RERAISE OUT FOR YEAR The 1998 Sprint Champion Reraise (Danzatore) will be sidelined for a year after suffering a tendon injury during training, according to a report in *Daily Racing Form*. After he was withdrawn from Sunday's Triple Bend Invitational Breeders' Cup H., trainer Crag Dollase said his charge had strained a tendon. "It's not as severe as we thought it was," Dollase told the *Form*. "This year's over. We will know more in a month when we do another scan." The four-year-old gelding capped his championship season with a victory in last year's Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Silver Ghost has never been one of the most fashionable stallions, and for most of his career--especially the early part--has covered modest mares. Despite that, he has not only achieved a very creditable strike rate with 26 stakes winners from his first 266 foals (better than nine percent), but he has also had the ability to get "the big horse" such as millionaire Silver Goblin, Grade I winners Lunar Spook and Love Lock and GII Swaps S. winner Silver Music.

Silver Ghost's three-year-old daughter Dreams Gallore has been working hard to join that group, but in her three most recent starts had run into first Excellent Meeting and then twice into Silverbulletday, chasing that filly home in both the GI Kentucky Oaks and GII Black-Eyed Susan S. In Saturday's GI Mother Goose S., Dreams Gallore received a just reward for her recent bold efforts by dominating from the head of the stretch to win by 7 1/2 lengths.

Dreams Gallore is a member of a family which has already been working well with sons of Silver Ghost's sire Mr. Prospector. Her granddam Mrs. Hat produced stakes winner Mrs. West to the cover of Gone West, and Mrs. Hat's three-quarters sister Lastcomer (by Kris) is the granddam of stakes winner Vernoy (by Forty Niner). Dream's Gallore's broodmare sire Fit to Fight (Chieftain--Hasty Queen II, by One Count) has connections to the distaff side of both Gone West and Forty Niner since he is by a son of Bold Ruler (grandsire of the dam of Gone West) and Chieftain (Bold Ruler-Pocahontas, by Roman) is also a half brother to Forty Niner's broodmare sire Tom Rolfe. Batuka Wins Peruvian Triple Crown:

Batuka (Bates Motel) captured the Peruvian Triple Crown with a 1 1/4-length victory in Sunday's G1 Classic XCVII Derby Nacional at Monterrico Racecourse. Batuka became the first filly to win the country's derby in 40 years. Bred by Michael Riordan, the Kentucky-bred is owned by John T. L. Jones, Jr., Smoot Fahlgren, William Heiligbrodt, Robert Folson and Glen Brommagen. Batuka will now attempt to become the second horse in history to complete the Quadruple Crown by winning the Aug. 29 G1 Gran Premio Nacional-Augusto B. Leguia. Should she win that race, she would earn a \$200,000 bonus.

Nebos Dead at 23:

Leading German sire Nebos (Ger) (Caro {Ire}) was humanely destroyed in a clinic following severe heart problems, it was reported yesterday. The 23-year-old stallion was Horse of the Year in Germany in 1980 and his 12 career wins include the G1 Grosser Preis von Baden. Nebos's last station as a sire was Gestüt Westerberg in Ingleheim. To date, he has sired the winners of nearly 900 races and 11 individual pattern winners, including German Derby winners Laroche and Lebos and Austrian Derby winner Zinntaler. He also sired four winners of the G2 German St Leger, Prairie Neba, Gondola, Pinot and First Hello.

Betting Records Fall at The Curragh:

A total of Ir£396,613 (\$528,676) was handled by on-course bookmakers for Sunday's Budweiser Irish Derby, a record for an individual race in Ireland, the *Racing Post* reports. The total betting figure for the three-day meeting amounted to Ir£3.39 (\$4.52) million, up 20 percent on the 1998 figure of Ir£2.82 (\$3.76) million. Attendance on Derby Day itself was 27,391, up slightly against 1998.

THE FORTY NINER PHENOMENON By Bronwyn Farr

Last season just one son of fast-emerging sire of sires Forty Niner stood in Australia--the moderately performed Inflate (Forty Niner--Add {Spectacular Bid}), whose fee remains set this year at just AUS\$6,500 (US\$4,187). This year, we're spoilt for choice with four Forty Niner sire sons here--and Inflate's Australian owners are laughing all the way to the bank as they ride a crest of publicity about glamour trio End Sweep (Forty Niner--Broom Dance {Dance Spell}), who will stand for AUS\$25,000 (\$16,420) at Arrowfield; Widden Stud's Gold Fever (Forty Niner--Lead Kindly Light {Majestic Light}), who will stand for AUS\$15,000 (\$9,852); and Distorted Humor (Forty Niner--Danzig's Beauty {Danzig}), who will alternate between Victoria and South Australia at AUS\$12,000 (\$7,882).

New Zealand breeder David Hallam is another early comer to the Forty Niner phenomenon, having bred the highest-priced Gold Fever youngster to go under the hammer to date. Hallam sold a weanling colt from the mare Miss Sobriety for US\$95,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale.

Inflate, from the Spectacular Bid mare Add, slipped in unheralded to the small Victorian stud Emerald Park, where he covered 60 mares at AUS\$5,500 (\$3,612) last season. "He is by far the best-bred Forty Niner here as his second dam is a three-quarter sister to Nureyev and a sister in blood to Yeats, and she foaled Jade Robbery, a leading Japanese sire," boasts studmaster Chris Gibson. "Where it gets really interesting is that his third dam Special is a half sister to Geiger Counter and she is the dam of Nureyev and Fairy Bridge, the dam of Sadler's Wells and Tate Gallery and that whole family. The top eight stallions in the world last year are all in his pedigree. We bought him because of his female line. At the time, nobody in Australia was taking much notice of Forty Niner as a sire of sires and of course all that changed when he had three sons in the top 10 first crop stallions in the US last season," says Gibson, who is far from dismayed that Inflate will compete against a glittering Forty Niner trio this season. "I will be very surprised if Inflate doesn't get 100 mares this year,' he says. "Every time another Forty Niner comes down, we get just as much publicity."

Gibson continued, "Inflate ran some really good times. And the best thing is that he's not syndicated. A group of us bought him from the people who raced him the US."

End Sweep, bought from Mockingbird Farm in February, broke Lawmaker's record with 33 juvenile winners from his first crop and his book is full. End Sweep, who will shuttle to Shadai Stallion Station in Japan, will cover about 100 mares.

Then Widden Stud, its roster depleted with Barathea (Ire) and Belong To Me staying at home this season, announced in mid-May that Gold Fever would shuttle from Lane's End Farm in Kentucky. Widden Stud's Antony Thompson says he "desperately wanted" Gold Fever and within an hour of his launch the phones were running hot. "The initial reception to him has been excellent and we already have a number of Northern Dancer mares booked to him. As he is completely free of Northern Dancer, he is an ideal outcross."

Victorian stud Grand Lodge secured Distorted Humor, who will stand in a joint venture between Lakewood in South Australia, Muranna Stud and Grand Lodge. Grand Lodge's Peter Anastasiou says: "We would argue Distorted Humor is the fastest Forty Niner here and one of the reasons we like him is that, as he's the only Forty Niner from a Danzig mare, he offers breeders with Danehill mares a line-breeding opportunity."

Dreams Gallore follows C. C. On Ice and Abajo as the third unrestricted stakes winner by a Mr. Prospector-line sire out of a Fit to Fight mare, and there are an additional seven unrestricted stakes winners (four graded) by Mr. Prospector and his sons out of Chieftain mares, which represents a stronger affinity than exists between Mr. Prospector and Bold Ruler-line mares in general. Looking at the reverse cross Fit to Fight has sired one of his best runners, graded stakes winner Fight For Love, out of a mare by Mr. Prospector.

If there is going to be an affinity between Mr. Prospector and Fit to Fight, it won't come as too much of a surprise from a pedigree standpoint as the pair have a somewhat similar genetic background. Both Mr. Prospector's dam Gold Digger and Fit to Fight are bred on a Nasrullah/Count Fleet cross. Fit to Fight is inbred 3x3 to the influential sire Sir Gallahad III's son Roman, whereas Mr. Prospector's third dam is a daughter of Sir Gallahad III's full brother Bull Dog. Finally, Fit to Fight's broodmare sire One Count is out of Ace Card, a mare bred on a similar Case Ace/Man o' War cross to that found in Raise You, the dam of Mr. Prospector's sire Raise a Native.

PEDIGREE SHORTS:

The GII Bashford Manor S. winner Dance Master (c, 2, Gone West--Nijinsky's Lover, by Nijinsky II) has a textbook pedigree. He has Raise a Native 3x3 through a sire in the male line and a daughter in the female line, the three-parts genetic relatives Secretariat (broodmare sire of Gone West) and Bold Lad 3x4 and the Tom Fool/Flaming Page combination (Tom. Fool coming through Tim Tam, who is bred on a reverse Menow/Bull Lea cross to Flaming Page). Incidentally, although Gone West has enjoyed tremendous success with mares by Nijinsky's three-quarters brother The Minstrel, Dance Master is the first stakes winner he has sired out of a Nijinsky mare. Still, Gone West stakes winners Link River, Dance Parade and Pulsatilla all have second dams by Nijinsky, so perhaps it was just a matter of time.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a + will denote winners who are first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

Mazel Trick (c. 4, Phone Trick--Mazatleca {Mex}, by Ramahorn), who shattered the track record when winning the GII Triple Bend Invitational Breeders' Cup H. at Hollywood Park, has a very clever pedigree. His sire Phone Trick is out of a mare by Finnegan (by Royal Charger out of a daughter of the excellent tap-root mare Nellie Flag. Mazel Trick's broodmare sire is by Dewan, who is by a son of Nasrullah (three-quarters brother to Royal Charger) out of a daughter of Nellie Flag and therefore very closely related to Finnegan. This is not the first time a similar pattern has worked for Phone Trick. His graded stakes winners Prank Call and All Chatter both go back to Nellie Flag in direct female line.

The weekend was an excellent one for the modestly priced sires Tricky Creek and American Chance. Tricky Creek was represented by the Full of Drive S. winner Eejay (c, 3, Tricky Creek--Rated P. G., by Silent Screen) and Twinkle Creek (f, 3, Tricky Creek--Virginia Rose, by Star de Naskra) who captured the My Dear S. at Woodbine. Twinkle Creek is the product of a smart mating, having the three-quarters siblings Flower Bowl (dam of Tricky Creek's broodmare sire His Majesty) and Your Host 4x5.

Second-year sire American Chance was represented by Klondike H. winner American Justice (c, 3, American Chance--Legal Miss, by Law Society) and by Great Sound S. victor American Halo (c, 3, American Chance--Halos Star, by Halo), this pair being the second and third stakes winners for their sire. American Justice's pedigree cleverly reinforces a proven affinity. Her broodmare sire Law Society is a product of the successful Alleged/Boldnesian nick, and the mating gives inbreeding to Boldnesian through a son and a daughter as well as introducing a daughter strain of Boldnesian's sire Bold Ruler.

Red Ransom's Irish-based son Sri Pekan has made a promising start at stud with his initial juvenile runners, and he was represented by his first stakes winner when Hoh Dear (f, 2, Sri Pekan--Miss Kristin, by Alzao) won the High Havens Empress S. at Newmarket. One of the notable things about Sri Pekan is that he is free of Northern Dancer, but has a daughter of that horse's sire, Nearctic. This is going to make him particularly useful in Europe where Northern Dancer's influence is at near saturation point. To underline the point, we can note that Hoh Dear's dam is inbred 2x3 to Northern Dancer's son Lyphard.
