STEPHEN GOT STEVENS The withdrawl of Silverbulletday leaves jockey Gary Stevens free to ride Stephen Got Even (A. P. Indy) in the Preakness. "I've had luck with Gary in the past," trainer Nick Zito said yesterday. "He rode Halory Hunter for us to win the Blue Grass last year. I'm very grateful that we were able to get him. The post positions (Adonis {Kris S.} in nine and Stephen Got Even in 11) aren't ideal, but I can't do anything about that now."

NAFZGER NOT TAKING ANY CHANCES Although he has said that Vicar (Wild Again) will not start in the Preakness from the 13 hole, trainer Carl Nafzger doesn't plan on officially scratching until Saturday morning. "I'm not wishing anybody any bad luck, but we just will not run from number 13. I learned a long time ago never to try to predict the unpredictable. If we scratch, it won't be until Saturday morning," said Nafzger.

He has always liked soft ground and now we'll have to see about the G1 Ascot Gold Cup June 17."

With the favorite, Sampower Star's stablemate Bold Edge (Beveled) missing the break, it was left to Guinea Hunter (Pips Pride {GB}) and Yorkies Boy to cut out the early running. Things looked ominous when Godolphin's Lujain (Seeking the Gold), winner of the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket last autumn, loomed large on the leaders a quarter mile out. After briefly grabbing the lead, Lujain failed to see out the last furlong in the soft ground and was swamped by Sampower Star and Warningford at the furlong pole. Pushed out by Richard Hughes, Sampower Star was always holding the runner-up in the last 100 yards. Connections have the G2 Tripleprint Temple S. at Sandown, May 31, in mind for his next start.

RISING STARS

CHILUKKI (f, 2, Cherokee Run--Song Of Syria {Damascus})

Offered as hip number 130 at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale Mar. 2, a two-year-old by freshman sire Cherokee Run (Runaway Groom) out of Song Of Syria (Damascus) brought a final bid of \$875,000 to become the highest-priced filly of the sale. Fewer than two months later, that filly, Chilukki (an old Indian word for Cherokee), has taken her first step on the stairway to stardom.

John Adger signed the ticket on behalf of Robert and Janice McNair of Stonerside Stable, and admits to having exceeded his budget.

"We thought she would go for about \$600,000 to \$650,000," Adger said, adding that from \$650,000 to the end of the bidding, it was a duel with super-buyer Demi O'Byrne. "I really had to stretch the wallet for her."

It was a case of love at first sight.

"She was just a nice filly, well made," Adger said.

"But what really impressed me the first time I saw her was there was a truck back in the barn area that was making a lot of noise. The filly never reacted, didn't move a muscle. She was very professional."

Chilukki looked every bit the professional in her morning trials under the tutelage of trainer Bob Baffert, and she ran back to those trials in her debut at Churchill Downs Apr. 28.

After the field of nine two-year-old fillies broke from the gate, it was Chilukki who showed the way, taking her rivals through an opening quarter in :22 and a half over the good going in :44 3/5. Under a confident David Flores, Chilukki skipped her last sixteenth in :06 2/5 and when all was said and done, she had scored a 9 1/4-length victory in :51, two-fifths of a second faster than the track record set 16 years ago.

"As soon as I got to the track, I went back to the barn and she didn't look like she'd run," he commented.

The Beyer Speed Figure assigned to Chilukki, a remarkable 113, is believed to be the highest figure ever earned by a debuting two-year-old. It is as impressive as the 112 earned by Formal Gold in his lifetime bow in 1996 at age three. The filly's "fig" surprised even Andy Bever.

"I'm not even sure that I believe the number," Beyer said, "but if it is legitimate, it would put her in the category of Ruffian."

Another Baffert filly by the name of Silverbulletday broke her maiden at first asking last June 13 at Churchill by a whopping 11 lengths, but earned a speed figure some 27 points inferior to Chilukki.

It will be interesting to see how far she wants to run. Her dosage profile is weighted predominantly towards speed, with an overall dosage index of 5.29.

Chilukki has shown no ill effects from her track-record setting performance. Baffert sent the filly out May 9 for a bullet four panels in a sparkling :46 2/5, fastest on the day by a full second, and two seconds faster than one Silver Charm. According to Baffert, the next start for this rising star could come against the colts in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup at 5 1/2 furlongs May 31.
