VALHOL DQ'D FROM ARKANSAS DERBY Arkansas state stewards ruled Wednesday to disqualify Arkansas Derby first-place finisher Valhol (Diazo) and to suspend jockey Billy Patin for the remainder of the year for carrying an illegal electrical device during the running of the Apr. 10 Grade II race. Patin plans to appeal the suspension and the \$2,500 fine. A videotape of the Arkansas Derby shows a black item falling from Patin's hand shortly after Valhol's upset victory. The jockey suggested the object was a rubber band. After the ruling, Certain (Out of Place) was declared the new winner of the race. The purse will be redistributed. The stewards recommended the state racing commission extend Patin's suspension through May 5, 2004. Valhol's owner James Jackson defended the jockey. "I just don't think they had enough evidence to prove anything," Jackson said Wednesday. "Most everything they had was circumstantial, it's assumption." Steward Leland Seba countered, "The picture is worth a thousand words. The tape pretty much speaks for itself." The disqualification will jeopardize Valhol's participation in the May 15 GI Preakness. The colt's bankroll is the smallest of the 16 three-year-olds currently pointing for the second leg of the Triple Crown. There would have to be two defections between now and entry time Wednesday for Valhol to be a part of the field, which is limited to 14. Pimlico Vice President of Racing Lenny Hale confirmed yesterday that the \$300,000 from the Arkansas Derby will not be recognized by track officials for determing Preakness eligibility. "The Maryland Racing Commission and Arkansas Racing Commission are conferring, but even if there is an appeal of the Arkansas decision, it is very doubtful the matter could be resolved between now and entry time," Hale said. Jackson won an earlier round in court, which got Valhol into the field for the Kentucky Derby. That step, however, was taken before the Arkansas Racing Commission officially disqualified his horse. But Jackson's attorney, Bill Rambicure, said he will take his case back to the courts. "We're in the process of evaluating the situation and deciding what legal action to take, Rambicure said. "The first order of business will probably be to appeal the decision of Oaklawn's stewards to the Arkansas Racing Commission. We'll try to get a sense of timing as to when they will hear the appeal as it relates to when the Preakness is run. From there, we'll consider what additional steps should be taken."

CHURCHILL DOWNS BUYS HOLLYWOOD

PARK Churchill Downs Incorporated and Hollywood Park Inc. yesterday announced they have signed an agreement whereby Churchill Downs would purchase Hollywood Park Race Track, Hollywood Park Casino and the majority of the surrounding property, all located in Inglewood, California. The purchase price has been set at \$140 million. Hollywood Park will be granted a longterm lease on the Casino, at a rate of \$3 million per year. The deal is subject to the approval of the California Horse Racing Board and several other regulatory agencies. "Based on the Hollywood Park Race Track's most recent results and the positive impact of recent legislation that has reduced the pari-mutuel tax and has expanded the simulcasting opportunities at California's tracks, we expect this acquisition, when completed, to contribute positively to our earnings in the first full year after closing," Thomas Meeker, Churchill Downs' president and chief executive officer, said. R.D. Hubbard, chairman of the board and chief executive officer of Hollywood Park, said, "This transaction is a major step toward the attainment of our corporate objective of focusing on the growth of our gaming business."

SHAREEF DANCER EUTHANIZED Shareef Dancer (Northern Dancer), winner of the 1983 Irish Derby, had to be euthanized at Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum's Dalham Hall Stud near Newmarket, England yesterday after breaking his right hind leg when dismounting from covering a mare. "Unfortunately the leg was damaged beyond repair and we had to put him down," said Dalham Hall Manager Liam O'Rourke. "But he had good innings at stud and did very well." Among the 30 individual Group or Listed winners which the 19year-old sired during his career were the dual Oaks winner Possessive Dancer (GB), G1SW Glory Of Dancer (GB), MGSW Rock Hopper (GB), G2 German 1000 Guineas winner Kazoo (GB) and MGSW Colorado Dancer (Ire). He was also an influential broodmare sire, being responsible for the Group 2 winner Shaima, dam of the multiple Group 1 winner Shantou, and Saffaanh, the dam of English 1000 Guineas winner Harayir. MID-ATLANTIC TRACKS DISPUTE NTRA/TVG ALLIANCE The Mid-Atlantic region of the Thoroughbred Racing Associations met yesterday and officially expressed their objections to the National Thoroughbred Racing Association's plan to become a national wagering hub on behalf of the Television Games Network. In a letter to NTRA head Tim Smith, the Mid-Atlantic tracks, who are part of TVG's competitor The Racing Network, called the NTRA's actions "ill-advised and inappropriate and a threat to the viability of the racing industry in our states." The Mid-Atlantic tracks contend that, "The details of the TVG partnership have been reviewed only by representatives of five or six large tracks and this venture is now being forced down the throat of the rest of the industry." Of particular note is the account wagering revenue that some tracks, including Philadelphia Park and Penn National, would lose due to exclusivity deals signed by larger tracks with TVG. The letter called the dispute a "dire situation for the future of the NTRA and this industry." In response to the letter, Smith said, "I don't consider it a threat to secede. I'm comfortable that we'll answer most, if not all, of their questions and I think we're making considerable progress (toward a solution)." Smith also stated that, contrary to what has been reported, the NTRA did not make an official decision regarding the creation of the wagering hub at its last meeting. Smith also explained that the NTRA's relationship with TVG does not mean that a relationship with The Racing Network is out of the question. "TVG is a fundamentally different proposition than The Racing Network. It's a \$200 million proposition over four years to get racing into 20-30 million homes." That investment comes from cable and media giants TCI and FOX. "It is unfortunate that there are some near-term competitive ramifications for some who are in the telephone account wagering business," added Smith, who believes that the entire industry will benefit in the long run from the new fans brought in by TVG. "While I want to be responsive to the Mid-Atlantic tracks, I also want to be responsive to the industry as a whole," he said.

"He'll be back probably in the middle of the summer and we'll probably head him toward the (GI) Super Derby at Louisiana Downs."

Philly Park Racing Secretary Resigns:

Jim Beem, the director of racing and racing secretary for Philadelphia Park for the past four years, has resigned to pursue opportunities outside the racing industry. Beem's resignation is effective May 15. Nick Black, the track's assistant racing secretary, will serve as acting Secretary until a successor is named.

Florida Official Under Fire:

Cynthia Henderson, appointed the Secretary of Business and Professional Regulations in January by newly elected governor Jeb Bush, is having a hard time explaining who paid for her tickets to this year's Kentucky Derby. The Secretary of Business and Professional Regulations oversees the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering; a permit for Churchill Downs to run Florida's Calder Race Course is pending before Henderson's agency. One of Governor Bush's promises was to tighten ethical standards, including the requirement that all gifts in excess of \$25 be publicly disclosed. Henderson first said she paid for the tickets, which are valued between \$120 and \$175. Churchill Downs said the company had no receipt for Henderson's tickets. When asked again for receipts, Henderson changed her story and said a friend paid for them. But Bush is backing his appointee. "This may be a gray area," he told Associated Press, "but the fact is she didn't take a gift. She didn't accept a gift from someone she is regulating. She's doing a darn good job."

#### Record Derby-Doncaster Day in 2000:

The Australian Jockey Club's flagship Derby-Doncaster meeting at Randwick will triple its prize money to AUS\$8 million (US\$5,170,297) starting next year. The increase, which will make it the richest race day in the Southern Hemisphere, was made possible by a five-year agreement between Philippine-based brewing giant San Miguel and William Inglis & Son. Included on Doncaster-Derby day will be a AUS\$1 million (\$646,287) entry-free race over 6.5 furlongs for two-year-olds who are graduates of any William Inglis yearling sale. It is widely expected the Derby will be worth AUS\$2.5 million (\$1,615,718) and the Doncaster AUS\$2 million (\$1,292,574).

#### Jezabeel to Japan Cup?

Trainer Brian Jenkins reported 1998 Melbourne Cup winner Jezabeel (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) is back in training and may be pointed towards the Japan Cup next November, although the mare is likely to be bred to Danehill early in the new season. "I wouldn't really want to set her for another hard 3200-meter (16f) race like the Melbourne Cup if she is going to be in foal," Jenkins told New Zealand Press Association. "I think her efforts this season showed she is up to top weight-for-age company and a fast-run weight-for-age 2400-meter (12f) race--like the Japan Cup--would seem her ideal aim."

#### Australian Sponsorship First:

In an Australian first, the filly Inaflury (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) has been sponsored by staff recruitment companies Temporarily Yours and Permanently Yours. Racing rules mean Inaflury cannot advertise her sponsor during races, but she will wear a rug bearing their name everywhere but in the mounting yard. Inaflury, who has not raced since winning the G1 Thousand Guineas at Caulfield last spring, will resume in the G1 Goodwood H. at Morphettville May 15.

Leading Sydney apprentice jockey Jackson Morris tossed away a junior premiership title after being suspended for three months for threatening a barrier attendant at Randwick Wednesday. The incident occurred in the wake of Morris' one-month suspension for improper action after he controversially ordered a barrier attendant to drastically shorten his mount's rings in a move that stewards and trainer Pat Webster believed cost the horse any chance of winning his Apr. 25 race. Chief Steward Ray Murrihy labeled Morris' threatening behaviour "appalling."

#### Australian Trainer Theo Green Dies:

Former Randwick trainer Theo Green died Tuesday in Sydney, Australia. He was 73. Green won the 1984 G1 Golden Slipper with Inspired (Aus). Known as the grand master of apprentices, he counted jockeys Darren Beadman, Ron Quinton and Malcolm Johnston among his proteges. "He taught us more than just getting on a horse and going, he taught us about life. He taught us manners. They broke the mould when they made the boss," said Beadman.
