Lukas Duo To Part Company:

The winner of the first two legs of the Triple Crown, the D. Wayne Lukas trained Charismatic (Summer Squall) is to return today to Churchill Downs where he will train up to the June 5 Belmont S., according to the trainer. Stablemate Cat Thief (Storm Cat), seventh in Saturday's Preakness, is slated to be shipped to California where he will prepare for either the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Aug. 8 or the GI Swaps S. July 18.

Menifee Likely For Belmont:

Menifee (Harlan), runner-up in the Derby and the Preakness, will also return to Louisville and "if he's all right, we'll go," said trainer Elliott Walden yesterday about a trip to the Big Apple. "I felt like he might be the best horse in the Derby and got beat, but yesterday we were second best. What's different this year is that I feel good about going on. Right after we got beat pretty good in the Preakness last year, I wasn't all that anxious to go on to the Belmont," the conditioner added. Should he start in the Belmont, Menifee would be making his eighth appearance on as many tracks.

Adonis, Stephen Got Even Go Home to Belmont:

Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy) a good fourth in the Preakness and sixth-place Adonis (Kris S.) left Baltimore by van early yesterday and joined the rest of their stablemates in the Zito barn at Belmont Park. Zito was particularly pleased with the performance of Stephen Got Even, as was jockey Gary Stevens, who told Zito, "He's got a helluva chance in the Belmont." Preakness Follow Up cont. page 3

Drama preceded France's first Classic of the year as a faulty gate on the stall of Triple Dash (Nashwan) failed to open, resulting in a false start. Sendawar may well have run in the G1 Sagitta 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1, had there been a supplementary stage. Instead, he was re-routed to the Apr. 25 G2 Prix Greffulhe at Longchamp where he finished a fine second. Way of Light (Woodman) set the pace in this heat with Sendawar and Dansili towards the middle of the field and Kingsalsa reserved in the rear. Turning for home, Way of Light still called the tune as Sendawar closed ominously on the outside and he was sent to the lead by Gerald Mosse once inside the final quarter, producing an excellent turn of foot to go clear approching the wire and giving trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre his third winner in the race following Ashkalani (Ire) in 1996 and Daylami (Ire) in 1997. Dansili emerged from the pack to chase Sendawar home, but didn't have the necessary reserves to catch the winner.

Valentine Waltz won the G3 Nell Gwyn S. at Newmarket Apr. 13 and was then a fine third to Wince (GB) in the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas at that same track May 1. Moiava (Bering {GB}) set the tempo with Calando third, Karmifira fifth and Valentine Waltz in seventh. Calando took over inside the final quarter, but Valentine Waltz, briefly in a pocket two furlongs out, was switched wide and quickened in tremendous style from the eighth-marker to win going away. Karmifira followed Valentine Waltz's run but could not contend with the winner's decisive attack. Shenck (Zafonic) ran a superb race and was denied third in the shadows of the wire by Calando. Winning trainer John Gosden said, "Her main quality is her heart, she is the most determined little athlete. She's not a big strong filly, but what she lacks in physical attributes, she makes up for in determination. To win this one today is very special."

Having finished fourth to Almutawakel (GB) on his most recent start in the Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 28, the ultra-consistent globetrotter Central Park was returning to the scene of his G1 Derby Italiano win last May 31. He reports back to his Newmarket base having doubled his G1 tally, and notched Godolphin's second G1 race of the weekend. During a consistent 1998, he chased home Daylami (Ire) and Faithful Son in the G1 Coral Eclipse S. last July, and then succeeded in the G2 BMW Europachampionat at Hoppegarten Aug. 16. Central Park led all the way here and won unchallenged from the German-trained Elle Danzig and the French-trained Barbola, who had a battle royale for the runner-up spot, with the former prevailing. Poseidon (Polar Falcon) fared best for the home side, but couldn't stop the foreign triumvirate from making off with the main prizes.

Lee Ferrell of Bel Air, Maryland, the 22-year-old man who stood on the track during the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. on the Preakness undercard Saturday, was being held on first-degree assault charges, a correction official said yesterday. After being aprehended Satuday, he was taken first for a psychiatric review, but was released from the hospital Saturday night. He is now being held at Baltimore's central booking facility.

New Shooters For Belmont:

While many of the horses that couldn't handle Charismatic in the Derby and Preakness are going home, that hasn't kept a bunch of resident New York horses from considering making a run at the June 5 Belmont S. Illinois Derby winner Vision and Verse (Storm Cat) and third-place finisher Pineaff (Pine Bluff) will head straight into the 1 1/2-mile test, along with the winner of Saturday's Sir Barton S. on the Preakness undercard, Lead Em Home (Mr. Leader). Dermot Weld, the Irish horseman who brought Go and Go (Ire) (Be My Guest) from Ireland to win the 1990 Belmont, has announced that G3 Derrinstown S. winner Port Bayou (Ghazi) will run in the Belmont as well. The GII Peter Pan S., a nine-furlong race run at Belmont Park Sunday, May 23, will be the deciding factor for five other Belmont hopefuls. GII Withers S. runner-up Best of Luck (Broad Brush), Herat S. winner Karly's Harley (Harlan), GII Wood Memorial fifth The Groom Is Red (Runaway Groom) and Derby ninth Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo) will all make decisions based on their performance in the race. Godolphin's other high-priced acquisition, Comeonmom (Jolie's Halo), who wasn't ready for the Derby, will also prep for the Belmont in the Peter Pan.


