CHURCHILL TO HOST 2000 BREEDERS'

CUP Officials of Breeders' Cup Limited announced vesterday the selection of Churchill Downs as the host site of the 2000 Breeders' Cup. This marks the fifth time that the Louisville, Kentucky track will host the event, after previously being the site in 1988, 1991, 1994 and 1998. The 2000 Breeders' Cup was scheduled to be held at Santa Anita, but renovations planned by new owner Frank Stronach forced the change. "Churchill's management and staff have done a first-rate job in presenting the Championship on four previous occasions. We also look forward to the same outstanding support we received from the Louisville community, which was a major factor in the success of last year's event," said D. G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Limited. A Breeders' Cup record crowd of 80,452 attended last year's event at Churchill. Van Clief also announced that Breeders' Cup Limited intends to seek an agreement with the New York Racing Association to hold the 2001 Breeders' Cup at Belmont Park. "We would like to conduct the Breeder's Cup at Belmont on the last Saturday in October and in Daylight Savings Time, and NBC's television schedule provides an opening on Oct. 27, 2001," said Van Clief.

SILVERBULLETDAY TO GO IN BELMONT Hours after a lightning fast six-furlong work in 1:10 4/5 at Churchill Tuesday, Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) was "bucking and playing," trainer Bob Baffert told Daily Racing Form yesterday. The work and how she came out of it convinced Baffert that his filly was ready to take on Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Charismatic (Summer Squall) in next Saturday's Belmont S. "We're in. Jerry Bailey's riding. Mark it down," Baffert told DRF. Silverbulletday is booked on a flight from Kentucky to New York scheduled to arrive three days before the race.

THIS DAY IN HISTORY...

The D. Wayne Lukas-trained filly Open Mind (Deputy Minister) followed up her Kentucky Oaks victory with a win in the GI Acorn S. at Belmont Park. Ridden by Angel Cordero, the filly covered the mile in 1:35 2/5 over a sloppy track as the 2-5 favorite.

FIELD OF SIX FOR MASSCAP Kentucky Derby winner Real Quiet (Quiet American) drew post two and NTRA Champions on FOX points leader Behrens (Pleasant Colony) drew post three for their match-up in Saturday's GII Massachusetts H. at Suffolk Downs. The NTRA Champions on FOX race, will also have an international flair, with English invader Running Stag (Cozzene) drawing the rail. "It's going to be another battle and it's another tough race," said trainer Bob Baffert. H. James Bond, trainer of last out GI Oaklawn H. winner Behrens, said, "Any time they put up \$400,000 to the winner, you're going to have to earn it. We'll find out if he's Breeders' Cup material now."

Hennig and Pletcher Granted Stays:

Federal Judge Kimba Wood of the Southern District Court of New York ruled Wednesday that trainers Mark Henniq and Todd Pletcher could go back to work while the appeals of their suspensions in Florida go forward. Florida Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering Director Debbie Miller suspended the two after horses they raced in South Florida came back positive for trace levels of cocaine, but after Wood's ruling, Hennig and Pletcher can continue training and running horses anywhere in the country. Their attorney, David Romanik, who is handling the appeal in Tallahassee said, "Once Judge Wood vacated the summary suspension, it allowed us time to go about getting due process for the trainers in an orderly fashion, and they can go about earning a living." Romanik said he is waiting for split samples to come back from a testing lab in Colorado before applying for the administrative hearing. "It will probably take about 90 days after we apply to get the hearing," according to Romanik.

Microchipping was introduced as a condition of registration for English Thoroughbred foals born on or after Jan. 1 of this year. Hamish Anderson, director of the Stud Book and Breeding Information Department at Weatherbys, said yesterday, "Microchipping will significantly aid the easy identification of the racehorse throughout its career, reducing mistaken identity and interchange cases which will further improve the security and integrity of racing."
