"BULLET" TO BELMONT? Trainer Bob Baffert said yesterday that he is "leaving the door open" for a run in the third leg of the Triple Crown with his champion filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy). The Eclipse winner has captured her last eight starts, including the GI Kentucky Oaks two back and this past Friday's GII Black-Eyed Susan S. at Pimlico. "I am convinced that she is the best three-year-old in the land," Baffert commented. "She came out of her last race just great and didn't look like she'd run. I know she can get the mile and a half." Baffert had planned on running the filly in the Preakness, but opted for the Black-Eyed Susan instead after she drew post position 14 against the colts. Regular rider Gary Stevens, who is booked on early favorite Beat All in the Vodafone Epsom Derby on Belmont Stakes day, has reportedly advised Baffert that he would return to the U.S. to pilot Silverbulletday if she runs. Her appearance in the Belmont would set up an interesting battle with the Bob and Beverly Lewisowned Charismatic, who will shoot for the Triple Crown. Baffert trained the Lewis' Silver Charm to victories in the 1997 Kentucky Derby and Preakness before watching the colt finish second in the Belmont. He admitted having mixed feelings about competing against the Lewises in the final jewel in the Crown this year. "I don't want to rain on their parade," he said. Baffert also reported that Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), eased in the Preakness, was okay after the experience. "She scoped clean after the race," he said. "She didn't bleed at all."

Consigned by Eddie Woods, agent, the chestnut was purchased by John Terranova, agent for Team Valor. He had sold for \$30,000 as a yearling at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic October Sale. Treadgold, a colt by Allen's Prospect who is the first foal out of stakes winner May Maloy (Oh Say), attracted the second-highest bid of the day. Consigned by Sharon Maloney, with Litz Bloodstock Services as agent, the bay colt was purchased for \$165,000 by Buzz Chace, agent. The sale concludes today, with bidding beginning at 10 a.m.

PREAKNESS RATINGS DROP The overnight ratings for ABC Sports' telecast of the May 15 Preakness S. were 3.8 with a 10 share, making it the second-most popular sporting event in its time slot. But the Preakness overnights are down 7 percent from last year's figures. The highest-rated show was the NBA game between the San Antonio Spurs and the Minnesota Timberwolves, which earned a 5.3/15 share, down 19.7 percent from 1998 numbers. Ranking third was the GTE Byron Nelson Classic golf tournament on CBS, which earned a 2.5/7. Final national ratings will be available Thursday.

TURF SERIES OFFERS TRAINER BONUS Officials of Churchill Downs, Hawthorne Race Course and Calder Race Course yesterday announced the formation of a series of turf races to be called the "Trainers' Turf Challenge." The Challenge will consist of two divisions, one for three-year-olds and another for three-year-old fillies, with three races in each division. Trainers will earn points based on the finish of their starters in each race, and the trainer who accumulates the most points in each division will receive a \$50,000 bonus. The second-highest point earner will get \$30,000 and the third receives \$20,000. Points are determined by the number of runners in each race--winning in a 10-horse field earns 10 points for first, nine for second, all the way back to one point for finishing last. A trainer may enter different horses in each race and more than one horse per race, but only the top point getter will be counted for the bonus.

Taiki Shuttle and Seeking The Pearl have shown that Japan's trainers are capable of taking American-bred yearlings and turning them into top international performers, and I suspect that Grass Wonder, a Japanese-based son of Silver Hawk, would also be an interesting player on the international scene, given the chance.

Bred by Phillips Racing Partnership and John Phillips, Grass Wonder appeared at Keeneland's 1996 September Sale as part of the Darby Dan consignment and was one of the purchases which made agent Nobuo Tsunoda the most active Japanese buyer of the opening day. The colt has proved a great bargain at \$250,000, developing into Japan's champion two-year-old of 1997 before going on to win the very valuable G1-Jpn Arima Kinen at three and now the G2-Jpn Keio Hai Spring Cup. Interestingly, when Grass Wonder won the G1-Jpn Asahi Hai Sansai S. as a juvenile, his nearest pursuer was Meiner Love, the American-bred who defeated Seeking The Pearl and Taiki Shuttle in the Sprinters' S. last December.

Grass Wonder must also have considerable value as a stallion. He is bred on a pattern similar to the one used by the Phillipses to produce Brian's Time, the tremendously effective Florida Derby winner who numbers Classic winners Narita Brian (Jpn), Mayano Top Gun (Jpn), Sunny Brian (Jpn) and Phalaenopsis (Jpn) among his Japanese offspring. Whereas Brian's Time is by Roberto out of a daughter of Graustark, Grass Wonder is by a son of Roberto and his second dam, Graceful Touch, is by Graustark's brother His Majesty.

Of course, the Darby Dan operation has reaped very rich rewards by combining Roberto with either Graustark or His Majesty. A fine example was Graceful Darby, a multiple Grade III winner, who was the result of Mr. and Mrs. Phillips' decision to send Graceful Touch to Roberto's son Darby Creek Road. This success earned Graceful Touch the right to visit much more expensive stallions, including Danzig in 1988, 1989 and 1990.

Sometimes it is just as well that breeders don't know how successful a mating is going to be, or they would never risk repeating it. Graceful Touch's first visit to Danzig resulted in Ameriflora, a filly who never raced, and the third produced Ana Botafogo, a filly sold to Brazil for only \$80,000 as a yearling. However, the second Danzig foal was Tribulation, a very effective turf performer whose wins included the Gl Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup.

Ameriflora made quick amends for her lack of results as a racehorse, producing Grass Wonder as her second foal and a \$450,000 Woodman colt as her third.

Grass Wonder is just one of several good winners in Japan out of daughters of Danzig. Although Danzig's broodmare daughters have a respectable record, they haven't produced many winners at the very highest level and I think it's fair to say that Danzig has so far proved less effective as a broodmare sire than as a sire or sire of sires. Many breeders have regarded Mr. Prospector's sons as the automatic choice for Danzig mares, but Danzig's daughters have a better record with sons of Roberto, producing Arch (Kris S.), the smart Japanese horse Hagino Real King (Jpn) (Real Shadai) and Grass Wonder (Silver Hawk).

Grass Wonder's fourth dam is Soaring, the celebrated broodmare who also ranks as the fourth dam of Rahy and his half-brother Singspiel (Ire), winner of the 1996 Japan Cup and 1997 Dubai World Cup. Soaring is also the third dam of Devil's Bag, sire of the exceptional Taiki Shuttle, so the links between this family and Japan are very strong. Soaring is also the third dam of Plenty of Grace, Darby Dan's Roberto filly who took the GI Yellow Ribbon S. in 1990. Plenty of Grace is bred along very similar lines to Grass Wonder, her dam Wings of Grace having Graustark and Soaring among her grandparents.

Legislative News:

The Harness Tracks of America newsletter reported on legislative action affecting racing in several states yesterday. Video lottery terminals at racetracks in New Hampshire have been defeated, with the Republican-controlled House voting 233-108 against a plan for as many as 5,000 video slots at the state's four pari-mutuel facilities and then voting 191-145 to bar consideration of the matter again until 2001. Governor Jeanne Shaheen said, "With the vote, the House has taken off the table a revenue option supported by most people in New Hampshire and that provided the least onerous way to meet our school funding obligation." She challenged the House to pick the tax it is willing to increase to fill the possible \$100 million gap.

In Missouri, the House voted 96-60 against horse racing, simulcasting and off-track betting in the state, and also said a proposal for simulcasting without live racing was unacceptable. Voters approved pari-mutuels, including simulcasting, 13 years ago in the state.

The Minnesota House and Senate approved measures legalizing poker for Canterbury Park, with purses the major beneficiary, but a slots bill for the track died in committee.
