The Aga Khan and trainer John Oxx have targeted this race since Enzeli ran fourth to Kayf Tara in the G1 Irish St. Leger in September. The colt has had two starts since, winning a Leopardstown handicap in November and the Listed Saval Beg S. at the same track May 19. Carrying the Aga's famous alternative colors of green and chocolate hoops and a chocolate cap, which were carried to victory by his sire Kahyasi (Ire) in the 1988 Epsom Derby, Enzeli was a most impressive winner. Solo Mio (Sadler's Wells) set a good pace from the outset and still had the call five furlongs out. With three furlongs to run, Kayf Tara began to challenge for the lead as Enzeli ran through smoothly to make his bid. The victor guickened away from his rivals 1 1/2 furlongs out and stayed on resolutely for a clear win, while Invermark finished strongly on the wide outside to claim second. The Aga Khan, enjoying a dream week after the successes of Daryaba (Ire) in Sunday's G1 Prix de Diane Hermes in France and Sendawar (Ire) in the G1 St. James's Palace S. here Tuesday, said, "Enzeli is on the upgrade and his dam Ebaziya has now bred three Group 1 winners, so the quality was there." Oxx said the July 29 G2 Goodwood Cup or the Oct. 2 G1 Prix du Cadran at Longchamp could be next on tap for Enzeli.

Staying was the name of the game here and Fairy Queen was one of the fillies whose stamina had been in doubt, but she proved her detractors wrong, staying on bravely to score for the fourth time in five starts. Winner of both her starts as a juvenile, she made her seasonal debut in the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3 and led for six furlongs before fading to finish 10th. A month later, she bounced back to lead from wire-to-wire in the Listed Victress S. at Epsom June 4. Fictitious (Machiavellian) would not settle for Gary Stevens, and after a half-mile had gone into a clear lead with Fairy Queen settled towards the rear. Fictitious still led around the final turn, but was soon swallowed up by the hard-ridden Samoa, with Alabaq appearing to be cruising while Fairy Queen made smooth progress to join the two leaders. Samoa still led entering the final furlong, but Fairy Queen would not be denied, staying on resolutely for the win. "We knew that a mile and a quarter would not present Fairy Queen with a problem, but we didn't know about the mile and a half," said Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. Trainer Saeed bin Suroor said, "This filly is very relaxed at home, but gets worked up at the races. But she ran very well today. The Guineas distance may have been too short for her and she has certainly liked the mile and a half today."

This superb front-running effort gained Bold Edge his first Group race success, which followed a win in the Listed Abernant S. at Newmarket Apr. 13 and a dismal effort in the G3 Duke Of York S. May 13, when he finished only eighth. Smartly away on the outside of the field, Bold Edge was always in command, finding another gear at the furlong marker to go clear and win handsomely. His trainer Richard Hannon, whose stable is on the crest of a wave at present, was grateful for the fast ground. "This ground is vital for him, he just has to have it on top, and in fact, the firmer the better. He has blistering speed when things are right for him." Quizzed about the horse's failure at York, he continued, "He got very upset in the stalls before the race and could never get into the race, and anyway it was much too soft for him that day." Russian Revival's trainer John Gosden felt that the six furlongs was just too short for his horse. "Ascot should put on a 6 1/2-furlong race for him," he joked. "He wants 6 1/2 furlongs or an easy seven, this six is just a shade too short for him, but he ran a great race. He will now go for the [G1] Prix Maurice de Gheest over 6 1/2 furlongs at Deauville [Aug. 8]. Being a good-looking son of Nureyev and a horse who never runs a bad race, he should have a great future as a stallion next year."

The betting suggested that Warm Heart and Victory Day would dominate this event and so it proved, with the former, winner of a June 2 Newcastle maiden in his only other start, gaining the day. Always in the front rank, Victory Day grabbed the lead two furlongs out with Warm Heart close up on the outside. While Victory Day was hard-ridden to maintain his advantage entering the final furlong, Warm Heart always appeared to have his measure, cruised up to take the lead inside the final furlong and was ridden out hands and heels to score comfortably, persuading bookmakers to quote him as a 40-1 shot for next year's 2000 Guineas. Winning trainer John Gosden said, "I was a little worried about the ground as horses by Diesis tend to do better when it is softer. I told [jockey] Frankie [Dettori] to tuck in behind either Victory Day or Asanova, but he told me they went so fast that he couldn't do that. This is a lovely horse and I'll freshen him up and bring him back for the [G2] Richmond S. at Goodwood [July 281."
