STEVENS WINS ONE FOR THE QUEEN At the halfway point of the Royal Ascot meeting, jockey Gary Stevens is tied with Kieren Fallon as leading rider at Ascot, and the transplanted American rode a winner for the Queen yesterday in the Duke of Edinburgh S. (handicap). Both jockeys have had two winners and two seconds. "It's the thrill of a lifetime," said Stevens to the Queen after wearing the royal silks to victory on Blueprint in the first running of the Duke Of Edinburgh S. It was Her Majesty's first Royal Ascot winner since Phantom Gold in the 1995 Ribblesdale S. Sir Michael Stoute has now trained four winners from four runners for the Queen. Stevens continued, "The pressure was on for me--the horse was undefeated since being with Sir Michael (Stoute) but I think he could have ridden him. He gave me a fantastic trip, finishing up well in the final furlong. I've ridden favorites in \$5 million races before, but this was a different kind of pressure--more of a pleasure." Lord Carnarvon, the Queen's racing manager, suggested to Stevens that the Melbourne Cup may be a possibility later in the year; it would be the jockey's first Australian ride.

SELLERS FINED FOR FIGHTING Shane Sellers has been fined \$500 by the New York Racing Association stewards for punching jockey Mike Smith during a heated argument in the Belmont jockey's room Saturday. The fight also involved John Velazquez and Jose Espinoza. Velazquez, Smith and Espinoza are scheduled to meet before the stewards today, at which time they, too, could be fined. Tempers flared after the fourth race Saturday when Smith said that he felt Espinoza came over on him wrecklessly nearing the quarter-pole of the one-mile grass race. Smith was forced to take up, which caused him to interfere with John Velazquez's mount. According to witnesses, the riders started to jaw at one another after the race and, reportedly, Sellers tried to intervene. One thing led to another and Sellers and Smith started to go at one another. "It was just a heat of the moment kind of thing," Smith said. "One guy says this and one guy says that. We all wish it didn't happen. Luckily, nobody got hurt." The stewards took immediate action against Sellers because he was due to leave New York after Saturday's race.

Having won this race in 1997 with surprise 25-1 winner Rebecca Sharp, Geoff Wragg again surprised at odds of 16-1. Second to Hawriyah in the Listed Conqueror S. at Goodwood May 20 on her only start this term, Balisada made the transition into Group-race company with a come-from-behind victory to beat talented opponents. Balisada raced in the rear as Hawriyah led the field into the straight, but that one soon weakened. Golden Silca, Wannabe Grand, Valentine Waltz and Presumed (Dynaformer) all looked to strike the front but it was Balisada, seventh into the straight, with a telling run on the wide outside, who grabbed the lead in the last 50 yards and ran on too strongly for her opponents while Golden Silca just held second. Wragg declared, "She was going to be my (1000) Guineas filly, but then she threw a curb, bumping her near hind just below the hock earlier in the year and I had to stop with her. The plan had been to run her in the Nell Gwyn and the Guineas, and I had to rush her to get her to run at Goodwood. She was only threeparts fit. I knew she was bound to improve." Wragg was full of praise for the ride by Michael Roberts and added, "I told Michael to hold on to her as long as possible as she has plenty of speed, and to come as late as he could."

He showed his well being when giving weight and defeating the French pair Tajoun and Katun on his sole start this year in the G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier at Longchamp May 23. Both Tajoun and Katun will find it hard to reverse the form now that all three start off level weights. Nedawi, the Godolphin second choice and last year's G1 St Leger winner, was just caught by Fruits Of Love on his seasonal debut over an inadequate trip in the 12furlong Dubai Turf Classic at Nad Al Sheba Mar. 28 and will appreciate the prevalent track condition. Rainbow High would appear to have the measure of Persian Punch, Celeric, Laurentide, Spirit Of Love and Athenry based on their placings in the G3 Henry II S. at Sandown May 31. Rainbow High was caught in the last stride by Arctic Owl on that occasion and had previously finished in front of Invermark, with plenty in hand, when breaking the track record in the valuable Chester Cup (Handicap) May 5.

Sometimes regarded as a consolation race for the Oaks also-rans, though meritorious as a quality Group 2 race in its own right, there are surprisingly no runners here who ran in the Oaks. Credit-A-Plenty has credentials aplenty in that she was runner-up to the Oaks winner Ramruna in the Listed Oaks Trial at Lingfield May 8, with the Oaks second, Noushkey behind in third. That form line makes excellent reading and the lightly raced Credit-A-Plenty is sure to go very close on that evidence. Alabaq, a late withdrawal from the Oaks, was strong in the ante-post lists for the fillies' Classic and has claims based on her impressive win in the Listed Pretty Polly S. at Newmarket May 1. The half sister to 1990 Oaks winner Salsabil should have no trouble in confirming form with Oceans Friendly, who was well behind that day. Samoa has a similar chance to Alabaq, having finished a tight second to Nasheed in the Listed Newbury Fillies' Trial May 14, based on Oceans Friendly's sixth-place finish that day. Valentine Girl enters calculations having won the Listed Chester Oaks May 5, and will appreciate the trip and going. Fairy Queen, a fair 10th to Wince in the 1000 Guineas, bounced back to form in the Listed Victress S. at Epsom June 4.

Russian Revival finished ahead of Keos, Tomba and Andreyev when second in the Shergar Cup Seven at Goodwood May 8 and then went on to land the G3 Prix du Palais Royal at Longchamp May 27 in record time. Bianconi seemed to have the sprinting world at his feet when securing the G2 Diadem S. over course and distance last September but has largely disappointed since. He returns to his favored distance and going. Bold Fact is at the top of his game at the moment judged on his defeat of subsequent G2 Temple S. winner Tipsy Creek in the Listed Leisure S. at Lingfield May 22. Tipsy Creek has bounced back to form following a series of setbacks including a career threatening back injury. Tomba, last year's winner, certainly has the class to challenge but will not be suited by the ground.

Essentially seen as a match between Enrique and Stravinsky (Nureyev), the Jersey S. proved a massive shock, with Lots Of Magic showing no respect for his more illustrious opponents. Having finished only fourth on his previous start in a handicap at Sandown May 31, Lots Of Magic seemed to have little chance on the bare form alone, but he led for much of the trip and ran on strongly for the win. Racing up with the pace from the outset, Lots Of Magic soon held the outright lead as Enrique settled in fifth and Bertolini in sixth with Stravinsky settled at the rear. On the run to the final furlong, Lots Of Magic still held a commanding advantage as Enrique was ridden strongly. Stravinsky had come through traffic to challenge on the outside but none had the answer to Lots Of Magic's finishing kick and he ran out a comfortable winner. Enrique was booked for second as Bertolini ran on well to deny Stravinsky third place. Winning trainer Richard Hannon admitted, "We really ran here because we had to rather than because we specially thought he would win. The trouble with him, he is rated 100 or 102 and it means that he has to run in races like this or has to carry 10 stone (140 pounds) in handicaps. I told (jockey) Dane (O'Neill) to let him bowl along and see what happens. He likes a strong pace and he has always been a grand horse. He is even grander now."

The form of the Henry Cecil stable continues unabated as the maiden winner Endorsement, the only filly in the field, gamely outbattled the equally gutsy Time Zone to provide Cecil with his eighth victory in the race. Endorsement raced in third as Time Zone set a stop-start pace initiated by his jockey Richard Hughes so as not to let his opponents get into a rhythm over the marathon trip with Compton Ace rated in midfield. The order remained constant until reaching the home turn, where Kieren Fallon pushed Endorsement to within a half-length of Time Zone. Fallon began to get urgent aboard Endorsement inside the final quarter and she led at the eighth pole, but Hughes' tactics had paid off as he urged his mount for a second effort and Time Zone responded by rallying gamely. Ultimately, he could not get back to the lead as Endorsement ran on in determined fashion for a battling win. Compton Ace ran on well from the rear and was at his closest at the finish. Philip Freedman of the Cliveden Stud said, "There were two possible races for her here. We could have run in either the Ribblesdale S. or this race and when Henry (Cecil) said that we would probably be third or fourth in the Ribblesdale but possibly win this, we decided that we should take his advice and come here. Once again, he was right. She is not ready yet to take on the four-year-olds in Group races, so we are not keen on the idea of the Goodwood Cup, but there is the (G2) Prix de Pomone at Deauville (Aug. 1) and the (G3) Park Hill S. (at Doncaster, Sept. 8)."

Winning a maiden at Bath might not prove the most reliable guide to finding a winner at this meeting, but that would not take into account the genius of Peter Chapple-Hyam. Shining Hour won a class D maiden at Bath May 21 on her second start and ran on strongly from the rear to win this a shade cozily to give jockey Jimmy Fortune his first Royal Ascot winner. This was another example of a race meant to be a match between the best Britain had to offer--Rowaasi--and an Aidan O'Brien inmate, Warrior Queen. Whilst those two did manage to finish second and third, they were no match for the finishing kick of Shining Hour. Racing inside the final quarter, Rowaasi had moved to near the front as Warrior Queen was positioned to lead just inside the final furlong. Warrior Queen looked like she was going on to win but Rowaasi was rallying. Inside the last half furlong, it became apparent that neither was going to win as Shining Hour, who had weaved her way through traffic, was flying and she grabbed the lead inside the last 50 yards to win handsomely. Chapple-Hyam explained, "We rode her differently today. She was held up and then came round the whole pack and won so she is a very valid winner. From what I had heard about the other horses, I thought we would finish third today. It was not her ground today; she likes a bit of cut. She moved down shockingly but came back alright. She may go for the (G2) Cherry Hinton (Newmarket, July 6), she's probably the best of the bunch at the moment."

#### Stronach A Possible Suitor For Gulfstream:

After failing in a bid to buy the two state-owned Thoroughbred racing facilities in New Jersey, Monmouth Park and The Meadowlands, Canadian industrialist Frank Stronach is reportedly close to purchasing Gulfstream Park. One South Florida racetrack official from a second racetrack told The Blood-Horse Online that a deal could be struck as soon as this Friday. Although Gulfstream president Douglas Donn refused official comment on the matter, The Blood-Horse is reporting that officials from the Gulfstream controller's office spent the weekend looking over and copying records in Donn's office. Stronach could not be reached for comment. Gulfstream would be the second South Florida track to be sold this year. Churchill Downs acquired Calder Race Course for a reported \$86 million in January.

### **Colonial Downs Retains OTB Licenses:**

Colonial Downs presented the Virginia Racing Commission with a newly inked agreement between the track and Virginia horsemen, averting the suspension of its OTB parlor licenses, according to the *Associated Press*. The deal allows the track to hold its 25-day meet in 1999 with purses in the amount of \$3.125 million, an average daily distribution of \$125,000. Five percent of the handle from Virginia's four OTB parlors would be deposited into prize money accounts for the meets to be held in 2000 and 2001, according to David Cook, chief negotiator for the Virginia Horsemen's Protective and Benevolent Association. The agreement still requires the approval of the Virginia Racing Commission, the *Associated Press* reported.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

#### **Pedigree Shorts**

By a remarkable coincidence, Running Stag's third dam Dalama also appears as the fourth dam of Daryaba (Ire) (f, 3, Night Shift--Darata {Ire}, by Vayrann {Ire}), winner of Sunday's G1 Prix de Diane Hermes. Daryaba was bred by His Highness the Aga Khan, whose runners are generally noted for some interesting inbreeding patterns, but Daryaba is a complete outcross at five generations.

Perhaps the mating was inspired by the fact that Daryaba's granddam is by Labus, a son of Busted. Busted appears in at least five of Night Shift's 43 stakes winners, including the very talented performers In the Groove, Nicolette and Eveningperformance. The Night Shift/Busted combination is really not that surprising as Night Shift seems to throw to the distaff side of his pedigree, particularly strains in his broodmare sire, Chop Chop (Flares--Sceptical, by Buchan {GB}). Busted carries the sire Black Devil, a close relative to Flares, and Busted's fourth dam Borrow is bred on a very similar cross to Sceptical. Incidentally, we would love to see Daryaba bred to the Aga Khan's stallion Darshaan when she retires to stud. This mating would give the three-quarters siblings Abdos and Dalama 3x5.

For owners of mares by Sadler's Wells (and his brothers Fairy King and Tate Gallery), note that the introduction of Never Bend over daughters of Sadler's Wells seems to work just as well the famous Sadler's Wells/Never Bend cross. There are already at least five stakes winners by stallions carrying Never Bend out of Sadler's Wells mares, and they include Silic (Fr) (c, 4, Sillery--Balletomane {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells), winner of Sunday's Gl! Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile S.

Show Me the Stage (f, 3, Slew the Surgeon-Showtime Lady by Defense Verdict), winner of Saturday's GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup H., is from a somewhat unheralded branch of the Seattle Slew male line. She is the first unrestricted stakes winner sired by Slew the Surgeon, who in turn is the only unrestricted stakes winner for his sire Slew the Bride, an unraced son of Seattle Slew.

It is intriguing to note that Slew the Bride is by a great-grandson of Seattle Slew out of Herecomesthe-bride, a granddaughter of the good tap-root mare Albany Isle, while Show Me the Stage's granddam Mink and Jeans is by a son of Bold Ruler out of a daughter of Albany Isle.
