CHARISMATIC FACES 11 IN TRIPLE CROWN

OUEST Their journey to Belmont Park began with thunder and lightning and their match-up in Saturday's final leg of the Triple Crown could prove to be just as explosive. Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Charismatic (Summer Squall) and champion two-year-old filly Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) arrived in New York early yesterday afternoon, shortly after being installed the first and third choices respectively in the GI Belmont S. Seeking to become the first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed in 1978, Charismatic drew post position four. "He is normally not a very good work horse, but Charismatic had his best work of the spring (Tuesday) and maybe he's trying to tell us something," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said of the former claimer who catapulted to the head of the three-year-old division with his two Classic wins. After much speculation, Silverbulletday was not entered in the Derby and she was scratched from the Preakness after drawing the outside stall, but each time easily won the filly equivalent the day before. Trainer Bob Baffert hopes a more rigorous training schedule has prepared his charge for her first start against the boys. "We've cranked up her works," Baffert commented. "We've never asked her to work hard in the morning and she's never had a race when she had to lay her body down. If she'd been training like this before the Derby, we might have taken a shot." Of Silverbulletday's twice-delayed Classic start, Baffert explained, "It wasn't the right time at the Derby and at Pimlico we were so dejected when we drew the 14, but we drew well here and I think something is telling us this is the time. I think she fits at a mile and a half." The dominant filly will break from post three. Trainer Elliott Walden hopes this year's Belmont provides fans with a distinct feeling of deja vu. In 1998, Walden's Victory Gallop finished second behind Real Quiet in both the Derby and Preakness before denying that rival the Triple Crown with a head-bob victory in the Belmont. This year, the trainer has followed the same path with the twice-second Menifee (Harlan), who drew post position 10. "I hope the final chapter is the same as last year," Walden said. "In the Derby, he ran a great race and if he got loose a little sooner, he might have won. Charismatic dominated the Preakness, but I hope we can turn the tables."

VISA TO SPONSOR CROWN THROUGH 2005

On the eve of Charismatic's historic attempt to become the first Triple Crown winner in 21 years, Visa U.S.A has concluded an agreement which will see the credit card company continue its sponsorship through 2005, it was announced yesterday. Visa president and CEO Carl Pascarella said, "Visa is proud to be aligned with the crown jewel of horse racing. The sponsorship will continue providing excitement for fans while building the Visa brand, which ultimately benefits our member financial institutions and merchants."

COURT RULES IN FAVOR OF IRS VS. LIBUTTI

A federal appeals court has ruled in favor of the Internal Revenue Service in their attempts to collect part of the racetrack and syndication earnings of MGISW Devil His Due, owned by Robert LiButti, according to a story on Blood-Horse Online. The court, in reviewing appeals of lower court rulings, judged that LiButti, and not his daughter Edith, was the owner of the horse, drawing upon testimony from the earlier trials which proved the elder LiButti's financial involvement with Devil His Due and Lion Crest Stable. The exact dollar amount owed the IRS by Lion Crest will be determined by one of the lower courts previously involved in the case.

Bella Chiarra, though winless in her last three outings coming into this event, was third beaten two lengths in the GIII Las Cienegas down the hill at Santa Anita Apr. 18 and was most recently second, beaten a couple of lengths in the GIII Wilshire H. over this turf May 9. After shopping for spots over the past weekend, the decision to run in this heat proved a shrewd one as Bella Chiarra, who bobbled slightly at the start, stalked the early pacesetter from second position while saving ground. The chestnut advanced towards the front 5/16ths out and had a one-length lead at the eighth pole before holding West Side safe for the victory.

VLT Bill Introduced in New York:

A bill to legalize video lottery terminals at New York racetracks has been introduced in the state assembly, according to a report in the Harness Tracks of America newsletter. The bill was introduced by Alex Gromack, chairman of the assembly's Racing and Wagering Committee. Under the bill, all state tracks, excluding the non-profit New York Racing Association tracks, would receive 500 machines the first year and 500 the second. NYRA would receive 75 percent of that total (375), with proceeds going to purses.

George M. Hendrie Dies:

The Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Ontario Jockey Club, George M. Hendrie, died Tuesday in Toronto at the age of 69. Hendrie came from a family of racing officials, as great grandfather William Hendrie was one of the founders of the OJC in 1883 and his father Geroge C. Hendrie was the President of the QJC from 1960-1971. David Wilmot, president and CEO of the OJC, commented, "George Hendrie's contribution and dedication to the sport of horse racing and to the Ontario Jockey Club was inestimable. How deeply he will be missed by all in racing." Hendrie is survived by his widow Betsy, his brother Tony, three children and seven grandchildren. Funeral services are scheduled for tomorrow morning.

It hasn't taken long for champion sprinter Cherokee Run to make his mark at stud. His first crop was in demand at last year's yearling sales and at this spring's two-year-old in training auctions. Particularly notable was the Cherokee Run filly out of Song of Syria, who became the highest-priced filly sold at the Fasig-Tipton Select Calder Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale when knocked down to Stonerside Stable for \$875,000.

Now named Chilukki, the Cherokee Run--Song of Syria filly has already made some very positive moves to show herself worth the price tag. In her Apr. 28 debut at Churchill Downs, she scored by 9 1/4 lengths while setting a new track record of :51 for 4 1/2 furlongs. And on Memorial Day, Chilukki produced another very good effort to put nearly five lengths between herself and some smart colts in the GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup S.

Chilukki's pedigree is a complete outcross at five generations, and she is a product of a cross (Blushing Groom over Damascus) which had previously produced GISW Subordination. There is, however, close inbreeding to be found in the pedigree of Chilukki's dam Song of Syria: she is 3x3 to My Babu, 1947 English champion two-year old and course record-breaking winner of the English 2000 Guineas.

My Babu was by the French horse Djebel, and his dam Perfume II was by the speedy Badruddin (Blandford--Mumtaz Mahal) out of the great tap-root mare Lavendula (dam of Ambiorix and granddam of Turn-To). The interesting thing about Perfume II is that not only is Badruddin a three-quarters brother to Mumtaz Begum (dam of Nasrullah), but Lavendula is by Pharos, the grandsire of Nasrullah. So, Perfume II's pedigree is almost that of Nasrullah turned inside out. If we go to the pedigree of Cherokee Run, we find that his closest inbreeding is a 4x4 cross of Nasrullah. For good measure, Cherokee Run's dam Cherokee Dame also has a double of Royal Charger, another very close relative to Nasrullah and Perfume II.

Mumtaz Mahal, who appears prominently in the pedigrees of Perfume II, Nasrullah and Royal Charger, was christened "The Flying Filly" after showing brilliant speed in the early stages of her two-year-old career. Now, nearly 75 years after Mumtaz Mahal flashed across the English racing scene, it appears that multiples of her influence have a major part to play in the precocious brilliance demonstrated by Chilukki.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

We have noted that the pattern of inbreeding to a sire via the direct male line and through the mare in direct female line can often be very effective. One of the horses which appears to work particularly well when used in this way is Raise a Native, and there were two examples of this pattern in stakes winners over the weekend. Notoriety (g. 6, Affirmed--Endearingly, by Lyphard) who took the GIII Jaipur H. at Belmont Park, is by a grandson of Raise a Native and his granddam So Endearing is also by Raise a Native. Another with Raise a Native 3x3 at the top and bottom of the pedigree is Search For Luv (c, 3, Regal Search--Luvsider, by Topsider), who opened his stakes account with a win in the Legal Light S. at Delaware Park. Search For Luv's pedigree is even more complex since his fifth dam Good Call is a genetic relative to Raise You the dam of Raise a Native.

European freshman sire Vettori (Machiavellian--Air Distingue, by Sir Ivor) was represented by his first stakes winner when Toutzi (f, 2, Vettori--Blue Stricks, by Bluebird) won the Listed Premio Alessandro Perrone at Rome on Sunday. Toutzi not only has Sir Ivor 3x4 (as the broodmare sire of both the sire and broodmare sire), but combines Northern Dancer through the closely related Nijinsky II and Storm Bird, this pair appearing 4x3. Toutzi also has three crosses of Northern Dancer's dam Natalma and four of his granddam Almahmoud.

Soaring Softly (f, 4, Kris S.--Wings of Grace, by Key to the Mint), winner of the GII Sheepshead Bay H. in the style of a coming turf superstar, has two notable pedigree patterns. Firstly, Princequillo appears 3x4 as the broodmare sire of both Kris S. and Key to the Mint. Secondly, Soaring Softly combines Roberto with Nijinsky II (sire of Soaring Softly's second dam). This one works because Roberto's granddam Rarelea is a genetic relative to Bull Page the broodmare sire of Nijinsky II.

The combination of His Majesty and full brother Graustark with Majestic Light is one which is always worth attempting when the opportunity arises. His Majesty and Graustark are by Ribot out of Flower Bowl, while Majestic Light combines a daughter of Your Hostess (three-quarters sister to Flower Bowl) with a daughter of Ribot. The latest success for the pairing is Incitatus (c, 3, Batonnier--Silken Light, by Majestic Light), winner of the California Sires S. at Golden Gate Park Monday. Incitatus is by a son of His Majesty out of a Majestic Light mare.
