JAKE HOWARD NAMED OJC CHAIRMAN The Ontario Jockey Club yesterday announced the appointment of Jake Howard as OJC Chairman of the Board of Directors. Howard succeeds George M. Hendrie, who passed away last week. A native of South America, the 74-year-old attended high school, Naval College and the University of Toronto in Canada and graduated from Osgoode Hall in 1953. He has owned race horses since 1970. "I've received a lot from horse racing and now I'd like to give something back," he said on accepting the chairmanship.

PASSERO CLAIMS ARABIAN AT DELAWARE PARK Frank Passero, currently the leading trainer at Delaware Park, is branching out. Passero, who set a record last season for most claims at Delaware, claimed an Arabian named Rooster Bw Sunday for \$10,000. The six-year-old gelding has earned \$60,946. He was claimed for a partnership made up of Three Musketeers, Steven Barberino, Sr. and Passero. "I have always wanted to train an Arabian," the trainer said. "I don't believe there is any real difference (between training Thoroughbreds and Arabians). I think the rule of thumb stands firm that if you keep them happy and keep them fit, they will do the running. The purse structure for Arabians at Delaware Park is very good. We are going to dabble with the Arabs."

Charismatic took the honors in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, but not the most glittering prize in American racing when he limped home only third in the Belmont S. Under the cruel circumstances, it was small consolation that the last leg of the Triple Crown underlined the power of his bloodlines, with victory going to Lemon Drop Kid, a colt who shares the same second dam, Lassie Dear, as Charismatic's sire Summer Squall.

The Belmont also acted as a warning to buyers not to ignore May foals. Several of the candidates had May birthdates, with the winner being born as late as May 26. I can't help thinking that Lemon Drop Kid would have cost Laddie Dance more than \$200,000 at the Keeneland September Sale had he been born three months earlier, because two colts from Kingmambo's 1996 crop which were born around the beginning of March were sold for \$350,000 in 1997.

Fortunately, Lemon Drop Kid's foaling date hasn't compromised his racing career. He matured quickly enough to win at Saratoga and revealed his true worth for the first time when he wore down Yes It's True to take the GI Futurity S. "The Kid" also stayed on into second place in the GI Champagne S., but I'm not sure I would have predicted then that he'd one day be suited by 1½ miles.

Kingmambo was considered a miler pure and simple in Europe. His juvenile career established his toughness and precocity, but also hinted strongly that he didn't quite have the ability to match his immaculate pedigree.

However, he proved a very different colt at three, when he inflicted the first defeat on Zafonic in the Prix Djebel before going on to record Group 1 victories in the French 2000 Guineas, St. James's Palace S. and Prix du Moulin de Longchamp.

Appropriately, the Moulin also ranked as one of the 10 Group 1 races that Kingmambo's brilliant dam, Miesque, won at around a mile.

With Mr. Prospector as his sire, there was no reason to expect Kingmambo to stay much beyond a mile, but there was every reason to expect him to make a very good stallion. The fact that he has better front legs than many of Mr. Prospector's sons simply added to his enormous appeal. For a while it looked as though he was destined for Japan, but Will Farish, a long-time business associate of the Niarchos family, secured him for Lane's End and it looks as though Japan's loss is very much the U.S.'s gain.

In assessing Kingmambo's stallion career, it musn't be forgotten that he had a comparatively small first crop of around 40 foals, a substantial number of which were exported to Japan. It was El Condor Pasa, one of the exports, who put Kingmambo on the map by winning the NKH Mile Cup and the Japan Cup.

That Japan Cup win demonstrated Kingmambo's ability to get horses which stay a good deal further than a mile, and so too did the stakes victories of Parade Ground (GIII Lawrence Realization H. over 1½ miles) and Seignorial (Prix Scaramouche over 1 7/8 miles). Another first-crop son, American Odyssey, was third in the GIII Palm Beach S. Seattle Slew provides a link between Lemon Drop Kid, American Odyssey and El Condor Pasa, as he's responsible for the dams of the first two and for the second dam of El Condor Pasa.

Lemon Drop Kid's dam, Charming Lassie, won over six furlongs on her only appearance at three, but she is a three-parts sister to the 1992 Belmont S. winner A.P. Indy (by Seattle Slew out of Lassie Dear's daughter Weekend Surprise).

Seattle Slew, of course, took the Belmont in 1977 to complete the Triple Crown, so he stayed well and so, too, did Buckpasser, the stallion responsible for the outstanding Lassie Dear. Magnificently versatile, Buckpasser numbered the Lawrence Realization (13 furlongs) and the Jockey Club Gold Cup (two miles) among his 25 wins.
