FIELD SET FOR NTRA ALL-STAR JOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP A field of 12 jockeys, including four Hall of Famers, will compete in this year's National Thoroughbred Racing Association All-Star Jockey Championship at Lone Star Park in Texas June 25. Hall of Fame members Jerry Bailey, Pat Day, Chris McCarron and Laffit Pincay Jr. will ride against this year's Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Chris Antley, Robby Albarado, Kent Desormeaux, Edgar Prado, Mike Smith, Alex Solis and Shane Sellers, who won the event last year. The final invitation will be extended to Lone Star's leading rider as of June 6. Currently, Corey Lanerie holds a nine-win advantage over Eddie Martin, Jr. in the standings. The 12 jockeys will compete in four races, accumulating 12 points for a win, six for a second, four for a third and three for a fourth, and the rider with the most points at the end of the Championship will earn top prize of \$18,000. One percent of the total handle for the four races in the one-day series will be donated to the The Jockeys' Guild. The Guild will also receive a portion of the proceeds from a memorabilia auction, autograph session, golf tournament and bowl-a-thon. One of the items featured in the auction will be a baseball autographed by the late Joe DiMaggio for Eddie Arcaro. The NTRA All-Star Jockey Championship will be televised tapedelayed on espn2 at 11:30 p.m. EDT June 25.

LIGHTNING STRIKE CANCELS RACING AT PHILLY PARK Racing was called off at Philadelphia Park in Pennsylvania yesterday after the track was struck by lightning during a severe thunderstorm. Roaring Twenties came back after a five-month win- . ter vacation to break her maiden at Aqueduct Apr. 23, then added a Belmont Park allowance victory in her latest attempt going a mile May 12. Jumping into the stakes ranks in search of her third straight, the bay filly sat just off the pace while off the rail down the backstretch, rallied to join the leaders at the top of the lane and opened it up in the final furlong for an impressive triumph. She is now the early favorite for the June 12 Canadian Oaks. "This was an excellent performance considering the racetrack was sloppy," trainer Joe Orseno said. "I talked about this filly last year with Andy (Stronach) and we came up with the plan to get her back for the Oaks. He wanted to turn her out for the winter...she excelled, she grew and she put on weight. It looks like we are going to make the Oaks now." The 9-10 favorite Swingin On Ice, undefeated coming into this race and winner of the Apr. 17 GII Beaumont S. going seven furlongs at Keeneland last time out, was making her two-turn debut. She battled on the front end to the stretch drive, but couldn't hold off the winner. "I think that both the track condition and the distance might have compromised her chances today," said jockey Robby Albarado. Stakes Results cont. p2

Beaten on his seasonal debut when favorite in the G3 Prix d'Hedouville at Longchamp Apr. 29, Public Purse showed the benefits of that race this time, running on in determined fashion to lead home a French 1-2-3 finish. Racing in third, some five lengths off the steady pace, the five-year-old began to find his rhythm in the final 1 1/2 furlongs and quickened into the lead. He came under a strong drive and ran on strongly to deny the fast-finishing, back-to-form Sestino. The winner will point to the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud over this course and distance July 4, whereas the runner-up heads to the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly at Chantilly June 13. Winning jockey Thierry Jarnet enthused, "He is a very courageous, genuine horse and he had come on a lot for his first run this year when he gave a lot of weight away. He will always give you his best."

David Clark Wins Avelino Gomez Award:

Jockey David Clark, winner of two Queen's Plates, a Sovereign Award and more than 1,900 races, has been named the 1999 recipient of the Avelino Gomez Memorial Award. The award is given each year to the rider, Canadian-born, Canadian-raised or a regular on the Canadian circuit for at least five years, who has made significant contributions to the sport of racing. It was named for the popular Canadian jockey who died from injuries suffered in a three-horse spill during the 1980 Canadian Oaks. Clark was also involved in that accident. "I've been associated with a lot of good people over the years," said Clark, 45, who started riding in 1973. "I never really thought I'd be where I am now. I don't know if I deserve this award, but it is really a great honor to receive it."

Illinois Racing Bill Passes House:

According to the Harness Tracks of America newsletter, the omnibus gambling bill which would allow for a riverboat casino in Rosemont, a suburb of Chicago, passed the Illinois State House by a vote of 62-52 Friday, and it is expected to pass the Senate as well. If it does, the bill is projected to generate about \$30 million to be split between Illinois tracks and horsemen, with another \$37 million in tax breaks for the tracks, including a reopened Arlington International.

Only last week, in *TDN*'s European edition, I pointed out that the French phrase "un embarrass de richesses" has always been very appropriate to the Thoroughbred breeding industry. The problem is that most owner/breeders--even those who operate on a very large scale--eventually find themselves having too many fillies or mares and are forced to cull, simply to keep numbers in check. Consequently, there is always a strong possibility of future embarrassment, if one of the rejects flourishes for her new owner.

Maktoum Al Maktoum's Gainsborough operation found itself in this situation last Sunday when Hula Angel swept to victory in the G1 Entenmann's Irish 1000 Guineas. This Woodman filly had been dispatched to Keeneland's 1996 November Breeding Stock Sale in a batch which also included her dam, the Danzig mare Jode. Inevitably, these rejects were generally treated with caution by buyers, the best price being the \$140,000 paid by Koichiro Hayata for Jode. Hula Angel was bought by Glidawn Stud for \$40,000, \$10,000 less than the fee that Woodman commanded at the time of her conception.

Hula Angel has proved to be a shrewd buy, firstly fetching 85,000 Irish guineas (about \$120,000) as a yearling. Then she ended her first season with a victory over Valentine Waltz (Ire) (subsequently successful in the French 1000 Guineas) in the G2 Rockfel S. and has become an even better filly this year.

Buyers will now have to treat with much more respect any mare or weanling which is being culled from Gainsborough Farm, especially as Zummerudd (Ire), a mare who went on to produce the 2000 Guineas winner King of Kings (Ire), was another Gainsborough cast-off at \$36,000 in 1991.

Jode certainly seemed to represent very good value for her Japanese buyer. Her dam, Belle de Jour, had spent much of her broodmare career visiting run-of-the-mill stallions such as Our Hero, One For All, Giacometti, Far Out East, Raise a Cup and Buckaroo, but one of those matings, with Buckaroo, resulted in the splendid Spend A Buck. Rated the joint third-best juvenile colt of his year after winning five of his eight starts, Spend A Buck was named Horse of the Year in 1985, thanks largely to his easy win over Danzig's sons Stephan's Odyssey and Chief's Crown in the Kentucky Derby.

Spend A Buck's exploits earned Belle de Jour the right to visit stallions of a very much higher profile, with a 1988 visit to Danzig resulting in Jode. Although Jode failed to reach her reserve at Keeneland in 1990, she was sold to Mana Al Maktoum, for whom she won a six-furlong maiden on her only appearance in England. Switched to the States, she gained a second success over a mile in an Aqueduct allowance.

Hula Angel's win continues a very good recent run of success for Danzig's broodmare daughters, following Grass Wonder's success in the G2-Jpn Keio Hai Spring Cup and Symboli Indy's victory in the G1-Jpn NKH Mile Cup. Daughters of Danzig have been fairly frequent visitors to Woodman, the best result prior to Hula Angel probably being Holzmeister, a colt rated 114 on the 1996 Experimental Free Handicap.

Woodman's attractions to Jode's owners probably included the fact that his dam Playmate is bred along similar lines to Buckaroo, the sire of Spend A Buck. Both Playmate and Buckaroo were sired by Buckpasser from mares with Swaps blood.

Belle de Jour gained her only win in \$5,000 claiming company; her dam Battle Dress also won in very minor company. Indeed, recent generations of this family could have been described as moderate until Spend A Buck came along, but this female line traces to Helene de Troie (Fr), dam of the legendary *La Troienne.

Godolphin's Adair (Theatrical {Ire}) yesterday re-emerged as a live Vodafone Derby candidate following a morning gallop at Leicester Racecourse. Trainer Bill Mott's former charge, who won his only racecourse start at Belmont last October, had been ante-post favorite for the Epsom classic earlier this year, but drifted in the betting following discouraging reports. He now leaves a dilemma for Godolphin's rider Frankie Dettori, who had been expected to partner last week's Goodwood winner Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold). Simon Crisford, Godolphin's racing manager, said, "Frankie is not committed to either horse at the moment, although the intention is to run both of them in the Derby. I expect riding arrangements will be firmed up in a week's time. What we saw this morning is a colt who is now very much on course for Epsom. Adair worked very nicely...he stays well, handles an undulating track and basically seems to be making the necessary progress just at the right time."
