STEVENS TO SHIFT TACK TO ENGLAND

Jockey Gary Stevens will begin riding full-time in England within the next few weeks, the Eclipse Award-winning rider announced yesterday. Stevens was lured overseas by British trainer Michael Stoute, who has offered him the position of stable jockey. Stevens will remain in England until early November, when the flat season concludes there. He has contracted to ride for one year but discussions are underway to extend the contract for an additional two years. The Hall of Fame rider could leave for Europe after the June 5 Belmont S. or at the end of this month if Stoute needs him to ride in the Vodafone Derby the same day. "This is the chance of a lifetime," Stevens, reached at Pimlico, said yesterday. "I've ridden for great horsemen all over the world and I feel this is another great opportunity to learn more and ride for one of the best. Money has nothing to do with it. People ask me why I'd leave now when everything is going so well and I'm at the pinnacle of my career. I believe that's exactly the time to do something like this, not when I'm slowing down." Stevens, 36, a three-time Kentucky Derby winner, has been among the top 10 jockeys in America every year since 1985. He has also ridden winners in Japan, Hong Kong, Britain and Dubai, but his latest stint in the Far East was cut short last December when he returned home early for personal reasons relating to problems with his British-born wife Nikki's residential status. His wife hasn't been back to England in four years. "This is a chance to go home for her," he said. "You only live once and I want to enjoy my life. This is my way of enjoying it." Stevens has received permission from Stoute to return to the States for important races, and he hopes to be able to continue to ride such stars as Real Quiet and Silverbulletday.

The handsome grey returns to the site of his narrow defeat in the '97 Preakness. A deep field including five graded-stakes winners is set for the 42nd running of the Illinois Derby. Yankee Victor (Saint Ballado) exits a game second to Charismatic in the 1 1/16-mile GII Coolmore Lexington S. and will attempt to carry his speed for nine furlongs. Certain (Out of Place), declared winner of the GII Arkansas Derby, skipped the festivities in Louisville but has been working well over the Churchill strip. Epic Honor (Honor Grades) also exits the Coolmore Lexington, finishing a good fourth. In his first race outside of California, the colt ran a distant third to Stephen Got Even in the Mar. 27 GII Gallery Furniture.com S. Previously, Epic Honor won the Jan. 16 GIII Golden Gate Derby in the slop.

DOFF THE DERBY DEAD AT 18 Doff The Derby (Master Derby), one of the top broodmares of the decade, was put down at Coolmore Stud in Ireland Wednesday as the result of severe laminitis. She was 18 years old. Her colt foal by Entrepreneur (Ire), who was conceived June 20, has been saved. Doff The Derby is best known as the dam of 1991 Derby winner Generous (Ire) (Caerleon), but will also be remembered for her son Padua's Pride (Ire) (Caerleon), an unraced two-year-old in training with Dermot Weld who realized a European foal record price of 2.5 million guineas (\$4.2 million) when bought by Satish Sanan at Tattersalls in 1997. She produced four other black-type performers: Windy Triple K (Jaklin Klugman), who raced in the United States; Wedding Bouquet (Ire) (King's Lake), winner of the G3 C.L. Weld Park S. at Phoenix Park in Ireland; Osumi Tycoon (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), who scored at the Listed level in Japan; and Strawberry Roan (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who won the Derrinstown Stud Guineas Trial and was runner-up in the 1997 Irish 1000 Guineas. Doff The Derby was due to be sold at the Tattersalls December Sales last year to dissolve her partnership, with principal owners Barronstown Stud and John Magnier's Ron Con keen to buy out the Australasian companies that had a minority interest, but was withdrawn at the 11th hour due to legal action.

EVENT OF THE YEAR RETIRED? MABEE NOT...

Event of the Year (Seattle Slew), who was said to be headed toward retirement earlier in the week after suffering a knee injury in last Saturday's GII Mervyn LeRoy H., has not necessarily seen his last race. While the colt has been taken out of training, a second set of X-rays of his left knee will be taken next week, according to owner Betty Mabee. Until then, the four-year-old, a winner of the GII Jim Beam S. last year and this year's Strub S. will remain at trainer Richard Mandella's barn to undergo further evaluation.

SHEIKH ALBADOU SUCCUMBS TO HEART

ATTACK Sheikh Albadou (GB) (Green Desert), a rare winner for Britain in the Breeders' Cup when taking the 1991 Sprint, died at Kirtlington Stud in Oxfordshire, England Wednesday after suffering a heart attack when covering a mare. The 11-year-old, whose six career victories yielded \$1.23 million in prize money, was spending his first season at stud in Europe this year, having earlier stood at Sheikh Maktoum bin Rashid al Maktoum's Gainsborough Stud in Kentucky. He had covered 75 of the 90 mares he was due to serve. Originally trained in Newmarket by the late Alex Scott, Sheikh Albadou never ran as a two-year-old, but began his career on a winning note landing a six-furlong contest at Pontefract in April, 1991. He went on to take the G1 Nunthorpe S. over five furlongs at York, but it was his remarkable triumph in the Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs later that season, one of only four successes for Britain in the 105-race history of the competition, that catapulted him into international fame. Starting an outsider at 26-1, Sheikh Albadou collared the 2-5 favorite Housebuster in the stretch to score a three-length victory. The following season, he finished fourth to Thirty SLEWS in the 1992 renewal when it was held in the hotter climes of Gulfstream Park.

 The Derby Trial produced three Derby winners in the '80s as well as last year's hero, High-Rise (Ire), and what is lacking in quantity this year is compensated for in quality. Fantastic Light, second in last September's G2 Royal Lodge S., was a good winner of the G3 Thresher Classic Trial at Sandown Apr. 24 despite the fact his rider nearly threw the race away when mistaking the winning post. Daliapour is prominent in the ante-post betting lists for the Derby after an eight-length win in the Listed Autumn S. at Ascot Oct. 10; he was a comfortable winner of an Epsom conditions event Apr. 21. Lucido must enter calculations based on his defeat of Thursday's highly impressive G3 Dee S. winner Oath (Ire) at Newbury Apr. 17. He was also placed third to Germany's leading juvenile Sumitas (Ger) in the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten last October.

◆ TRIPLE THREATS ◆

Bob Baffert Still on the Fence:

Trainer Bob Baffert will work both Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) and Prime Timber (Sultry Song) Monday at Churchill Downs. One or both could travel to Maryland Wednesday. "(Silverbulletday) is just great," he said. "Right now, I still plan to enter her in both the Black-Eyed Susan and the Preakness. It pretty much depends on where she draws whether she goes in the Preakness. If I don't like the post, she'll go in the other race." Baffert said Wednesday that Prime Timber was out of the second leg of the Triple Crown, but now may change his mind. "The work pretty much will determine whether he comes (to Pimlico) or not," he said.

Vicar Definite for Preakness:

Vicar (Wild Again), 18th in the Kentucky Derby, likely will go on to the Preakness, trainer Carl Nafzger said he had decided yesterday. But a poor post position draw could prompt a change in plans. "We've got to look at our post and see where we are," Nafzger said. "If I get out there in the 14 hole, then I doubt if I will go. That run into the first turn is pretty serious." As for possible Preakness tactics, the trainer said, "We've got to get our rhythm out of the gate. We didn't get that out of the last race and a horse with that much speed, that's his game. Get him out, get in the pace and have a little kick at the end." Vicar will have a new rider for the \$1 million Preakness. His Derby jockey, Shane Sellers, picked up the mount on Kimberlite Pipe (Take Me Out) when Nafzger was leaning toward skipping the second leg of the Triple Crown. "I told Shane that if the horse was not right, we weren't going," Nafzger said. "He was getting calls from other trainers, so I told him if he found something definite he should probably take it." Sellers' replacement has not yet been named.

Delta Downs Sold:

Delta Downs in Vinton, Louisiana is in the process of being sold to an out-of-state partnership. According to *Daily Racing Form*, the partnership consists of Shawn Scott, a Nevadan who owns a hotel and two truck stops in Louisiana; and Jinho Cho of Hawaii, who is in the real estate industry. The purchase price for the 26-year-old Thoroughbred/Quarter Horse track was a reported \$10 million. The Louisiana State Racing Commission has granted its approval of the deal. "The new owners want to continue to make the track more family oriented with appeal to a wider audience," said Kathryn Berwick, president of Delta Downs. "One of their plans is to refurbish and reopen our existing clubhouse that has not been in use for several years." Berwick, president for the past two years, is expected to remain as general manager of the track.
