MENIFEE IS "THE MAN" IN 124TH

PREAKNESS Menifee (Harlan), a fast-closing second in the Kentucky Derby, is the morning-line favorite for the today's second jewel in the Triple Crown, the \$1 million Preakness at Pimlico. But trainer Bob Baffert, who opted to send Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) for what amounted to an easy workout in yesterday's Gll Black-Eyed Susan instead of tossing her into the Triple Crown fray, is high on his filly Excellent Meeting (General Meeting). "If she gets the trip, I feel confident she can win," he said. "She tipped me off (Friday) morning, the same way Real Quiet tipped me off last year. She looks so good." She would become the first filly to take the Preakness since Nellie Morse did it in 1924, and the fifth overall. Kentucky Derby heroine Winning Colors was the last to try her luck in the race, running third in 1988. Patience Game (Woodman) climbs to the top of the class ladder after breaking his maiden by eight lengths Mar. 27 and capturing the Apr. 24 GIII Derby Trial by 2 1/4 lengths last time out, but his connections are also confident. "We realize this is a big step up, but I think he might be able to handle it," trainer Alex Hassinger Jr. said. "He has shown a lot of composure in his last two races. He didn't get away that well in the Derby Trial and was in tight for a while, but he didn't get upset and settled in nicely."

NONE FASTER THAN SPEEDING "BULLET" IN BLACK-EYED SUSAN Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), who started the streak in the GII Alcibiades at Keeneland last October and added the GI Kentucky Oaks in her latest attempt, flashed to her eighth consecutive stakes victory at Pimlico yesterday afternoon, taking the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in yet another romp. The final margin of victory was two lengths over the game but overmatched Dreams Gallore (Silver Ghost), with another 16 1/2 lengths separating the runner-up from third-placed 72-1 shot Vee Vee Star (Norquestor). But the victory did little to make up for the opportunity that was missed after the filly drew the outside post position in the Preakness and was scratched. "Since Wednesday (draw day) I've felt like somebody kicked me in the stomach," jockey Gary Stevens admitted. "I so much wanted to run this filly in the Preakness. I think when her career is over she is going to be rated right up there with the great ones like Ruffian and Personal Ensign." (Black-Eyed Susan chart, p2)

Unbeaten and virtually unchallenged in her four starts this season, 1998 Eclipse Award winner Silverbulletday was much the best while winning the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks at 1-10 last time out and was off at identical odds to take another. Breaking from the rail over a biased track which had carried speed from gate to wire in seven of the 10 dirt races on the card, the champ cruised along inside The Happy Hopper (El Prado {Ire}) through an easy half, lengthened her stride just a fraction to put 5 1/2 lengths between herself and the field on the far turn and toyed with Kentucky Oaks runnerup Dreams Gallore through the stretch to win her eighth straight stakes. "This is just a great filly," trainer Bob Baffert said. "She's such a pro. She can do anything. Gary (Stevens) let her role out of the gate and she just went with it." As for missing out on a chance to beat the colts in the Preakness, Baffert said, "From the 14 hole she would have had to sustain her run all the way. I don't know if even she could do that. This is like a consolation prize. I know the Black-Eyed Susan is a great race, but we had her ready for the Preakness. But I always put her before me and I always will." As for what's next, the trainer said, "We'll take her to Kentucky now and play it by ear. If Silverbulletday hooks the boys, it'll have to be for a lot of money, like the Haskell at Monmouth for a million."

FHBPA DEFENDS HORSEMEN AFTER COCAINE POSITIVES Trainers Mark Hennig and Todd Pletcher are expected to have their licenses suspended by the Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering after horses they saddled during the Gulfstream meeting tested positive for trace levels of cocaine. But Kent Stirling, executive director of the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association, blasted the decision, saying, "Debbie Miller (director of the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering) is conducting a scorched earth policy. Because Florida is a zero tolerance state, she is fining and suspending licenses left and right. She's destroying peoples lives and chasing owners out of the game because of some trace levels of cocaine. The most sophisticated equipment in the world is being used in horse racing. We've got to have some tolerance levels. And we need some people in the industry who can use some common sense." The level of cocaine involved is believed to be less than 60 nanograms. Stirling said, "It's been explained to me that if you took all the time in 32 years, one second would be the equivalent to one nanogram." Hennig and Pletcher were served papers at Belmont on Thursday, and their hearing was held in Tallahassee yesterday. The state was informed of the cocaine positives near the end of March, but gave the trainers only the one-day notice, leaving them a little more than 24 hours to find a lawyer to represent them in Tallahassee. The hearings were conducted over the telephone. Each defendant was allotted one hour for argument, but Pletcher's hearing, the first, ran over by 20 minutes, so Hennig had only 40 minutes as the state had only reserved a court reporter for two hours. During the hearing New York Racing Association President Terry Meyocks and trainer D. Wayne Lukas vouched for the two, also via telephone, but their endorsements apparently didn't help. It's expected Hennig and Pletcher will appeal any penalties, but their lawyer, David Rominick, didn't return calls. Trainer David Donk was also named in the case, but was out of the country and couldn't be served. Tampa-based trainers Cyndi Smith and Mike LaRocco have already been suspended for the same offense. LaRocca, whose positive was 10 nanograms, sent his split sample to Industrial Labs in Colorado and it came back negative. But by the time he got the split sample back he had already been suspended two weeks. News cont. p5
