LUKAS SUSPENDED 10 DAYS Hall of Fame trainer D. Wayne Lukas was suspended 10 days by Churchill Downs stewards Sunday, according to a report in yesterday's Louisville *Courier-Journal*. The suspension was handed down after the Lukas-trained Dance Master came up positive for the drug benzenemethanol after a race May 16. After a hearing Sunday, Lukas was given the minimum sentence and he will not appeal the decision. The suspension will run from July 6-15. Benzenemethanol is used to treat minor breathing problems and skin diseases. Lukas was not in Kentucky for the May 16 race in which Dance Master ran second. The two-year-old, who subsequently broke his maiden on the Belmont S. undercard June 5, was disqualified from the purse money of the Kentucky race.

# HOME IS WHERE THE HORSE IS By Bill Handleman

Sidney Underwood's mother thought she should come home to Alabama, go back to school, get a degree. Her friends thought she was out of her mind, wanting to train horses for a living--and they're race-track people themselves.

"They'd say, 'What are you, crazy? This business ain't goin' nowhere,'" she recalls. "But where would I go, why would I want to go back to school? I left school once because I couldn't stand it, why would I go back again?"

So she stayed where she felt she belonged, on the racetrack. She may have been a debutante in Alabama 20 years ago, but as far as she was concerned fancy dresses and cotillions had nothing on faded jeans and cold, damp mornings on the backside.

As for actually getting to train race horses, well, that was better than being crowned belle of the ball any day. Especially on days when your horse wins and pays \$42.40. Like Victory Bash did on Memorial Day at Monmouth Park. Even if was only a \$5,000 claiming race, bottom of the barrel at Monmouth.

Sidney Underwood is 36 years old now. She has been training horses since September of 1997. Before that she was a clocker for a brief time. Before that she was sitting at home in a wheelchair, trying to remain upbeat. This was hard. The longer she went without work, the harder it got, too. Then after a while she found herself contemplating how lousy life was, entertaining dark thoughts, and smoking a lot of cigarettes.

She is in a wheelchair because on the night of June 19, 1992, the horse she was riding at Atlantic City Race Course got spooked by a shadow and threw her head-first onto the track. The kind of spill that makes you wince and turn your head, instinctively.

She was paralyzed from the middle of her abdomen down, she would never walk again and by 1995 she was losing it altogether. She couldn't pay her bills. She was getting \$115 a week in workman's compensation, \$93 a month in social security, and her claim that the poor lighting at Atlantic City caused the accident was dragging on and on.

"I was a year and a half behind on my property taxes, I was in foreclosure, and I was either gonna get a gun and blow my brains out, or wind up in a rubber room...but my lawyer kept saying, 'Look, they can't throw a paralyzed girl out on the street.'"

She began spending her mornings at Garden State Park, which is just around the corner from the modest house where she still lives. She was trying her hand at clocking horses, picking up a few bucks here and there the hardest way imaginable.

"I have nothing but admiration for those guys now," she says. "I'll never dog-cuss 'em again. You get trainers coming up to you saying, 'Why didn't you get this?' and 'Why didn't you get that?' And you're thinking, 'Gee, I don't know, there were only 27 of 'em breaking off at the same time, I don't know how I could've missed your horse.'"

Underwood's days as a clocker lasted through one cold winter and part of the spring at Garden State. Then, after five years of being dragging through the judicial system, she finally got a satisfactory settlement from Atlantic City Race Course.

First thing she did, she went out and got her license and claimed a horse from trainer Juan Serey, a \$5,000 filly named Jersey Gold.

Jersey Gold won for her new trainer first time off the claim. Next time out Serey's owner insisted on claiming her back. Underwood then took that money and sank it into Stokes State, an ornery old gelding nobody wanted.

Lo and behold, Stokes State starts winning. He wins a \$10,000 claiming race for Jersey-breds. He wins a \$12,000 race for Jersey-breds. He runs second in open company against \$16,000 claimers. Back in with Jersey-breds, he wins next time out for \$16,000.

"He's the reason I live and breathe and eat," says Underwood. "He's an eight-year-old gelding and he'll be mine forever and ever. Last summer Scott Lake came here and claimed him. I couldn't believe it. I'm going, 'Have they lost their ever-lovin' mind? What moron would buy him for \$16,000?'

"I was crying my eyes out. I had to go and call my mom, I had to talk to somebody who loved me. Then I go and try to buy him back, and the owner's hiding from me.

"But when they tried to load the horse on the van, he wouldn't go, they can't get him on the van. That's when they decided they might think about selling him back to me. And the guys who were trying to load him on the van actually came over and thanked me."

Then she punctuates her story with the kind of laugh you would never hear at a coming-out party in Huntsville, Alabama.

Sidney Underwood knows where home is, no matter what family and friends might think. Home is where Stokes State is, where Victory Bash is.
