CHARISMATIC DRAWS SIX, VICAR OUT With Vicar (Wild Again) out and 7-2 second choice Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) on the fence, the once oversubscribed Preakness could be down to 12 starters by post time Saturday. Trainer Bob Baffert, choosing 13th for Silverbulletday, tried to keep things interesting in the later stages of the draw by using a coin toss to determine whether his filly or Carl Nafzger's Vicar would take the 14th hole. As Baffert flipped the coin, Nafzger called heads and heads it was. But the 13 hole wasn't good enough for Vicar. After yesterday's draw in Baltimore, Maryland, Nafzger explained his decision to scratch the colt. "There is a long season in front of us," he said. "Things don't happen that don't happen for the best. We're not running." Trainer Bob Baffert and owner Mike Pegram had yet to make a decision on Silverbulletday, saying only they would discuss her running status over crab cakes and beer. The champion filly is also entered in Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. Baffert had better luck with his second filly, **Excellent Meeting** (General Meeting). Fifth in the Derby, the filly's connections selected second for her and chose post seven. **Meniffee** (Harlan), a fast-closing second in the Derby, drew post five and was promptly installed the 5-2 favorite. After seeing his two Preakness candidates well-placed, trainer D. Wayne Lukas commented, "We're in the zone. I'm tickled to death--everything's falling into place." In addition to Derby victor **Charismatic** (Summer Squall) drawing post six, Lukas has **Cat Thief** (Storm Cat). The colt, third in the Derby, drew post three and is 8-1 on the morning line. Trainer Nick Zito is scrambling to find a rider for **Stephen Got Even** (A.P. Indy) after receiving word that jockey Chris McCarron broke a bone in his foot during a workout ride Monday.

EVIL HISS TOPS BARRETT'S SESSION Evil Hiss (West by West--Natural Look {Bel Bolide}) brought a final bid of \$125,000 to top Tuesday's final session of the Barretts May Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Pomona, California. Sold as hip number 185, the bay was consigned by Jerry Bailey Sales Agency, agent, and was purchased by David W. and Holly F. Wilson. Barretts sold 80 two-year-olds Tuesday for a total of \$2,344,200. The average was \$29,303 and the median was \$19,000. During the two-day sale, 153 horses sold for \$4,085,800, an average of \$26,705 and a median of \$17,000. A total of 62 horses were reported as not sold. At last year's sale, 168 horses sold for \$4,827,400. The average was \$28,735 with a median of \$20,000.

He probably needs two miles to be seen at his best but, is sure to give a good account of himself. The **Glow-Worm** was second, ahead of **Persian Punch**, in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury Apr. 17, before finishing fifth in the G3 Sagaro S. at Ascot Apr. 28. **Arctic Owl**, making his seasonal reappearance, capped a fine season by winning both the G2 Prix Kergolay and the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket Oct. 3.

Zahrat Dubai blew a hefty hole in the Epsom Oaks picture with a devastating display. Sixth on her only start at two for trainer David Loder, Godolphin's scopey filly simply took her fival rivals, two of which were previous Group winners, apart. Sent off a well-backed 6-5 favorite Zahrat Dubai raced keenly in third for Michael Kinane in the early stages when Barafamy cut out a sedate pace. Bursting out of a pocket at the three-furlong pole, Zahrat Dubai quickly put daylight between herself and her rivals and was five lengths clear of the staying-on Mother Of Pearl. Zahrat Dubai was subsequently promoted to favorite for Epsom at a general price of 2-1. Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford commented, "She's got a lot of talent and was doing her best work at the finish when second to Pescara in our Fillies Trial in Dubai. We're confident she'll get the Oaks trip and she must take all the beating at Epsom. One possible drawback is that she has a slightly nervy temperament but, she should be OK."

The SA Jockey Club had announced Monday that the bonus would remain alive although only nine fillies started in the middle leg, the Australasian Oaks. But when only nine accepted for yesterday's finale, the bonus was put out of Episode's reach. "They dangled the carrot, took it away, dangled it again--it hurts," said trainer David Hall.

Starring Fine Cotton as Himself:

Fine Cotton, the racehorse at the center of Australia's most infamous ring-in scandal, will play himself in an AUS\$4 million (US\$2.6 million) television miniseries to be filmed in Queensland. The bungled horse-switching scheme occurred at Eagle Farm in August of 1984 when open-class sprinter Bold Personality was substituted for Fine Cotton in a novice handicap. Fine Cotton has been purchased by producer John Stainton, who said, "The Fine Cotton story is full of comedy and immortalizes the larrikin nature of Australians. Everything that could go wrong did and the end was unprecedented uproar at the track. Maybe it was the red hair dye on Bold Personality's bay coat, the dripping white paint on his black legs and the fact he didn't look anything like Fine Cotton."

Bear or Bull?

While other jockeys might study their rivals' form between races, leading Sydney jockey Larry Cassidy has been hard at work on the stock market. But the curtain fell on Cassidy yesterday when Thoroughbred Racing Board stewards confiscated the electronic newspaper which he uses to monitor market fluctuations. Jockeys are banned from having mobile telephones and other communication devices on course. "It's another interest away from racing. I've got to do something with my money--it's no good having it in the bank. And I've done all right at it too," he said. At the end of the day, Cassidy had ridden two winners, but said he'd made "three times more" on the stockmarket.

LUKAS BACK ON TOP, LOOKING TO FUTURE

Wayne Lukas will arrive at Pimlico this week with one Kentucky Derby winner, one unofficial title--Trainer of the 90's--and zero to prove. D. Wayne's star blazes brightly again. All hail the trainer of the decade.

Now what was that white-haired fella's name again?

Not that he ever went away, but Lukas had been awful quiet lately. It took just two minutes and change to alter that as he reminded everyone that he is still *the man*. Charismatic crossed the wire first in the Derby and stablemate Cat Thief was a competitive third; both will now come into the Preakness to try and give Lukas an astonishing ninth Classic winner during the decade.

But right now, Lukas is every bit as focused on the years ahead as he is on trying to win the Preakness. While seemingly in the background for a brief spell, Lukas was quietly preparing his operation for the next decade. For him, everything seems ready to fall neatly into place.

"I'll be stronger (next decade)," he said. "I've kept my two top clients in Overbrook Farm and Bob and Beverly Lewis and have added a third one in Satish Sanan. We'll be ever bit as strong. The next 10 years could be real good for us."

It is Sanan and his deep pockets that have Lukas so upbeat. The man who helped solve the Y2K bug, Sanan is on the verge of becoming one of the biggest players ever in the sport and Lukas has him virtually all to himself. According to *The Blood-Horse*, Sanan's Padua Stable led all yearling buyers at North American sales last year, coughing up \$22.42 million for 35 horses. Though Lukas was busy running Padua horses this year, the upcoming crop of two-year-olds will be the first that he hand-picked for Sanan.

"Satish Sanan is taking the Gene Klein approach," Lukas said. "He's given me carte blanche at the sales. If it works out for him like it did for Gene, we're going to be supertough. The only difference is that even Gene didn't make the commitment financially that this guy is making."

He's got Padua and he's hot again after the Kentucky Derby. Not only did he beat up pretty good on his arch-rival (that white-haired guy), but he did so with a flourish, sending a message to potential owners the Lukas barn is still the in-place to be. The 1999 Kentucky Derby could be another turning point in a career that has had its share of turning points.

Even Lukas' demeanor of late has impressed observers. Nick Zito called him "somewhat not grumpy" during the week, while others have remarked on his sudden good nature and calm. There were even rumors circulating that he had undergone some sort of religious transformation, which he denies.

"I was in a good mood because I had to spend two percent of the time I normally have to spend with the media and TV people," he remarked. "It was a relaxing week for me because nobody expected us to do any good. Nobody took the usual pot shots at us that they usually take. They didn't even know we were in the race. The other reason is that I was so pleased with the way my horses were doing, not just my Derby horses but my horses everywhere."

He's got the momentum, he's happy and healthy, he's got free reign with Padua. But does he have the vitality? At age 63, it's a valid question when it comes to discussing Lukas' future. When does the flame burn out or when does he simply get too old?

Not any time soon, he replies. Lukas is trim and fit and seems to be in excellent health. His famous drive to succeed seems as strong as ever. When asked if he'd still be going strong at 73, he replied: "73? Try 93."

"Jeff (Lukas) says that some day I'm going to ride out on a saddle horse, I'll fall off and they'll harrow me into the track," he said. "That's how he thinks I'm finally going to go out."

When Charismatic crossed the wire, it became official. D. Wayne Lukas the trainer of the decade. The new race begins now, and they still have Lukas to beat.
