FRUITS OF LOVE OVERCOMES ACCIDENT FOR ROYAL ASCOT WIN Fruits of Love (Hansel), who escaped serious injury after flipping himself in a horse van on the way back from Heathrow Airport Apr. 1, proved to be none the worse for the experience after taking yesterday's G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot. The colt, returning after a victory in Dubai, was riding along the M25 motorway on his way to trainer Mark Johnston's Yorkshire stable when he managed to get his front legs on top of the stall partition, then flipped over on his back. "He ended up upside down in his horsebox," said Johnston. "The brave vet had to sit between his front legs and put a catheter in his jugular to give him a fluid anaesthetic before the fire brigade cut out the interior of the horsebox and winched him out. He was taken to the Royal Vet College, where he had a few stitches in his head, but apart from that nothing else." The four-year-old flew from the back of the pack to win the Hardwicke going away by three lengths as a 12-1 longshot. (Hardwicke Chart, p3)

Another surprise winner for Royal Ascot 1999, although not to owner/trainer Terry Mills, who has conjured sensational improvement out of his hitherto handicapper Mitcham. The three-year-old progressed from an unlucky fifth in the Listed Vodafone 'Dash' S. at Epsom June 5 to win this Group 2 sprint from some of the best speedsters in Europe. He also benefitted from a brilliantly patient ride from Richard Quinn, who was just returning from a suspension. French contender Sainte Marine was slow from the stalls, but made up the lost ground to grab the lead after two furlongs from Flanders and Lochangel (Night Shift), with Mitcham well in the rear behind a scorching pace. The three leaders were still neck-andneck entering the final furlong as Flanders, along the rail, began to assert her superiority and Mitcham looked for running room. Quinn took the gamble of not switching to the outside and losing valuable ground and waited for the gap to come, which it did in the shadow of the wire, and Mitcham squeezed alongside Flanders, who had wandered off the rail, for the narrow victory. "I had a feeling about Mitcham today and backed him at 20-1," said Mills. "He got kicked at Epsom last time and the ground was too soft. This is the first time he'd had fast ground all season. He needs covering up until the final furlong and then produces late. He thinks he's done enough when he sees daylight." Flanders' trainer Tim Easterby was bitterly disappointed. "She had it won everywhere but on the line," he lamented. "That bloody post just did not come soon enough. She has not been right for most of the season, but she has really started to come right and will improve for this. She may well go to Goodwood for the [G3] Grosvenor Casinos S. July 27." That may be the next target for Lochangel, whose trainer lan Balding said, "The high draw and her Group 1 penalty have done for her today, though I did think she was coming to win a furlong and a half out."

Fruits of Love became the story of Royal Ascot 1999 with this impressive victory, which followed a neartragic accident Apr. 1 when he was returning from winning the Dubai Turf Classic (see News Today). Coming off a poor sixth-place showing in the G1 Coronation Cup June 4, he gained his second Group 2 victory, following last year's Princess Of Wales's S. The colt showed that, on his day, he is one of the best in Europe. Settled in the rear by rider Olivier Peslier while Sunshine Street (Sunshine Forever) and Sadian (Shirley Heights {GB}) vied for the lead ahead of Royal Anthem, Fruits of Love was nowhere to be seen until the final quarter mile. Sunshine Street briefly had the call entering the straight, but he was soon passed by Royal Anthem, who looked the probable winner. Peslier, however, had timed his run to perfection and Fruits of Love swooped late to score with ease. "When he ran in the Coronation Cup, there was absolutely no pace and the race was almost a waste of time from our point of view," said trainer Mark Johnston. "I now want to run him in the [G1] King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot [July 24]." Henry Cecil suffered two disappointments--the withdrawal of his filly Silver Rhapsody before the start when she refused to enter the gate, and the defeat of Royal Anthem. "Maybe this race came too soon for Royal Anthem after his good run in the Coronation Cup," he said. "That was his first run for a long time. He will have a longer break now and hopefully will be firing properly for the King George in July, which remains very much on his agenda."

He had to quicken twice, once to get to the front and then to stay there. I think he is a class act." Frankie Dettori was equally enthusiastic, saying, "I liked him a lot last year and he gave me a really good feel when he won at Doncaster. I thought he was my best ride today and I'm glad he showed what a decent horse he is."
