EXCELLENT MEETING EASED IN PREAKNESS Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), the lone filly in yesterday's Preakness field, was steadied early, never got into the hunt and was pulled up at the three-eighths pole, but was able to walk back to her barn after the race. "By the time I got halfway down the backside, she had just fallen out of the bridle," said jockey Kent Desormeaux. "She was out of the picture, had no hope...that's when I backed off and tried to save her as best I could." Trainer Bob Baffert added, "Kent said he had no horse going down the backstretch, but I think when he snatched her up on the first turn, she might have displaced (her palate). She's fine back here at the barn. Now we'll just have to regroup."

FAN RUNS ONTO TRACK AT PIMLICO A fan at Pimlico for yesterday's GI Preakness S. ran onto the track during the running of the seventh race on the card, the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. Somehow the riders avoided trampling the man, even after he squared himself and took an awkward swing at Artax (Marquetry), the 4-5 favorite in the race. The patron, who was reportedly 23 years old, apparently climbed the infield fence right in front of a handful of security guards, crossed the turf course and then stood in the middle of the track for about 15 seconds before the field reached him. Yes It's True (Is It True) was on the lead and slipped inside the man without incident, but jockey Jorge Chavez aboard Artax had to swerve to dodge a collision. "He could've been killed, my horse could've broke down, anything could've happened," Chavez said. "Anybody could've been dead. Thank God that didn't happen. The main thing is, it never should have happened. In the future, they need to have more people to be there watching so that no one jumps out like that." Joe DeFrancis, president and CEO of the Maryland Jockey Club, defended his track's security procedures. "We have more than 1,000 security guards at the facility between Baltimore City Police, the National Guard and our own police and private security," DeFrancis said. "We have one guard for every 100 people and that's a high level of security. If someone is crazy and is determined to commit suicide, there's nothing anybody can do about it." Badly bothered by the incident, Artax ran fifth. All bets made on him were refunded, but owner Paraneck Stable still will collect the \$6,000 for the fifth-place finish. Security officers apprehended the fan and he was taken into custody. His name was not immediately released.

### TRAINERS SUSPENDED FOR COCAINE

POSITIVES The Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering has issued orders to suspend the licenses of trainers David Donk, Mark Hennig and Todd Pletcher because of trace levels of cocaine. But Florida neglected to inform other jurisdictions about the rulings. The trace levels (less than 60 nanograms) of cocaine were found in Added Gold (trained by Donk) Mar. 1 at Gulfstream, Baxters Road (trained by Pletcher) Mar. 17 at Hialeah and King's Mate (trained by Hennig) Apr. 1 at Hialeah. New York Racing Association steward Dave Hicks said his track hadn't been informed of the suspension. Kentucky state steward Bernie Hettel said, "I only know what I've read about the suspension, but we haven't been informed by Florida yet." All three trainers will be allowed use of the grounds until the tracks are notified, and all run horses today. Pletcher saddles four and Donk has one going at Belmont Park. Hennig has one entered at Churchill Downs and four at Belmont.

### FASIG-TIPTON MIDLANTIC PREVIEW

WRAP-UP The second session of the Under Tack Show for the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale was held Friday in Maryland. Six twoyear-olds zipped an eighth in :10 3/5 to tie for the fastest furlong at the preview. They were Hip #307, Mystical Dawn, a filly by Crafty Ridan; Hip #308, a filly by In Excess (Ire); Hip #367, Aglimmer, a filly by Cherokee Run; Hip #428, Lil Sydney, a gelding by Lil Fappi; Hip #493, Dunhall Lass, a filly by Peteski; and Hip #583, Timothys Way, a colt by Glitterman. The quickest quarter of :21 4/5 was shared by Hip #346, Gracie's Prospect, a filly by Allen's Prospect; Hip #401, a filly by Pembroke; and Hip #430, a colt by Allen's Prospect. Hip #363, a filly by Tactical Advantage, went three furlongs in :35 to top the works at that distance. The two-day Midlantic Sale starts Monday at 10 a.m.

Winner of the G2 Prix du Rond-Point at Longchamp Oct. 4, Fly To The Stars went on to finish a creditable fifth to Da Hoss in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Churchill Downs Nov. 7. With a sense of deja vu, the fiveyear-old emulated the role of last year's Lockinge winner Cape Cross (Ire), in that he was in the race on merit, but also to ensure a good pace for his more illustrious stablemate, 1998 European Champion Intikhab (Red Ransom). Fly To The Stars set a good pace with 4-7 favorite Intikhab tracking in second, three lengths back, as Jim And Tonic was rated in the rear. Going to the final quarter, the frontrunner still showed the way and he stayed on well all the way to the wire. Jim And Tonic and Almushtarak passed a tiring Intikhab in the final furlong to fill the minor spots. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor had mixed emotions after the race, saying, "It's the same as happened last year with Cape Cross, but Fly To The Stars was not a pacemaker, he ran for himself. I checked the ground before the first race and it was soft. Intikhab is better on good going and he couldn't handle it today. We're disappointed to see him run like that."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

### CHARISMATIC: A POWERFUL PRESENCE

IN PREAKNESS Charismatic (Summer Squall), who stunned the crowd with his 31-1 upset of the Kentucky Derby just two weeks ago, made his presence felt at Pimlico yesterday afternoon, powering to the lead as they straightened into the stretch and drawing off to take the \$1 million GI Preakness by 1 1/2 lengths at odds of 8-1. The former claimer is the third three-yearold in the past three years to win the first two legs of the Triple Crown, and the 28th who can boast that accomplishment overall. He will give owners Bob and Beverly Lewis their second chance at the Crown in three years; their Silver Charm captured the Derby and Preakness in 1997, but missed by a neck in the Belmont S. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas now has won 11 Triple Crown races, including five Preaknesses, but had never before taken the first two jewels with the same horse. "I told the Lewises in April that I wasn't sure (about the Derby and Preakness), but that I thought we had a Belmont Stakes horse," Lukas said. "Now that we've won the first two, the pressure's on me to prove I was right. The hill gets steeper as you go along, but I think this horse has the style and ability to win it." Trainer Elliott Walden, who saddled Victory Gallop to be second in the first two Triple Crown races last year, watched as Menifee (Harlan), the 2-1 favorite after finishing fast to be second in the Derby, came up short in the drive and had to settle for the runner-up spot once again. "My horse had a good trip throughout. He ran extremely well. Charismatic just handed it to us," he admitted. "I really can't make any excuses. It hurts to be second again, but not as bad as if we had only lost by a head." Walden, who spoiled Real Quiet's Triple attempt when Victory Gallop turned the tables in the final jewel, has not decided if he will go on to the June 5 Belmont S. "I have no immediate plans this time for the Belmont," he said. "We'll go home and regroup. It would look funny if I didn't run in the Belmont, because Real Quiet beat (Victory Gallop) pretty good here last year, but this winner won with a little more authority than I really like to see my horse get beat with." Third-place finisher Badge (Air Forbes Won), who closed to miss second by a head at 58-1, will be back in the 1 1/2-mile Belmont. "I don't care what anyone says," trainer Joe Aquilino, a former New York City firefighter, said. "I know this horse can get the distance and I know he has the Belmont on his schedule."

Proving that his Kentucky Derby triumph was no fluke, Charismatic came right back to post an even handier victory in his second Classic attempt. Rated near the back of the pack while racing between horses around the first turn and down the backstretch as Cat Thief (Storm Cat), Kimberlite Pipe (Take Me Out) and Vicar (Wild Again) dueled on the front end, the chestnut Atlas came with a five-wide sweep around the far turn, drifted out under Chris Antley's left-handed whip, then straighened out and strode home a decisive winner. "He showed greatness winning the Derby and today he showed he's progressed from that race," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "He came out of the Derby more aggressive, cockier, with a strut to his step, like he knew he'd done something pretty special. He's getting to the point where he's figuring this game out." She could improve in her second start of the season. Valentine Waltz, previous winner of the G3 Nell Gwyn S. in mid-April, finished a close third to Wince in the 1000 Guineas. Venize, never worse than second in four outings, caused an upset when winning the G3 Prix de la Grotte in her stakes debut Apr. 25. Calando, making her first start of the year here, won the G3 May Hill S. at Doncaster in September and was runner-up in the G1 Fillies Mile at Ascot two weeks later.

This is Italy's first Group 1 race of the season and the locally trained horses will do well to keep the prize at home in what is a truly international affair. The foreign challenge is led by the German-trained Elle Danzig, winner of five Group races last year including the G2 Henkel Rennen (German 1000 Guineas) May 3, the G2 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) June 1 and the G1 Grosser Dallmayr Preis Aug. 2. Central Park represents Godolphin, who are challenging for prizes in six different countries over the weekend. He returns to the scene of his G1 Derby Italiano win last June, bidding to plunder another Group 1 success. Central Park also finished third to Daylami in the G1 Coral Eclipse S. July 4 and won the G2 BMW Europachampionat at Aug. 16. The French are represented by Barbola, who won the Listed Prix Ridgway at Chantilly Sept. 2. He started this season in good style by winning the G3 Prix Exbury at Saint-Cloud Mar. 13 and the G2 Prix Harcourt at Longchamp Apr. 4. Crisos II Monaco, winner of the G2 Italian 2000 Guineas last year, has had a quiet build-up to this with victories in two minor races and would seem to be the best of the home team.
