BELMONT RATINGS UP While a record crowd of 85,818 turned out on track to witness Charismatic's bid to win the Triple Crown, Saturday's Belmont S. telecast on ABC drew an overnight rating of 6.6 with a 17 share. Those figures represent an increase over last year's 6.5/17 figures. The final hour of the 90-minute broadcast garnered a 7.5/19 share. The Belmont telecast outpaced all other afternoon sports televised over the weekend, including Saturday's Mets vs. Yankees baseball game on FOX, which earned a 3.9 rating. The Memorial Golf Tournament on CBS, aired during the Belmont time slot, earned a 2.9 rating and NBC's broadcast of French Open tennis drew a 3.8 on Saturday and a 4.0 on Sunday. "The Belmont rating was phenomenal," said Mark Mandel, ABC's director of Sports Media Relations. "Anytime you can earn a six rating on a Saturday afternoon, it means you have an incredibly strong event." In addition, Autotote reports the national handle, encompassing nearly 900 simulcast locations throughout the country, was a record \$67.9 million, or about \$18 million more than the previous high.

MENIFEE HASKELL BOUND Given a reasonably clean bill of health following his disappointing eighthplace finish in Saturday's GI Belmont S., Menifee (Harlan) will be pointed toward the Aug. 8 GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park, trainer Elliott Walden said. Menifee began his career last year at Monmouth Park, where he was stabled for most of the summer and won a July 16 maiden race in his debut. "He came back (from the Belmont) good," Walden said, "Really, I was a little puzzled by his performance. I question whether he could get the mile-and-a-half, but since he ran so well at a mile-and-a-quarter, I thought it would be all right to run him. I think it was the combination of three grueling races right in a row, starting from the Blue Grass. I think it kind of caught up to him. He came back with a little mucous in his upper airway, but that's no big deal. His white count was down, which is an indication of a little virus."

Magic Millions Results:

A filly by Thunder Gulch gained top price Monday in an otherwise lackluster Magic Millions Select Winter Carnival Yearling Sales in Australia. Trainer Jack Denham paid AUS\$170,000 (US\$109,869) for the bay filly out of Princesse Daly (Big Spruce). Magic Millions director Don Hancock described the sale as "difficult" with 89 of the 278 yearlings being passed in. The sale aggregate was AUS\$3.17 million (\$2.05 million). The average was AUS\$19,340 (\$12,499) compared with the 1998 average AUS\$21,260 (\$13,741). "Buyers tend to be creatures of habit and we can advertise and talk this sale up until the cows come home but really at the end of the day, it's going to be racetrack success that will prove that the product is okay," Hancock said.

Juggler Swims to Stradbroke:

Juggler (Aus) (Jugah, by Northern Dancer), pre-post favorite for the \$1 million G1 Stradbroke H. at Eagle Farm Saturday, flew to Brisbane yesterday. A MG1SW, Juggler hasn't raced since his gallant third in the G1 Doncaster in mid-April. Gai Waterhouse stable forewoman Lesley Dennett said Juggler would work mainly at the beach between now and Saturday. "He will swim his way to the Stradbroke," she said.

Sadler's Wells and Fairy King (who is now pensioned) are probably the most powerful pair of full brothers to have stood in the British Isles since the days of Fairway and Pharos in the 1930s and 40s. The point had already been underlined this season with the G1 2000 Guineas going to Island Sands from the first crop of Fairy King's son Turtle Island and the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas falling to Sadler's Wells' son Saffron Walden. The pair continued their dominance in this weekend's European colt classics, the G1 Vodafone Derby falling to Oath with Daliapour (by Sadler's Wells) second, and in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club Emirates Airline (French Derby), in which Sadler's Wells sired the triumphant Montjeu as well as third-placed Rhagaas.

There was a certain irony about Oath's victory in the Vodafone Derby; while crediting Fairy King with a first Derby winner at Epsom, he prevented Sadler's Wells from recording his first win in the race (incidentally, the brothers theme continued with regard to ownership: Oath is owned by The Thoroughbred Corporation of Prince Ahmed Salman, and the previous day the G1 Vodafone Oaks had been taken by Ramruma, owned by the Prince's brother Prince Fahd Salman and trained, like Oath, by Henry Cecil).

Oath's family has threatened to achieve Epsom glory on at least two previous occasions. His third dam Aiming High II is half sister to Tender Annie, who finished third in the Oaks in 1962, and in 1994 Tender Annie's grandson the G1 2000 Guineas winner Mister Baileys produced a thrilling, cavalier display of front-running before fading into a gallant fourth inside the final furlong.

Oath is in fact, already half brother to a classic winner. His dam Sheer Audacity has also produced Pelder (by Be My Guest, like Fairy King a son of Northern Dancer). Winner in Italy of the G1 Gran Criterium at two and the G1 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) at three, Pelder went on to prove his mettle at the highest level when he captured the G1 Prix Ganay at five. In addition, Sheer Audacity is also the dam of listed winners Napoleon's Sister and Sheer Danzig, who are respectively by Northern Dancer's grandsons Alzao and Roi Danzig.

The classic theme continues in the distaff side of the pedigree as Sheer Audacity is by the runaway 1979 Derby winner Troy and her dam Miss Upward is by Alcide, who would have started favorite for the 1958 renewal of the Derby had he not been "got at" (suffering a blow which broke a rib) in his box prior to the race.

The cross of Northern Dancer line stallions over mares descending from Troy and his sire Petingo has been a very successful one. Over half of all stakes winners out of Troy mares are by Northern Dancer line sires, and in addition to Oath and Pelder they include champion Pilsudski and Group winners Helen of Spain (by Sadler's Wells), Glowing Ardour and Spartan Shareef. Both Fairy King and Sadler's Wells have enjoyed success with mares from other branches of the Petingo line. Fairy King sired G1 Grand Criterium winner Second Empire out of a mare by Ela-Mana-Mou and Sadler's Wells was responsible for the G1 Dewhurst S. victor Prince of Dance out of a mare by English Prince.

The success of Northern Dancer with Petingo in general and Fairy King and Sadler's Wells in particular is not surprising. Petingo has a very similar genetic background to Nearctic (sire of Northern Dancer) which involves the brothers Pharos and Fairway, opposite sex strains of Nearco and combinations of Hyperion and Swynford. In addition, Petingo is inbred to the mare Lady Juror through her sons Fair Trial and The Recorder, while Fairy King and Sadler's Wells carry Forli, who is inbred to Fair Trial and his three-quarters sister Riot.

Montjeu and Rhagaas, the Sadler's Wells colts who took first and third in the Prix du Jockey- Club, are both by Sadler's Wells out of mares by 1979 Prix du Jockey-Club hero Top Ville. Sadler's Wells has sired at least seven stakes winners out of mares by Top Ville or his sire High Top including earlier Group 1 scorers Kayf Tara and Opera House (both out of Colorspin, by High Top), while his son in the Wings is responsible for G1 Irish Derby victor Winged Love out of a Top Ville mare. Fairy King's Irish 2000 Guineas winner Turtle Island is also out of a High Top mare. High Top's pedigree has Abernant, a close genetic relative to Forli (sire of the second dam of Sadler's Wells and Fairy King), and Abernant's sire Owen Tudor is bred on a reverse cross of Hyperion and Pharos to Nearctic, sire of Northern Dancer. High Top also carries Black Devil, a close relative to Flares who appears in the pedigree of Sadler's Wells and Fairy King as broodmare sire of Nantallah (responsible for the brothers' third dam, Thong). Montjeu's second dam is by Tennyson, and Tennyson's sire Val de Loir is also seen quite often in the pedigree of good stakes winners by Sadler's Wells and Fairy King. This is no surprise since Sadler's Wells, Fairy King and Val de Loir are all members of the famous family descending from the great tap-root mare Simon's Shoes.

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Sadler's Wells was also prominent in two other weekend stakes winners with interesting pedigrees. In the G3 Prix de Royaumont, Side Saddle (Ire) (f, 3, Saddler's Hall {Ire}--Athene {Ire}, by Rousillon) gained the first stakes victory of her career. Her sire is a son of Sadler's Wells (out of a Val de Loir mare) and as her broodmare sire is a grandson of Never Bend, Side Saddle is yet another Sadler's Wells line stakes winner with a double of Lalun (dam of Sadler's Wells' broodmare sire Bold Reason and of Never Bend). Incidentally, Side Saddle's second dam is by Ela-Mana-Mou, a son of Petingo, so she also has a pedigree similar to the Vodafone Derby winner Oath.

The Vodafone Dash H., a listed sprint on Derby Day, went to To the Roof (GB) (h, 7, Thatching {Ire}--Christine Daae {GB}, by Sadler's Wells). He is inbred 2x4 to Thatch (sire of Thatching) and his sister Special (granddam of Sadler's Wells). Thatching appeared in another notable weekend pedigree when Antinnaz (Ire) (f, 3, Thatching {Ire}--Tootling {Ire}, by Pennine Walk {Ire}) captured the listed Cecil Frail S. at Haydock Park. Antinnaz is by a son of Thatch and her broodmare sire Pennine Walk is out of a mare by the same stallion, which means that Antinnaz is inbred to Thatch 2x4.

The very successful combination of Sharpen Up and Danzig (which appears to work irrespective of which way round it is tried) added another stakes winner when Cybinka (GB) (f, 3, Selkirk--Sarmatia, by Danzig) took the listed Vodafone Surrey S. Cybinka is very closely related to the celebrated brothers Kris and Diesis since not only is Selkirk by their sire Sharpen Up, but Sarmatia is out of their dam Doubly Sure.

The weekend was a great one for Kingmambo, who was not only represented by the GI Belmont S. winner Lemon Drop Kid (c, 3, Kingmambo--Charming Lassie, by Seattle Slew), but also Japanese graded stakes winner American Boss (c, 4, Kingmambo--Redeemer by Dixieland Band), winner of the G3 Epsom Cup. Both have trends which are becoming apparent in the stakes winners from Kingmambo's first two crops. Lemon Drop Kid is out of a mare by Seattle Slew who is also broodmare sire of Kingmambo stakes winner American Odyssey and sire of the second dam of Kingmambo's G1 Japan Cup hero, El Condor Pasa. American Boss is inbred to Northern Dancer and Graustark (by Ribot). Northern Dancer duplications are also apparent in Kingmambo's multiple graded stakes winner Parade Ground, his Canadian Grade 1 winner Zaha (who has a daughter of Northern Dancer), El Condor Pasa and American Odyssey. Parade Ground also has a combination of Graustark and his brother His Majesty, while French stakes winner Seignorial has a double of their sire, Ribot.
