**COUNTESS DIANA SUFFERS SETBACK The 1997** champion two-year-old filly Countess Diana (Deerhound) is still in training, but suffered a minor splint problem while preparing for her four-year-old debut at Hialeah Park about three weeks ago, according to owner Rick Kaster. The bay, who was treated for a hoof ailment earlier this year, is now galloping for trainer Mary Jo Lohmeier at her Keeneland base. Fivefor-six with a victory in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies during her Eclipse Award-winning season, the Kentucky-bred went 0-for-four last year and has not been out since running sixth in the GI Gazelle H. last Sept. 12. Kaster indicated that his filly could resurface at Saratoga later this summer. A multiple graded-stakes winner in 1997 and '98, Kaster's Richter Scale (Habitony) turned in back-to-back bullet works at Hialeah Apr. 12 and 19 and is about a week away from a return to the races, the owner said. Unraced since a 12th-place finish in last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint, the bay is being pointed for a Churchill allowance spot sometime next week.

### AQUEDUCT MEET CLOSES WITH SOLID

INCREASES Aqueduct concluded a successful winterspring meet Sunday, with increases in both handle and attendance. Daily attendance for the 91-day season averaged 5,560, an increase of 3.9 percent over the 1998 figure of 5,353, while the daily average on-track handle was \$1,638,866, up 2.9 percent over the average of \$1,592,355 in '98. The average total handle rose markedly to \$8,791,614 from \$7,773,149, an increase of 13.1 percent. New York Racing Association President Terry Meyocks said, "Beginning with the Saratoga meet last year, there was a definite upsurge in on-track and total business here in New York. Fortunately, we've been able to raise purses which helps provide better size and quality fields. We have a long way to go, but I think we're on the right path." New York racing shifts to Belmont Park Wednesday, May 12.

Silverbulletday Flies in Final Drill:

Champion filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who may take on the colts for the first time in Saturday's GI Preakness, worked five furlongs in :59 at Churchill Downs yesterday morning. The three-year-old galloped out six furlongs in 1:11 3/5. "I figured after she worked they'd have to put water on the track to cool it down." trainer Bob Baffert said. "It was the kind of work I was looking to get out of her. That's what you want to see coming into the Preakness." Stablemate Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), fifth in the Kentucky Derby, will have her final breeze today. Both fillies are already entered in Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan, with Silverbulletday drawing the inside post and Excellent Meeting drawing post position four for the 1 1/8-mile test. "Fate will decide whether they run (in the Preakness) or not," said Baffert. "We'll wait and see what happens in the draw Wednesday. These are two great fillies and I'm not going to waste an out. I want to run to win." The two head to Maryland Wednesday.

#### Menifee Sharp in Preakness Prep:

Kentucky Derby runner-up Menifee (Harlan) zipped a half mile in :47 at Churchill Monday morning, galloping out the five eighths in :59 3/5. "He's feeling good and we're ready to go," trainer Elliott Walden said. "He worked super and did it on his own." The colt is one of 10 probable Preakness runners who will ship to Pimlico Wednesday.

#### First American Out of Preakness:

Trainer Eduardo Caramori announced yesterday he is withdrawing GII Flamingo S. winner First American (Quiet American) from the second leg of the Triple Crown. "We scoped him after the Derby (where he was 16th) and he did show a little mucous, but we thought we could clear that up without much trouble," Caramori said. "Then yesterday he showed a little heat in an ankle and jogged instead of galloping. He's got a little chip. We don't know how long it's been there. We scoped again and there is still a little bit of mucuos. He needed to work today, but with the two things together we decided to stop on him. Naturally, I'm disappointed, but we have a nice horse with a future. We'll fly him back to Kentucky...then he'll have surgery to remove the chip."

The Godolphin horses appear to be hitting form at just the right time and the filly merits the utmost respect. Mother Of Pearl signed off her unbeaten juvenile campaign with a win in the G3 Prix Saint-Roman at Saint-Cloud Nov. 10. She was pulled out of the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas at the 11th hour and comes to this with a high home reputation.

MONTH After winning three stakes in just 24 hours, John and Betty Mabee of Southern California's Golden Eagle Farm were named Owners of the Month for April by the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association. The streak began when homebred Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) took the Apr. 2 GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn. General Challenge (General Meeting), another Mabee homebred, captured the GI Santa Anita Derby the following afternoon, and just minutes later Sunday Stroll (General Meeting) ran second in the Silky Sullivan S. at Golden Gate Fields, but was awarded the win by a stewards' disqualification. All three were sired by the Mabees 11-year-old stallion, who stands at Golden Eagle near Ramona, California for a fee of \$10,000.

### A Dozen Ladbroke Employees Suspended:

According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, Ladbroke Racing Pennsylvania has suspended 12 employees and launched a "sweeping investigation" at three of its OTB parlors. The newsletter reports that the employees are suspected of past-post ticket punching. which led to \$86,000 in questionable winnings on a single race. The allegation is that the Ladbroke employees were able to place bets for 12 minutes after post time for the ninth race at Hollywood Park May 1 because of an electronic malfunction that was not corrected for more than an hour. Ladbroke at the Meadows Vice President of Operations and HTA Director Mike Jeannot said the track has notified the Pennsylvania Harness Racing Commission and "is continuing to gather the facts and determine the root cause of why this glitch occurred."

Bloodstock agent Patrick Barbe, representing the winning owner, said, "She was not fit when she ran first time out this season. She had come on a lot for the run and we expected this success. She is bred to stay 1 1/2 miles and it looks likely that she will run next in the Epsom Oaks over this trip, rather than in the French equivalent." Ladbrokes have made her the 12-1 co-fourth choice.

So much has already been written about the pedigree of Real Quiet, following his epic wins last year, that I thought it might make a change to look at the background of Saturday's Pimlico Special winner from a European viewpoint. After all, his sire Quiet American began his racing career in England after being bought by Sheikh Mohammed for \$300,000 as a yearling at Fasig-Tipton.

Quiet American made a promising debut when second in a newcomers' race at Goodwood in the September of his two-year-old days, but his trainer, Michael Stoute, seemed to have no great ambitions for him the following spring. Quiet American was sent to a couple of minor meetings, finishing third of 15 in an allowance over 1 1/8 miles before fading into eighth place when tried over 1½ miles in a maiden race. That marked the end of Quiet American's European career.

He was returned to his native U.S., where the switch to dirt produced dramatic improvement and eventually a win in the GI NYRA Mile H.

In importing Quiet American to England, Sheikh Mohammed could not be accused of the conservative approach which has often restricted the range of bloodlines imported from the U.S. to Europe. Why take a chance with a horse with an essentially dirt pedigree, it is argued, when there are safer options with horses with a proven record on turf? Unfortunately, this can lead to a Catch 22 situation where no one will import the progeny of certain stallions until they have proven themselves in Europe, but the stallions can't prove themselves until someone gives them a chance.

Fappiano, the sire of Quiet American, didn't have obvious appeal for European buyers. Not only was he a dirt performer with a dirt pedigree, but he was also bigger than many Europeans like. However, Fappiano started to do so well that Europeans could no longer safely ignore him. He eventually had 27 runners in Britain and Ireland, but his only stakes winner was Defensive Play, who went on to greater achievements in the U.S.

Fappiano's only other Group winner in Europe was Cristofori, a Group 3 scorer in France. This comparative lack of success for the sire has reflected on his stallion sons and there have been very few runners in Britain and Ireland by such as Unbridled, Cryptoclearance and Quiet American. Not that this need worry the connections of these three sons, who have all sired major winners in the States.

Quiet American--the possessor of an intricate pedigree featuring 3x2 inbreeding to Dr Fager and 4x3 to Cequillo--has proved very well suited to the American industry. Although his first four crops averaged only around 30 named foals, three of them have produced Graded winners, with Real Quiet, Hidden Lake and Cara Rafaela all scoring at the highest level and First American earning a shot at the Kentucky Derby.

Real Quiet was only a \$17,000 yearling but his second dam Meadow Blue (by Raise a Native--Gay Hostess) was a sister to three colts which rewrote the record books. The first, Majestic Prince, broke the record price for a yearling when he made \$250,000 in 1967 and he fueled demand for his younger siblings by winning the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S.

Next came Crowned Prince, who increased the yearling record to \$510,000 in 1970 before becoming a champion juvenile in England. In 1975 Elegant Prince raised the mark to \$715,000. No wonder Real Quiet's breeder, Eduardo Gaviria, decided to inbreed to Raise a Native by sending Really Blue to Quiet American.

What is really remarkable about the female line stemming from Real Quiet's third dam Gay Hostess is that it has produced two winners of the Kentucky Derby, plus winners of the French Derby (Caracolero) and the Epsom Derby (Secreto). How many modern families can match that?
