The impeccably bred chestnut, consigned by Gainsborough, was knocked down to Charlie Gordon-Watson after a prolonged bidding battle with John Needham of Elmhurst Bloodstock. The previous July Sales record price was 115,000gns (\$193,510) in 1988. While only one session was held on the first day of the 1998 sale, two sessions were held yesterday. The average rose 126 percent compared to last year's figure. The median rose 65 percent.

Racing for the first time this year having rounded off last year with a win in a conditions event at Doncaster, Nov. 6, Craigsteel added a first Group win to a solitary Listed success when winning in track-record breaking fashion. Racing in second as stablemate Capri (GB) (Generous {Ire}) set a strong pace, Craigsteel raced in advance of favored Sea Wave (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Silver Rhapsody. As Capri began to fade, Craigsteel took up the running, striding out well with three furlongs to run. Sea Wave went in pursuit in second, followed by Silver Rhapsody but Craigsteel galloped relentlessly onward without showing signs of stopping. He was two lengths clear at the furlong marker where Arctic Owl came from the pack to deliver a challenge. Craigsteel ran on resolutely and passed the line a deserved winner as Arctic Owl never managed to get on terms. Silver Rhapsody, another Henry Cecil inmate kept on well to deprive Sea Wave of third. Winning trainer Cecil explained: "He will now go for the (G2) Geoffrey Freer S. (at Newbury, Aug. 14). He is a good horse but this was only his first run of the year because he has had a lot of problems with his feet, suffering from quarter cracks and so on. He does need give in the ground and that was a very good performance."

The sun-drenched crowd on the Newmarket July course were treated to a vintage Gary Stevens ride, leading from pillar to post for his first course win on the 12-1 chance Torgau. In her previous start, the filly recovered from a slow start to finish a good sixth in the June 16 G3 Queen Mary S. at Royal Ascot. There were no such problems at the start here as Torgau broke well and won unchallenged in impressive fashion. As the field raced towards the final quarter, Torgau skipped into a two-length lead as favored Hoh Dear went in pursuit. Running on strongly Torgau never looked in any danger as Stevens gave a somewhat surprised look over his shoulder as his mount passed the post unchallenged. An understandably delighted Giles Bravery, with only nine horses in his Newmarket stable, said: "My only instructions to the jockey were 'Good Luck.' It's amazing, incredible even, that he could go out on a horse not having ridden the course much and lead on her like that. The man (Gary Stevens) is a an incredible talent as the world knows. I don't suppose I can use him again, we've got such a good record together (1 for 1), why ruin it? Training racehorses is unbelievably idiotic. You lose all your money, which you may not have had anyway, you are owned by the banks, you never get enough horses and no one ever pays you. Then, once in about six years, you have a day like today and you've got to say that is what makes it all worthwhile. It's fantastic.



## BECKER BACK WHERE HE BELONGS By Andy Belfiore

Trainer Mike Becker shouldn't be anywhere near a racehorse. The metal rods which hold his spine together just aren't made to handle a hard knock from a thousand-pound animal.

"If a horse gets to playing around and bumps me accidentally, I could be on the operating table that night," he said.

Despite that fact, Becker, now 40, has five horses at Monmouth Park this summer. He has worked with harness horses and thoroughbreds since high school. Seven years ago, he was headed home after another morning at Pompano Raceway in Florida when an 18-wheeler ran a red light, smashing into him as he drove through the intersection. He is lucky to be alive. "The accident pretty much destroyed my lower back," Becker said. "The last five discs in my lower back were crushed."

Miraculously, Becker was not immediately paralyzed. But his condition deteriorated after the accident and he found himself on the operating table.

"It got to the point where I couldn't walk," he said. "I knew I was in bad shape. I had the first surgery in March of '93.

"The second surgery, in October, didn't go as planned. Afterwards, I was paralyzed. I lost (the use of) both my arms."

Doctors had told him there was about "a 500,000,000-to-1" chance that this would happen. At first, they thought his arms, which had been raised over his head during the operation, had just fallen asleep. It turned out the nerves to his arms had been deprived of oxygen during the surgery.

"It took a year before I could be by myself in my house," he said. "But I was lucky. Nobody guaranteed I would get better. I had great doctors and nurses and therapists and everybody worked real hard."

But it wasn't just his arms that Becker wanted back. He wanted to return to the racetrack. "I wanted to be back with the horses--I didn't care what it took," he said. "All my life I'd been getting up at 5 a.m., coming to the track, working seven days. When that was taken away, it was like taking my breath away."

As part of his rehabilitation, Becker, a native of northern New Jersey, volunteered at the Winslow Therapeutic Riding Academy in Warwick, New York, which offers physical therapy on horseback for kids with problems.

"It was the only way the doctors would let me near a horse," he said. "I was a volunteer, but I also had a selfish goal, to see if I could work with horses again. I wasn't sure I could pick up a brush.

"The kids scared me I was afraid I would do something wrong and maybe get them hurt. But they would just come up and take me by the hand. I cried the first day I was there. I call it God's workshop, and I always told them I would try to pay them back for their help."

It wasn't long before Becker had that chance. He won a lawsuit against the trucking company which was involved in the accident. Dick Kumble, his financial advisor, became a good friend as well. The two decided to buy a racehorse together.

That horse was Influent. Before he ever started for his new owners, Becker pledged 2 percent of his winnings to the Winslow Academy. A \$54,000 purchase, Influent went on to win six stakes races and more than \$850,000.

"We thought he'd be a nice \$30,000 claimer," Becker laughed. "But with the money from Influent, Winslow was able to buy land and build a barn. They had been turning away about 500 kids a year...for the next 10 years, about 5,000 kids will benefit from what Influent did."

Sadly, Dick Kumble died just before Influent's last race, a victory in the 1997 Grade 1 Man o'War at Belmont Park. Influent was injured while training for his comeback last fall and was retired. That's when Becker decided it was time to train on his own.

The trainer still isn't 100 percent. "I don't have the strength I used to have, and I'm always in pain, but there is stuff I can do today that I couldn't do yesterday," he said.

He relies on "his arms and hands," Monica Lockridge and Barbara Stevens, to do much of the work.

The charity work also continues. Matt Cooper, a Make A Wish "kid," owns 5 percent of one of Becker's horses, Atawhirl. Winslow gets 3 percent of all of his horses earnings through the Dick Kumble Memorial Fund. Influent has been donated to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation and will be at the opening of their new facility in Kentucky this fall.

Becker, who had a solid meet at Turfway over the winter, hitting the board with nine of his 12 starters and winning three races, is off to a slow start at Monmouth. He'd like to pick up an owner or two. But after all he has been through, it doesn't get Becker down.

He's not Lou Gehrig surrounded by fans at Yankee Stadium, just a guy surrounded by his horses on the Monmouth backstretch, but he insists, "I'm the luckiest person on the face of the earth."

# WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

Coming into the GI Beverly Hills H., the Brazilian filly Virginie had won eight of her nine starts. Her only defeat had been behind the pro tem divisional leader Tranquility Lake, who beat her into second in the GII Santa Barbara H. At the weekend, however, Virginie reversed that result by coming from behind and wearing down Tranquility Lake to gain revenge by a half-length.

Although Virginie was bred in Brazil, her pedigree has some very familiar strains close up. Her sire Legal Case (Alleged--Maryinsky, by Northern Dancer) raced in Europe winning the G1 Dubai Champion S. at three and the G1 Premio Roma at four. The dam is by the Brazilian horse Baronius, but her dam Fashion Dancer (Dancer's Image--Fashion Plate, by Cohoes) is by a disqualified Kentucky Derby winner out of a half sister to the Matron S. victress Swiss Cheese. The fifth dam Athenia was a talented three-quarters sister to Menow and is also the granddam of Sir Ivor.

The key to Virginie's pedigree may lie with some distinctive inbreeding in the pedigree of Maryinsky. She is by Northern Dancer (Nearctic--Natalma, by Native Dancer), and her granddam \*Rich Relation (\*Midas II--Sybil's Sister {GB}, by Nearco {Ity}) is a three-quarters sister to Nearctic (Nearco--Lady Angela, by Hyperion) and also has a very similar pedigree to that of the tremendous tap-root mare Nangela. Nearctic represents the cross of Nearco (by Pharos) over Hyperion (by Gainsborough) and Rich Relation the reverse. Virginie's broodmare sire Baronius is by Falkland (GB) (Right Royal {Fr}--Argentina {GB}, by Nearco). This smart stayer was a grandson of Owen Tudor (Hyperion {GB}--Mary Tudor {Fr}, by Pharos {GB}) and his dam Argentina was by Nearco (by Pharos) out of a mare by Gainsborough. So Falkland's own closest inbreeding, to Gainsborough and Pharos--who both appear together--reinforces the close inbreeding in the dam of Virginie's sire, Legal Case. This recalls Olin Gentry's old adage "return to the sire the best blood of his dam" a formula which has certainly worked well here.

#### PEDIGREE SHORTS:

We mentioned Nangela as being related to the duplicated ancestors in the pedigree of Virginie. She also turned up in her own right in the tail-female line of Morning Pride (Ire) (f, 2, Machiavellian--Wilayif, by Danzig), who looked like a filly with a future when taking the G3 Prix du Bois by three lengths. Wilayif actually has Nearctic 3x4 (once through Nangela) with Nearctic's relative Great Niece in the fifth generation. Morning Pride herself is 4x4 to Natalma and is yet another stakes winner by Machiavellian out of a Northern Dancer-line mare.

Inbreeding and linebreeding to genetic relatives from the Boudoir II family seems to have considerable ability to upgrade. The latest example is Lambana (m, 5, Image of Greatness--Flowing Melody, by Eternal Prince), winner of the Rockingham Park Breeders' Cup H. Image of Greatness's second dam is by Your Host, a three-quarters brother to Flower Bowl. On the distaff side Lambana has Your Host's sister full sister Your Hostess via Majestic Prince. Image of Greatness has sired only two other unrestricted stakes winners, of which one also has Your Hostess and the other has a reverse cross of Alibhai and Mahmoud, sire and broodmare sire of Your Hostess.
