced him to miss the race. "It simply makes no sense to take any chances with him," said trainer Richard Mandella. "He came back and showed what a good horse he is. It's a big blow to lose him, but he has every right to be a good sire." The Golden Eagle Farm colorbearer retires with five wins in nine starts and earnings of \$1,095,200.

PRIME TIMBER OUT OF PREAKNESS Trainer Bob Baffert has decided to keep Kentucky Derby fourth-place finisher Prime Timber (Sultry Song) out of the May 15 GI Preakness S, according to a report on *The Blood Horse* on-line. "Prime Timber is a light horse," Baffert told *Blood Horse*. "He came out of the Derby pretty tired. I don't want to run unless I feel I can win it, and he's telling me he needs more time." Baffert may still be represented in the Preakness by champion filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who will be cross-entered in the GII Black-Eyed Susan.

The Fly, fresh from a hurdling stint this winter, chased home Raise A Prince in a conditions event at Nottingham Apr. 19 on his only flat start this year and has the class to trouble Sadian. The consistent handicapper Rokeby Bowl will hope to make the progression to Group company and the prevalent track condition will certainly suit although the trip may expose any stamina limitations. Secret Saver is another worth consideration having finished a close fifth to Generous Rosi in the G3 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown Apr. 24.

Churchill Reports First Quarter Results:

Churchill Downs Inc. (Nasdaq: CHDN) reported results for the first quarter ended Mar. 31, 1999 yesterday. The company reported a net loss for the first quarter of \$3,010,136 compared with a net loss of \$1,569,031 in 1998. The company has historically lost money during the first quarter because of the absence of live racing at any of its operations. The loss increased this year due to the addition of Ellis Park, which the company acquired last April. Churchill President and CEO Tom Meeker said that the company had anticipated the losses during the period and also commented, "During the next three quarters, the Company's new racetracks are expected to generate net profit as they run their live meets, which will add to the profitability of the Company. One of those racetracks will be Calder Race Course, a purchase completed in April."

On the NTRA Front:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association will make a payment of \$500,000 to participants in the inaugural year of its sponsorship program. More than 50 NTRA member tracks took part in the program geared to help the NTRA's branding effort and to provide NTRA sponsors with an on-site presence at tracks throughout the country. "It's gratifying to the NTRA that these members took such a strong interest in helping us to launch our brand and to promote the NTRA and its sponsors," said Basil DeVito, Jr., NTRA senior vice president of television and sponsorship.

The NTRA also announced yesterday that it has reached an agreement for a series of 15 half-hour shows to be telecast on ESPN Classic in the next year. The shows will highlight some of Thoroughbred racing's marquee events and will air in the days leading up to the annual renewals of the featured race. "We are excited about forming a relationship with this new network," said NTRA Commissioner Tim Smith. "This programming is consistent with our strategic plan and will help sports fans get a sense of the history of some of racing's most storied events." ESPN Classic is currently available in 18 million homes nationally and is expected to more than double in the next 18 months.
