OLD TRIESTE TO MISS GOLD CUP Cobra Farm's Old Trieste (A.P. Indy), the likely favorite in Sunday's GI Sempra Energy Hollywood Gold Cup, has been declared from the race with a recurrence of a foot abscess that kept the chestnut out of the GII Strub S. over the winter. Trainer Mike Puype indicated that recent blood tests administered to the four-year-old showed erratic white blood cell counts, and his worst fears were confirmed during a routine inspection of the colt on Tuesday. "He was facing backwards and I knew something was wrong, my heart sank to my knees," said Puype. "We took his temperature and it was 103 degrees." Puype went on to say that the temperature is a direct result of the infection to the foot and that the problem will be remedied by trimming the foot and soaking it repeatedly. Owner Gary Bisantz deemed the injury a "temporary setback" and said that races such as the GI Pacific Classic, Breeders' Cup Classic and the Cigar Mile are not out of the question for the rest of the year. The defection of Old Trieste leaves a field of four for the \$1 million race: Real Quiet (Quiet American), Budroyale (Cee's Tizzy); Puerto Madero (Chi) (Gallantsky); and Malek (Chi) (Mocito Guapo {Arg}).

BELMONT FIRE KILLS THREE HORSES A fire of suspicious origin tore through the barn 8 annex at Belmont Park Tuesday evening, killing three horses. According to investigators, a dog brought in to sniff the area detected a foreign substance that could have been used to ignite a fire. Joseph Saudo, an investigator for the Nassau County Fire Marshall's office, reported that the substance has been taken to a lab to be analyzed. Saudo said test results may not be available until Tuesday. Saudo added that the substance could have been the type of rubbing alcohol used to treat horse's legs, which could have been spilled in the area. Caesar Kimmel's Clear to Launch was euthanized as a result of his injuries as was an unraced two-year-old Dixieland Band filly owned by John and Joan Phillips. A third horse, Sureley Handsome, owned by Kimmel and Ron Nicholson, was treated by Dr. Stephen Selway and returned to his stall later in the evening, but died yesterday as a result of lung damage caused by smoke inhalation. All three horses were trained by James Toner. Despite the three deaths there was some sense of relief yesterday because the incident could have been far worse. The sprinkler system and fire alarms worked perfectly and the Elmont Fire Department and NYRA security were on the scene within seconds to keep things under control.

Ascot Notes

The Royal Ascot meeting has a unique concentration of group and stakes races, with 16 black-type events contested over four days and two more stakes on Saturday's Ascot Heath meeting. Inevitably, it throws up some interesting pedigrees and a brief review of some of the more notable patterns follows below.

Surprise winner of the G2 King's Stand S. was Mit-cham (Ire) (c, 3, Hamas {Ire}--Arab Scimeter {Ire}, by Sure Blade). He is yet another good winner whose pedigree combines Danzig (sire of Hamas) and Sharpen Up (GB). The key: Felstead (GB), the sire of Danzig's third dam Steady Aim (GB) and of Rockfel (GB), the dam of Sharpen Up's broodmare sire Rockefeller (GB).

G2 King Edward VII S. victor Mutafaweq (c, 3, Silver Hawk--The Caretaker {Ire}, by Caerleon) is an improving sort who earned his place in the Irish Derby field with this win. Mutafaweq is another example of the very successful combination of Roberto and Nijinsky II, and the same cross appears in the pedigree of the G3 Queen Mary S. heroine Shining Hour (f, 2, Red Ransom--Timely {Ire}, by King's Lake). The key is probably that Roberto's granddam Rarelea is a genetic relative to Bull Page, Nijinsky's broodmare sire. Shining Hour is also inbred 3x4 to Damascus and 4x5 to Nearctic.

Fairy Queen (f, 3, Fairy King--Dedicated Lady {Ire}, by Pennine Walk {Ire}) showed herself a potential Irish Oaks contender with a win in the G2 Ribblesdale S. Pennine Walk is out of a mare by Thatch, so Fairy Queen has the full-siblings Special (granddam of Fairy King) and Thatch 3x4.

We are seeing a growing amount of success for the combination of Storm Bird with his genetic relatives Nijinsky and The Minstrel. The latest beneficiary is Storm Bird's son Bluebird, who sired the recent G3 Prix de Sandringham victress Ronda (GB) (f, 3, Bluebird--Memory's Gold, by Java Gold). Ronda carries Nijinsky as he is the broodmare sire of Java Gold. Bluebird was also represented by The Queen's Holly Blue (GB) (f, 3, Bluebird--Nettle {GB}, by Kris {GB}), successful in the Saturday's London Clubs Fern Hill H. at Ascot. Holly Blue's second dam is by The Minstrel, which gives Storm Bird/The Minstrel 2x4. Another Ascot stakes winner on Saturday was Zarfoot (c, 3, Zafonic {GB}--Harefoot {GB}, by Rainbow Quest), winner of the Milcars New S. He combines the three-parts related Tom Fool and Spring Run with their genetic relative Flaming Page.

The \$725,000 KEEAPR juvenile purchase, sent off at 3-1, rated just off the pace and rallied wide, drew clear in midstretch and gamely prevailed over favored Antitrust (Affirmed) by 1 3/4 lengths. John Long was named yesterday to the post of Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer for Churchill Downs Inc. and will oversee the management, operations and planning for all of the company's race-tracks. From 1993 to March 1999, Long served as the president and COO for Ladbroke/USA and was heavily involved in the London-based company's North American racing and gaming operations. Said Long, "Churchill Downs is a leader in the Thoroughbred industry and the company's expansion presents exciting opportunities. I look forward to being instrumental in these efforts and to being a part of such a widely respected company." Long will assume his new duties effective July 6.

Gallop, 'Bullet Top Churchill Tab:

Out for his first serious work since his victory in the GII Stephen Foster H. June 12, Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance) breezed an easy four furlongs in :50 4/5 under regular exercise rider Shannon Ritter over the fast track. Trainer Elliott Walden has indicated that the four-year-old's next start is likely to come in the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga Aug. 1. Kentucky Oaks winner Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy), seventh in the Belmont S. in her last start, had her second workout since the race, recording a bullet five furlongs in 1:00 1/5. The Champion filly, who was considered for this weekend's GI Vanity H. at Hollywood, will instead contest the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks July 10.

Killer Instinct to America:

The Thoroughbred Corporation's Killer Instinct (GB) (Zafonic) will run his last race in Britain in the John Smith's Cup at York July 10 before being shipped to Alex Hassinger's California stable, yesterday's *Racing Post* reported. The three-year-old broke his maiden by six lengths at Nottingham in May before finishing fourth in the G1 St. James' Palace S. at Royal Ascot after nearly falling at the top of the stretch. He will be pointed for the Sept. 6 GII Del Mar Derby, according to the report.

Main Track, Barn Areas Upgraded At Del Mar:

The Del Mar Thoroughbred Club will unveil revamped facilities and a brand new racing surface when the Southern California track opens for its meeting July 22. A total of \$2.5 million was spent on off-season projects, \$600,000 of which was used to renovate the Del Mar main track. The barn areas have also been upgraded as well as all of the 592 living quarters. A new 34-stall barn has been constructed which replaces the second half of the old "E" barn. "Our horsemen will like what they see when they come to Del Mar this summer," said Del Mar Thoroughbred Club president and general manager Joe Harper. "The new track will be kind to their horses and the backstretch upgrades should make life quite a bit more pleasant for both horses and help."

Oath Out of, Montjeu Questionable for Irish Derby:

Oath (Ire) (Fairy King), the Vodafone Derby winner, will miss the Irish equivalent at The Curragh this Sunday after failing to sparkle in a workout yesterday morning. The Thoroughbred Corporation-owned colt disappointed trainer Henry Cecil on the Newmarket gallops and is set to wait for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 24. Willie Carson, European racing manager to the owners, said, "We have to say he is a non-runner because he worked moderately. It is very disappointing. I suppose the next race will be the King George as long as he is all right. Horses are horses and not machines. It is just as well he has gone off a few days before the race and not on the day--that would have been even worse." Cecil added, "I've been thrilled with Oath up to now but today just for some reason in his final piece of work he was uninspiring. But I'm sure he will be back to normal in a few days." Trainer John Hammond has issued a warning that if the ground continues to be firm, G1 Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) winner Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) will not run. "We are keen to run the horse and he's due to fly over on Saturday," said Hammond. "However, at this time of the year, race-courses tend to dry out very rapidly. I will, therefore, leave a final decision until as late as possible. Even if he is at the track, and the ground is against him, he won't run."

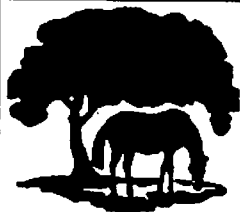
