A CROWN FOR CHARISMATIC? Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero Charismatic (Summer Squall), who bids to become the first Triple Crown winner in 21 years, galloped over the Belmont main track on the day before his date with history. "He looked like his old self," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. "I don't see anything different than going into the Preakness and Derby." As for his Triple Crown chances, Lukas said, "There's something about the last bump in that road that's a little bit harder than the other two. There are a lot of things to overcome. If we are going to pull this off, we are going to have to have some things fall into place." Trainer Bob Baffert, who has had his Triple Crown hopes dashed the last two years, looks to play the spoiler with Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) this time. "She's sharp, she's doing great," Baffert said. "Whether the fuel light comes on turning for home, we won't know until the race. Distance is the only question. She's healthy, she's happy, she's on her toes. We'll see what happens." Trainer Elliott Walden is himself in position to play Triple Crown spoiler once again, but it isn't all deja vu as he gets ready for this year's challenge. His '99 Belmont candidate, Menifee (Harlan), is really nothing like 1998 winner Victory Gallop, who came from the clouds to beat Real Quiet by a nose. "Their similarities basically end with the fact that they were both second in the Derby and the Preakness," Walden said. "Physically, they're different. Victory Gallop is as small a horse as I have had that's a good horse, but he's very well-balanced, very athletic-looking. Menifee is a tall, leggy colt. He's not real light on his feet, but he can cover a lot of ground with one stride. He is also a lot more adaptable to the circumstances in the race. He does come from off the pace, but his style is not as drastic as Victory Gallop's. He has the tactical speed if he needs it." Even their family trees are from different sides of the forest. Victory Gallop is by Cryptoclearance, who finished second in the '87 Belmont. Menifee is from the first crop of the late Harlan, who picked up his only stakes win in the GI Vosburgh and never won beyond 1 1/16 miles. "Victory Gallop had pedigree on his side," Walden said. "I didn't have a question whether he would get the distance from that standpoint. With Menifee, I had reservations whether he would get a mile and a quarter. He eliminated those reservations in the (Derby), and physically he is the type to get a mile and a half.'

The 220th running of the Vodafone Derby over Epsom's switchback track has 16 runners set to face the starter, after Rhagaas (GB) and Tchaikovsky (Ire), the third and second strings for Godolphin and trainer Aidan O'Brien, respectively, were diverted to Sunday's French Derby at Chantilly. The big question is who will stay over the ground rated on the soft side of good. Heading the betting is the Godolphin-owned Dubai Millennium (GB) (Seeking the Gold), who is unbeaten in three starts. The colt advertised his well-being for the Derby with an impressive win in the Listed Compass UK Leisure Predominate S. at Goodwood May 18. Also entered for Godolphin, which is yet to win the Vodafone Derby, is the ex-American-trained hopeful Adair (Theatrical {Ire}), an 11-length winner on his sole start last season at Belmont Park in New York. Sheikh Mohammed, the man behind Godolphin, said yesterday, "I think Dubai Millennium will handle this track better, but the other horse, Adair, is a very good horse."

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

After breaking breaking her maiden at Newmarket Apr. 13, Ramruma became a leading contender for this race off her win in the Lingfield Oaks Trial May 8. Confirming the promise of those two runs, the filly took the race by the scruff of the neck soon after rounding the home turn and simply galloped her rivals into submission for a comfortable success from the mainly unconsidered Noushkey and favored Zahrat Dubai. She became Henry Cecil's sixth English Oaks winner and the second for Kieren Fallon. Ramruma settled in second as Claxon (Caerleon) set a good pace; Fallon had to roust his mount along briefly at the top of the hill, and the move paid dividends as she came back on the bridle and challenged the pacesetter for the lead soon after entering the straight, took over at the quarter-mile mark and drove on relentlessly to the wire. Henry Cecil pointed out, "She stays well, she's got class and she's got speed and I was very calm." Ahmed Salman, acting as a good luck charm for the winning owner, his brother Fahd (who watched the race from Riyadh), added, "She acts like she's a little bit lazy, and she sweated and sweated before the race. But she did it like a piece of cake. This is more important than Generous' [1991] Derby win because she's a homebred. She is named after Prince Fahd's youngest daughter, whose nickname is Ramruma. I really cannot say any more because I am so happy."

Three Ring crushed fellow fillies the last two times she faced them, taking the Feb. 21 GII Davona Dale S. by 14 lengths and the Mar. 16 GII Bonnie Miss S. by 6 1/4 lengths, both at Gulfstream Park. But she couldn't handle the colts at a mile and a quarter off a 1 1/2month layoff and finished 19th and last in the May 1 Kentucky Derby last time out. Odds-on to bounce back in the first leg of New York's Triple Tiara, the chestnut shadowed 3-1 Sapphire n' Silk (Pleasant Tap) through a half in :46.46, then went head-and-head with Better Than Honour through the final half, losing the lead briefly at the top of the lane, but battling back to win it by a short margin. There was a claim of foul against the winner by jockey Richie Migliore, rider of the runner-up, but it was not allowed. "I didn't feel there was contact," said winning jockey Jerry Bailey. "I knew (Better Than Honour) was going out, but I didn't cause it." Trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. said, "Physically she showed he she came out of (the Derby) fine. Mentally, she's such a good, smart filly that it didn't take anything out of her, either. She showed no ill effects at all. She ran her eveballs out today." Trainer John Kimmel said, "You can't take anything away from the winner. But Richie said there was some bumping and we got carried wide in the stretch. The closer Three Ring got, the more intimidated my filly got." The top two go next in the second Tiara test, the GI Mother Goose S. June 26.

In a race which brought together the winners of 13 Group 1 races, five of them Classics, Daylami showed the benefit of his recent second-place finish in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 23 with a determined run in the final quarter-mile to wear down Royal Anthem. The five-year-old took his Group 1 tally to four in giving jockey Frankie Dettori his first Coronation Cup, and he became the first horse since Mill Reef in 1972 to complete the G1 Eclipse S.-Coronation Cup double. Central Park (In The Wings {GB}) set a sedate early pace and quickened the tempo at the top of the hill, but relinquished the lead to Royal Anthem soon after rounding Tattenham Corner. Royal Anthem held a two-length lead entering the final quarter, with Daylami in pursuit, but his jockey, Kieren Fallon, had to resort to the whip to keep him going and Daylami's persistent run down the outside paid off in the final 100 yards, as he went on to win going away. Dream Well, who tried to hang left into the camber for the entire length of the straight, managed to run on well under some expert guidance from Cash Asmussen to take a close third. Silver Patriarch ran his usual game race in fourth without managing to get in a serious blow. A clearly delighted winning owner Sheikh Mohammed enthused, "He's a very tough horse with a big heart and is one who likes to battle. I think they went the right pace for him and he had a little something left in the tank in the end. I think these older horses tend to need the run first time out." An equally enthusiastic Dettori explained, "When we passed the two-furlong marker, I saw Kieren drawing his whip. I then knew I had a little bit more than him left. I gave [Davlami] a couple of cracks and he took off. One-and-a-half miles is as far as he wants."


