Preakness Drills at Churchill:

Kentucky Derby winner Charismatic (Summer Squall) and stablemate and Derby third-place finisher Cat Thief (Storm Cat) had their final major preps for Saturday's Preakness yesterday at Churchill Downs. Charismatic went five furlongs in 1:01 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:14 3/5. Cat Thief, working in company, was timed in :50 1/5 for a half mile. "They both were well within themselves," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said after the pair worked. "They got just what they needed. It's all they'll need. We're ready to fly out tomorrow on the first flight. We should get into Pimlico in late morning."

Vicar (Wild Again) drilled five furlongs in :59 3/5 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:12. "He worked actually better here than he did for the Derby," said trainer Carl Nafzger. "He's more direct and more focused."

Excellent Meeting (General Meeting) worked five furlongs in :59--the same time turned in by her stablemate Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) in a Monday work. After the move, trainer Bob Baffert commented, "The work showed that the Derby didn't take too much out of her. I saw a filly who looked very good, very sharp. She finished up good, which she always does. She's still on edge, which you like to see." Baffert's Prime Timber (Sultry Song) went four furlongs in :48 and will start in the Sir Barton S. on the Preakness undercard.

Trainer Nick Zito's two Preakness candidates both worked five furlongs yesterday. Stephen Got Even (A. P. Indy) covered the distance in 1:01 4/5. Adonis (Kris S.) went in 1:01 3/5.

Patience Game (Woodman), winner of the GIII Derby Trial, drilled five furlongs in a bullet :58 3/5...Valhol (Diaz) went a half mile in :50...Worldly Manner (Riverman) worked five furlongs in 1:00 2/5 with jockey Jerry Bailey up...Torrid Sand (Line In The Sand) worked a half mile in :48 1/5...Lead em Home (Mr. Leader), winner of Laurel's Ambernash S., went a half mile in :49 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:01, according to trainer Phil Marino.

Silverbulletday's Preakness Status Solidified:

On yesterday's Visa sponsored National Thoroughbred Racing Association Preakness teleconference, Mike Pegram said that "as of now," his GI Kentucky Oaks winner Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) will face the boys in the Preakness. "We have a little bit of an edge that we wouldn't have had in the Derby," said Pegram, referring to the relative ease of the Oaks over the rigors of facing 18 others in the Derby. "Also, when you look at it from a business standpoint, it makes a little more sense." The Oaks was a \$500,000 race, compared with \$200,000 for Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan S., which would be the filly's option if she were to pass on the Preakness. Regarding the Preakness draw, Pegram indicated that the final decision would be left up to trainer Bob Baffert and jockey Gary Stevens.

Musical Jockeys For Preakness:

Jockey Robby Albarado, who was named to ride Badge (Air Forbes Won) in the Preakness, has now decided to take the call aboard GI Florida Derby winner Vicar (Wild Again). Mike Luzzi has picked up the mount aboard GII Gotham winner Badge, according to owner James Venna. Shane Sellers, who rode Vicar in the Kentucky Derby, picked up the mount on Kimberlite Pipe when Vicar was still questionable for the Preakness.

DANESHADEED TOPS BARRETT'S OPENER

Daneshadeed, a daughter of Shadeed--Danish Prospector (Miswaki) topped Monday night's first session of the Barretts May Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training in Pomona, California. Sold as hip number 75, the bay was consigned by Donna M. Wormser, Inc. and was purchased for \$175,000 by John Moynihan, agent. Barretts sold 73 two-year-olds Monday for an aggregate of \$1,741,600 and an average of \$23,858. The median price was \$16,000. Forty one horses were reported as not sold. At last year's opening session, 50 horses sold for \$1,404,000. The average was \$28,080 and the median was \$16,500. The sale concluded last night.

Things Change returns today from a seven-month layoff following knee surgery. The grey filly was last seen finishing a distant second to Confessional (Holy Bull) in the GI Frizette over a sloppy track and has a series of bullet works. Trainer Linda Rice said, "She's 90 percent ready and that's enough to get her into this race." Paved in Gold ships in from Hialeah on a tear since receiving Lasix. The chestnut filly has won the Apr. 24 Jasmine S. and the Mar. 17 Erin Go Bragh S. in wire-to-wire fashion, and seems likely to dictate the early pace. Several lightly raced fillies are stepping up in competition, including former claimer Elektraline. Elektraline comes off two sharp allowance scores at Aqueduct, most recently a seven-length airing Apr. 14.

Golden Snake created a favorable impression with a fast-closing win in the Listed Feilden S. at Newmarket Apr. 15, with subsequent G3 Chester Vase winner Housemaster (later disqualified) third and Yakareem fifth. Mutahaab won the G2 Royal Lodge S. at Ascot in September, but was only fourth behind subsequent 2000 Guineas runner-up Enrique in the G2 Tripleprint Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 17. Glamis won a conditions event at Kempton Apr. 3, but disappointed when finishing third on very soft ground in the G3 Thresher Classic Trial at Sandown Apr. 24.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

With a win over some proven rivals in Saturday's GII Illinois Derby, Vision and Verse joined the ranks of the leading three-year-olds. By Storm Cat out of a Private Account mare, Vision and Verse is bred on the same cross which produced the Grade II winning Sir Cat, who now stands at Gainesway. The cross of Storm Cat over mares from the male line of Private Account's sire Damascus has provided Breeders' Cup Sprint heroine Desert Stormer and stakes winner Ocean Cat (both out of mares by Damascus himself) as well as stakes winner Stormy Krissy. Storm Cat's young son Storm Boot has also already sired Grade II winner Hurricane Bertie out of a Damascus line mare.

Oddly enough, Storm Cat and Damascus don't appear to have much in common from a pedigree standpoint. In a six-cross pedigree of a Storm Cat/Damascus cross the only duplication is Sun Again, who appears in the pedigree of Storm Cat's sire Storm Bird and in the male line of Damascus. In fact Storm Cat has done exceptionally well with mares which give linebreeding to Sun Again or to Sun Again and his three-quarters sister Bourtai (dam of Delta, Levee, Bayou and Banta). Storm Cat stakes winners with Sun Again in the dam include, in addition to Vision and Verse, Sharp Cat, Just A Cat, Stormy Krissy, Forest Wildcat, Desert Stormer, Ocean Cat, Senate Apointee, Sir Cat, Tactical Cat, Sea of Secrets and China Storm. Storm Cat stakes winners with Bourtai in the dam include Storm Broker, Blue Tiger, Stormy Atlantic and Stormin Fever. In fact, linebreeding to Sun Again or to Sun Again/Bourtai is found in almost 24 percent of Storm Cat's stakes winners--a significant percentage compared to opportunity.

If duplicating Sun Again or combining Sun Again and Bourtai works for Storm Cat, then logically speaking, it should also work well for Storm Bird, the source of Sun Again in Storm Cat. Right? Wrong! Storm Bird--other than through Storm Cat--has an abysmal record with Damascus, and does no better with Sun Again or Bourtai in general.

So, what is happening here? The key is probably Crimson Satan, the sire of Storm Cat's second dam, Crimson Saint. Crimson Satan's granddam is inbred 3 x 4 to Saint Mirin (GB), a stallion exported from England to Argentina in the late 1800's. Saint Mirin is three-parts brother to a mare called The Apple, who just happens to be tail female ancestress of Sun Again and Bourtai.

It may seem unlikely that Storm Cat's affinity for Sun Again and Bourtai comes from such a distance source, but further evidence comes from the stud career of Royal Academy, who now stands at Ashford Stud in Kentucky after beginning his career in Ireland. Royal Academy is out of Crimson Saint, and is a half-brother to the dam of Storm Cat. He has had runners out of only two mares carrying Bourtai, and one of those mares (Alidiva {Ire}, who traces to Bourtai in tail-female line) has produced the G1 English 1000 Guineas victress Sleepytime (Ire) and the G1 Sussex S. winner Ali-Royal (Ire) from two matings with Royal Academy. Royal Academy has also sired seven stakes winners - including the group one winners Carmine Lake and Lavery - out of mares carrying the sire Honeyway or his dam Honey Buzzard, again a strike rate far exceeding opportunity. Honey Buzzard goes back in tail female line to the mare St. Alvere, another three-parts sister to Saint Mirin.

It may seem fanciful to attribute significance to inbreeding carried by a mare who appears in the fourth generation of the pedigree of Royal Academy and in the fifth generation of Storm Cat, but the fact remains that Royal Academy and Storm Cat outperform opportunity when given mares carrying strains tracing to some of the three-parts-sisters to Saint Mirin. Clearly Saint Mirin plays a significant part in the make up of Crimson Satan and in turn, Crimson Satan has a major impact on the way in which Royal Academy and Storm Cat work at stud. At the very least we can expect some more major winners by Storm Cat with Damascus, Sun Again and Bourtai strains in their pedigrees.
