MR. PROSPECTOR DEAD Mr. Prospector, the most influential sire of his generation, died yesterday afternoon in his stall at Claiborne Farm in Paris, Ky. He was 29. Suffering from peritonitis, the stallion was treated for colic Monday morning and his condition worsened throughout the day. Mr. Prospector sired champions It's in the Air, the first of his record 167 stakes winners, Conquistador Cielo, Ravinella, Gulch, Forty Niner, Rhythm, Machiavellian, Golden Attraction, Eillo, Queena, Tersa, Coup de Genie, Distant View, Gold Beauty, Woodman and Afleet. The highest-priced yearling of 1971 when he was purchased for \$220,000, Mr. Prospector went on to win seven of 14 starts, including two stakes, and set a six-furlong Gulfstream track record of 1:07.4 which still stands. Hall of Fame trainer Jimmy Croll picked out the speedy youngster at Keeneland's July Sale for Abraham Savin. "It really became a fairy-tale deal," Croll remember yesterday. "Mr. Savin really bought him with the idea of standing him. He had started a new farm in Ocala and wanted me to find him a horse that would be a good sire--a horse that could run, also, but a good stallion. I looked and looked until I found him and it turned into a multi-million dollar deal." The bay began his stud career at a fee of \$7,500 at Aisco Farm in Florida. The leading freshman sire of 1978, he was purchased by a syndicate headed by Claiborne Farm which valued the young stallion at \$20 million. His stud fee soared as high as \$300,000 in 1986 and he was the leading sire in North America in 1987 and 1988 and led the national broodmare sire list in 1997. Through 1998, 30 yearlings, one weanling and two two-yearolds by Mr. Prospector sold for seven figures at public auction. The mare Life's Magic sold in foal to Mr. Prospector in 1986 for \$5.4 million and Woodman, Ireland's champion two-year-old colt in 1985 and a leading sire, sold for \$3 million as a yearling in 1984. Just last summer, Fusao Sekiguchi bought the highest-priced Mr.

Prospector yearling ever sold at public auction when he

MENIFEE BREEZES AT BELMONT:

Kentucky Derby and Preakness runner-up Menifee (Harlan) worked five furlongs yesterday morning in :59 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:11 2/5. "I was hoping he'd go like a minute or 1:01," commented trainer Elliott Walden. "But he went easy. He looked super. It looks like he handles this racetrack pretty well."

VISION AND VERSE WORKS FOR MOTT:

GII Illinois Derby winner Vision and Verse (Storm Cat) breezed five furlongs at Belmont yesterday in 1:01 1/5 in company with stablemate Devil's Wish (Devil's Bag), a three-year-old maiden. This marks the first Group victory for Chester House, who will now head for the G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown July 3 as the 6-1 second choice behind Daylami (Ire). On his only previous start this season, the homebred colt was all out to win the Listed Huxley S. at Chester May 6, after which his trainer Henry Cecil had said that "he had needed the race badly." Looking much fitter here, the bay colt was the dominant force in the race, running in fourth behind the leaders Generous Rosi and Greek Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Soon after the final turn, Chester House easily closed on the leaders and moved sharply across to the rails two furlongs out, causing Gary Stevens to snatch up on Greek Dance. The Cecil trainee soon put daylight between himself and his rivals, with Generous Rosi staying on well and Greek Dance being eased well before the finish. After his weaving maneuver in the straight, Chester House's win was the subject of a stewards' inquiry, but the result was allowed to stand.

Gary Stevens, recently appointed stable jockey to Newmarket-based Sir Michael Stoute, won the opening race at Sandown yesterday, his first start since moving his tack to England over the weekend. The American jockey partnered 6-4 favorite Asef Alhind (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), trained by Ben Hanbury, to win the Addlestone Claiming S. "What a way to start," Stevens exclaimed after the victory. "I had butterflies even though it was one of the cheaper races. There's so much expected of me and I can't wait to go on from here." Stevens added to his win total a few hours later when Cloudy Sky (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) captured the Bookham Maiden S. by a short head. After Cloudy Sky's victory, the stewards warned Stevens about his use of the whip in the future. Stewards' secretary Jeremy Ker said, "We just had Gary Stevens in to show him the film of the last race. Like a lot of American jockeys, he just flicked his mount down the shoulder, with the whip in the forehand position, which is not allowed under our rules." Stevens will ride the Stoutetrained Beat All (Dynaformer) in Saturday's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom.

Strike Threat Hangs over French Derby:

This weekend's prestigious French Derby meeting at Chantilly is in jeapordy as the union of workers at France Galop threaten industrial action. The dispute dates back to Apr. 1 when a day of racing at Longchamp had to be cancelled. During negotiations in April, France Galop agreed to employ more than two dozen new staff, but now the union is demanding the hiring of a minimum of 40.
